 Well...that can be said of the weather lately, too. From cool to hot, wet to dry, the weather has had "many ways" during the past month. Fall is definitely in the air, with

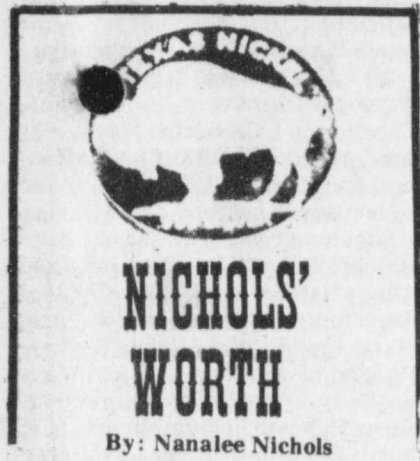
leaves on some trees beginning to take on an autumn tint, and others beginning to fall.

I told them about running out of gas a few miles out of town and just standing there, waiting for someone I knew to come by and give me a ride. It took about five minutes before someone did.

They looked at me with the most wistful, puzzled expression.  
 We went on to talking about how everyone knew everyone, about the food and comfort in troubled times, about the fellowship of small sized football games or sporting events, about how everyone helps at fires.  
 Trick or treat, even in Paris, has become enough of a problem that kids have to have each piece of candy checked out!

Sharing fresh tomatoes, left over pie, things that we all consider a normal part of life is an extra special consideration to them.  
 When I offered to keep one woman's youngsters for a weekend, she was absolutely amazed...she knows no one well enough after a year in a larger town to leave them with!

Working among people who don't know their next door neighbor, much less everyone in town, has made me realize once again that the benefits of friendship and fellowship in a small town by far outweigh the drawbacks.  
 Living in the middle of so many people, those people are so much more lonely than we are living out in the country!

