Rains have been scattered and often heavy...Blossom and Detroit Talco and Deport failed to have.



Later, the staff was telling me how wonderful it was to take time to do that, how considerate. I looked at them and realized they really thought

it was special! I tried to explain to them that in any of our small towns anyone, stranger or long time friend, would be afforded help. I told them about running out of gas a few miles out of town and just standing there, waiting for someone I knew to come by and give me a ride It took about five minutes before someone did.

They looked at me with the most

wistful, puzzled expression. We went on to talking about how everyone knew everyone, abou the food and comfort in troubled times, about the fellowship of small sized football games or sporting events,

about how everyone helps at fires. Trick or treat, even in Paris, has become enough of a problem that kids have to have each piece of candy checked out!

Sharing fresh tomatoes, left over pie, things that we all consider a normal part of life is an extra special consideration to them.

When I offered to keep one woman's youngsters for a weekend, she was absolutely amazed...she knows no one well enough after a year in a larger town to leave them with!

Working among people who don't know their next door neighbor, much less everyone in town, has made me realize once again that the benefits of friendship and fellowship in a small town by far outweigh the drawbacks.

h the middle of so many people, mose people are so much more lonely than we are living out in the country!
