George Bush Wins Presidency

The Bush-Quayle ticket won the national presidential election in what has been described as "a rout" Tuesday, taking 353 electoral votes to Dukakis' 107, and 54.2 of the popular vote.

On a local level, voters were not so overwhelmingly in favor of the Republican candidate, with most rural boxes going to Dukakis or being almost even.

Congressman Jim Chapman won his bid for re-election easily. State representative L.P. (Pete) Patterson also found himself returned to office with no problem.

At press time the vote count was not total, but Richard Anderson was trailing behind his challenger, Republican Bill Ratliff.

In Lamar County there was a total of 15,787 votes cast.

In Deport unofficial figures were: Bush-Quayle 113-Dukakis Bentsen 185. Bo Bolter 76-Lloyd Bentsen 234. Horace McQueen 74-Jim Chapman 226. Bill Ratliff 91, Richardson 199. Jess Nickerson 50, Pete Patterson 243.

The Pct 1 Commissioners race saw

Troy Owens garnering 203 over James Anderson's 83. This reflected the vote throughout Pct. 1 as Troy Owens won the election.

In the South Blossom Box Bush took 136 to Dukakis' 133 votes. Bo Bolter 76-Bentsen 191. McQueen 82, Chapman 187. Ratliff 122, Anderson 145. Nickerson 91, Patterson 175. James Anderson 79, Troy Owens 180.

The North Blossom totals were: Bush 194, Dukakis 89. Bolter 86, Bentsen 183; McQueen 110, Chapman 161; Ratliff 146, Anderson 106, Nickerson 94, Patterson 169.

Pattonville results: Bush 178-Dukakis 121; Bolter 88, Bentsen 202; McQueen 107, Chapman 190; Ratliff 150, Anderson 148; Nickerson 97, Patterson 198; Anderson 73, Owens 219.

Cunningham results: Bush 53, Dukakis 58; Bolter 16, Bentsen 86; McQueen 34, Chapman 77; Ratliff 34, Anderson 74; Nickerson 22, Patterson 84; James Anderson 32, Troy Owens 75.

men and women-to the advancement of the cause of an honorable world peace; now, THEREFORE, I Charles Foster, Mayor of the City of Deport, do hereby call upon all citizens to observe Friday, November 11, 1988, as VETERANS DAY, and ask that the day be observed with appropriate ceremonies in honor of those who have served to preserve the principles of Justice, Freedom and Democracy. IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the official seal of the City of Deport, this 11th day of November, 1988.

Patriots Down Bulldogs, 20-15

A crisp Friday night football game laced with desire, determination and flowing adrenalin left the Prairiland coaching staff a bundle of nerves as the Patriots put down the Quitman Bulldogs 20-15 in their 1988 season grand finale at Quitman.

The first half of the game belonged to the Bulldogs, right from the opening kickoff. It took just 1:15 to drive 52-yards for the home team. The two point conversion was just as easy and the Patriots trailed by eight points.

In the middle of the second quarter, Ricky Else charged across the Patriot goal line for the Bulldogs' second touchdown. Darren Dobbs booted the extra point and left the Patriots down, 15-0.

The confident Bulldogs had to learn about Patriot spirit and determination. With just over four minutes left in the half, the Patriots put together an impressive drive on their own. Martin Babb set the Patriots up on their own 38-yard line, first and ten, with a big kickoff return. P.G. Morrison picked up a first down. A pass from Martin Babb to Jack Kindle drew a flag on the Bulldogs for pass interference, and another first down.

Junior High Closes Season

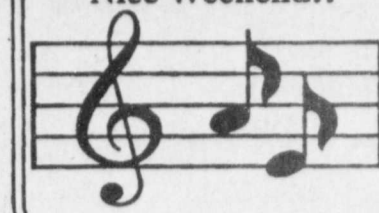
The Prairiland Patriot Junior High suffered a crushing 44-6 defeat at the hands of the Quitman Bulldogs.

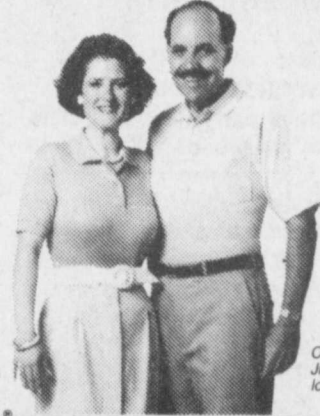