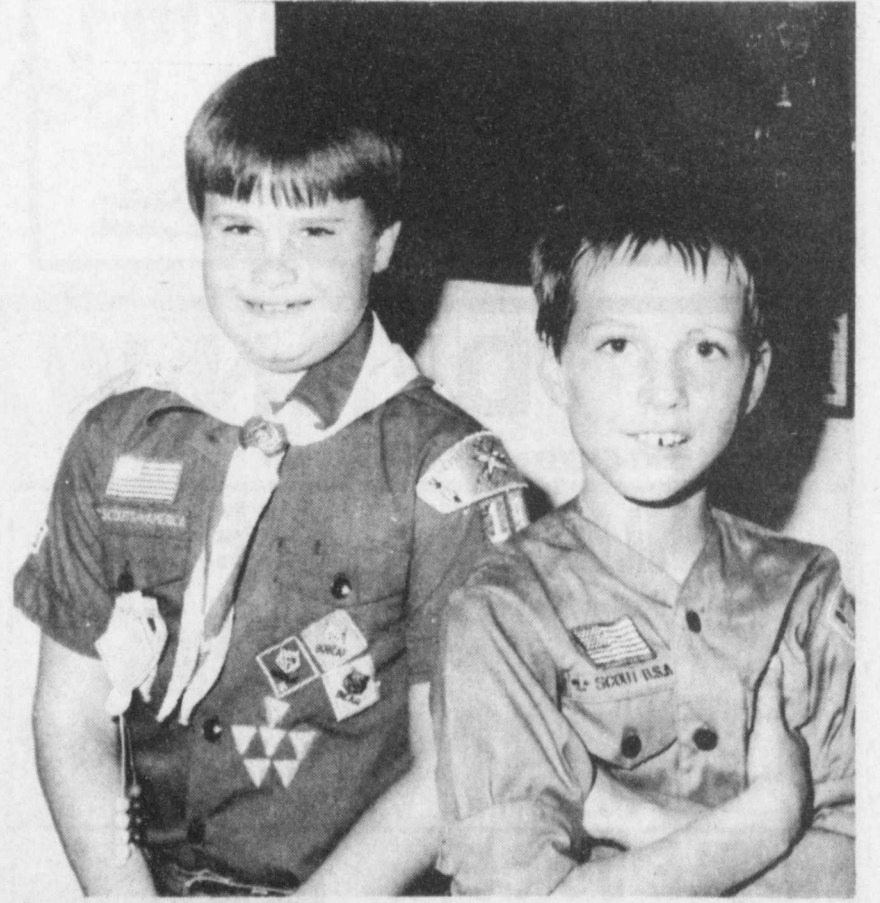

## Foxes Defeat Patriots 20-6

 The Prairiland Patriots came home empty again last Friday night after the Caddo Mills Foxes outscored them 20 to six at Caddo Mills.  
 The Patriots took the opening kick from inside their own thirty yard line. Mike Ray, No. 41, on a short return, gave the Patriots first and ten on their own 41-yard line. From there, Steven Johnston and Craig Ladd carried the ball for one first down before the Foxes took the first Patriot punt. Martin Babb booted the pig deep in Fox territory and the Patriots killed the play on the Foxes' nine yard line.  
 Things didn't look too bad at that point, but Caddo Mills proved to have two running backs who appeared unstoppable. Two pass plays and run, run and run some more. The Foxes broke the Patriot barrier for their first six points.  
 The point after was good and the

Patriots trailed seven to zip with only four minutes and seventeen seconds in play in the first quarter.  
 The Patriots finished the first half without giving up any more points, but were unable to muster anything for themselves, either.  
 The Patriots came out in the third quarter eager to set things straight. With a third and nine yards for a first and ten from the Patriot 43-yard line, Craig Ladd found Cary Borden wide open in Fox territory, tossed the bomb and the Patriots trailed by only one point.  The Patriots came right back. Steven Johnston on the punt return set the offense up with a first and ten on their own 35-yard line. Unfortunately, though, on a fluke play, the Foxes intercepted the ball on the Patriot 45-yard line.  
 The very next play Caddo Mills raced all the way for their final TD.  
 The Patriot offense put together another good drive but another interception turned them back once more. The Patriot defense closed the doors though, and the Foxes tried to tack on more points to no avail.

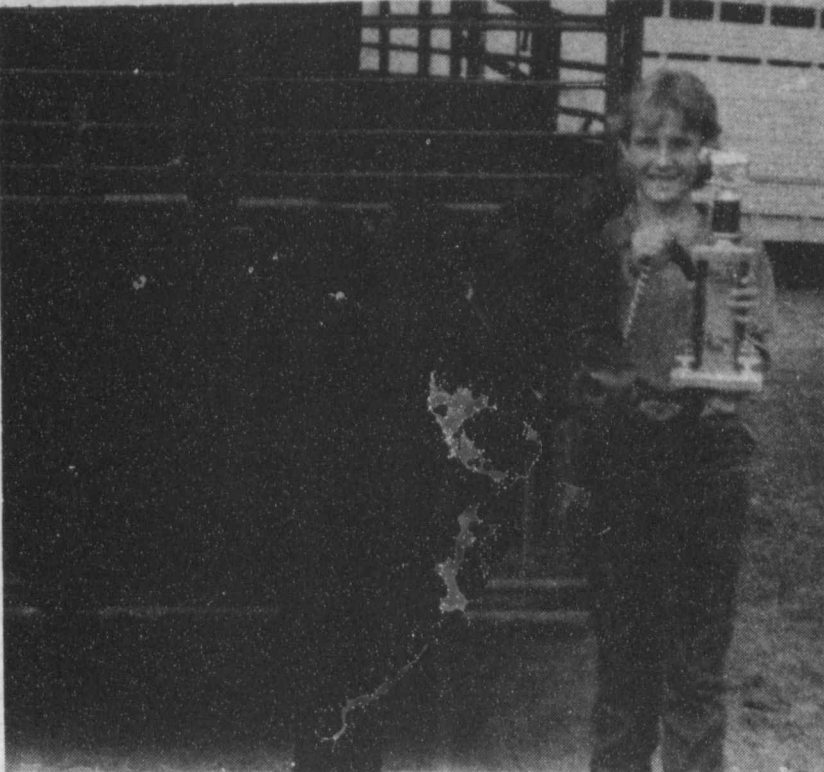

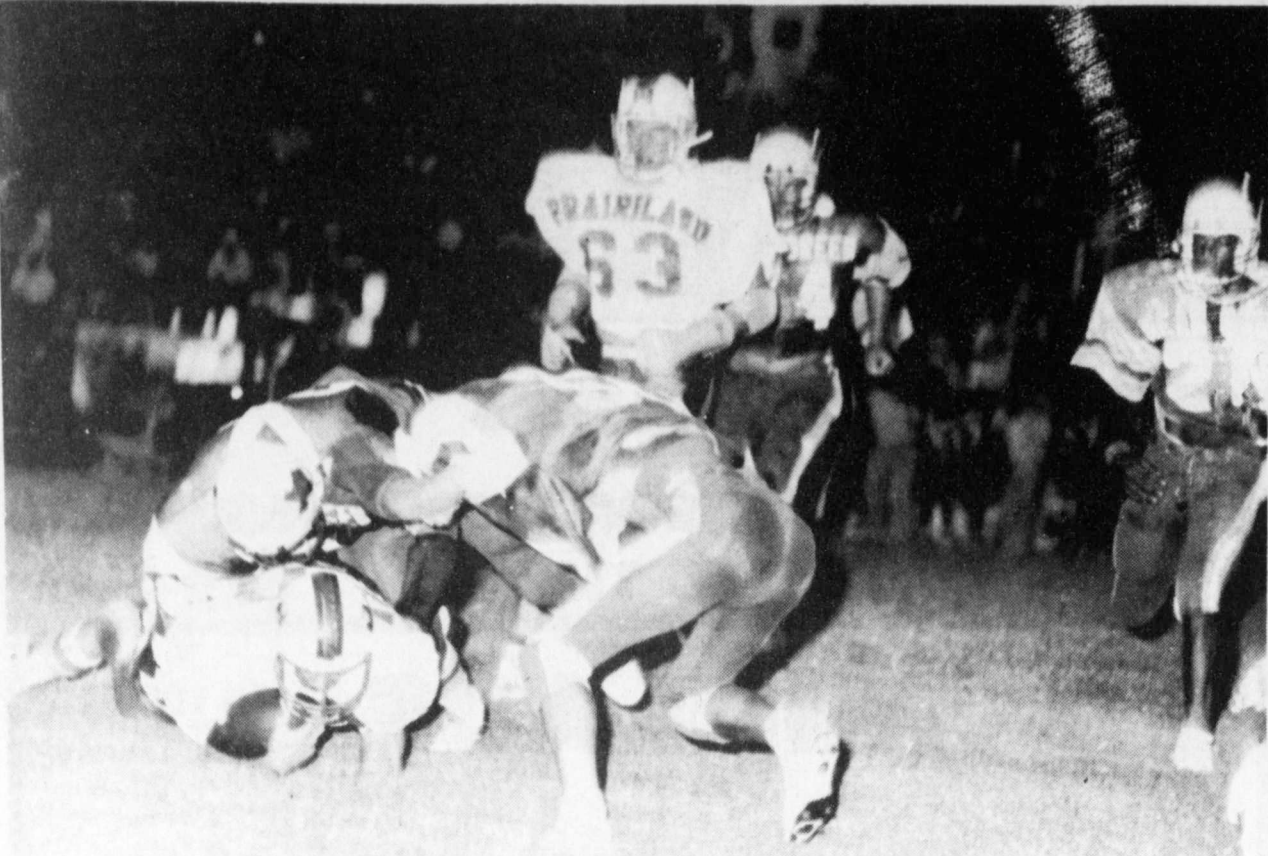
