Walking For Fitness...Not A Fad!

Physical fitness, healthy eating, overall well-being...the phrases are in front of us all, from infants to the aged. And although no one exercise or diet is perfect for everyone one thing comes close...walking!

This is an age of physical fitness fetishes. The quest for muscle tone and youthfulness has become a multi-million dollar industry. Video tapes prescribing exercise programs for the elderly, for babies (no, it's not a joke) and for expectant mothers as well as run-of-the-mill exercise programs abound.

Almost everyone has invested in a stationary bicycle, a weight set, jogging outfit or some other item to help them become slimmer, trimmer and healthier.

But being an impatient species, most people ignore the dire warnings and overdo, leading to pain, soreness and even permanent injury as a result of overzealous attempts to get fit fast.

But walking requires almost no investment, no video tapes and no special equipment.

From a toddler to great-grandmother, walking is near-perfect.

While jogging places stress on joints, weight lifting certainly isn't for everyone, and exercise clubs are expensive, walking is available to just about everyone who can put one foot in front of the other.

Walking helps release a chemical in the brain that serves as a natural tranquilizer, serving to create a feeling of well-being.

Walking serves to lower blood pressure and heart rate, and builds muscles.

Where to walk? Well, options vary according to the environment. In the city there are usually walking tracks available, or walking and running paths in parks. In the coun-

try any farm to market road will do, as long as an eye is turned to watch for traffic.

Even small towns boast places to walk, constructing simple gravel

Like any exercise, walking should be worked into. Short walks that gradually lengthen are much better than beginning with a 5 mile hike that results in sore leg muscles. But even if soreness results, it's rare to ever do any damage, which makes it superior to jogging or running.

Naturally, walking doesn't burn up the enormous amount of calories that running does. But as an overall health promoter, it simply can't be beat!

Not enough exercise? Just work walking into the regular program. It keeps muscles limber and can contribute significantly to an overall healthy program.

Aside from comfortable walking shoes, no equipment is required for the pedestrian mode of physical fitness. Comfortable "sweats" are available though, as well as a range of specialized shoes ranging from \$15 to \$200!

Weather really needn't keep a dedicated walker in. Rain gear and warm clothing takes care of inclement conditions. In summer there is little danger of becoming too hot, a major advantage over other forms of exercise.

Walking is custom tailored. Want a leisurely relaxing time? Walk slowly, taking time to look around at the world.

Want to work up a sweat? Set out at a brisk pace and keep it up.

All in all this a period of physical fitness mania. But long after the exercise machines have become covered with dust, long after the health foods have become unpalatable, the habit of taking a walk for mental and physical well being will remain. It's a habit that can last a life time...and extend that lifetime too!

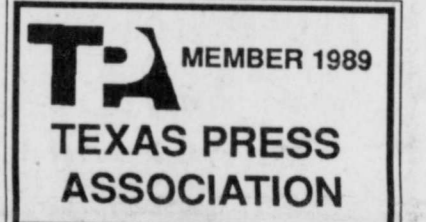
Commissioners Scrap Jail Renovation, Put Bond Issue On Ballot

Lamar County Commissioners Court has scrapped a jail renovation plan, and in a special Tuesday session taken action that will put a 3.5 million dollar bond election to build a new jail before the people on the April 1, 1989 ballot.

After months of controversy the commissioners, in regular session on Monday, voted 3-2 against the jail renovation plan. According to Pct. 1 Commissioner Troy Owens, the renovation would only have provided for 7 minimum detention cells above current jail capacity. Commissioners Owens, Glen Stephens, and Judge Robert Burns voted in favor of dropping the renovation plan while Vic Easterwood and Ronald Dockray voted against it.

The special session on Tuesday was necessary to put the bond issue on the April 1 ballot, February 28 being the deadline.

Also appearing on the ballot will be a proposal to go to the "unit system" for county road and bridge repair. This resulted from a petition that was presented to the court on Monday. The petition contained over 1000 validated signatures. Also on the ballot will be a proposal for a half cent sales tax for Lamar County.

Patterson Co-Authors Bill

The bill has gained close to 60 co-authors including Speaker of the House Gib Lewis. House Bill 1, authored by State Representative Richard Smith, R-Bryan, is the final product of 18 months of public testimony, research and investigation by the Joint Select Committee on Workers' Compensa-

tion Insurance. "The passage of House Bill 1 is vital for Texas businesses and their employees," said Rep. Patterson. "We must make Texas more attractive to prospective businesses wishing to relocate to Texas and allow existing businesses to be more competitive with businesses in other states. In addition, we must guarantee that Texas' injured employees are adequately compensated."

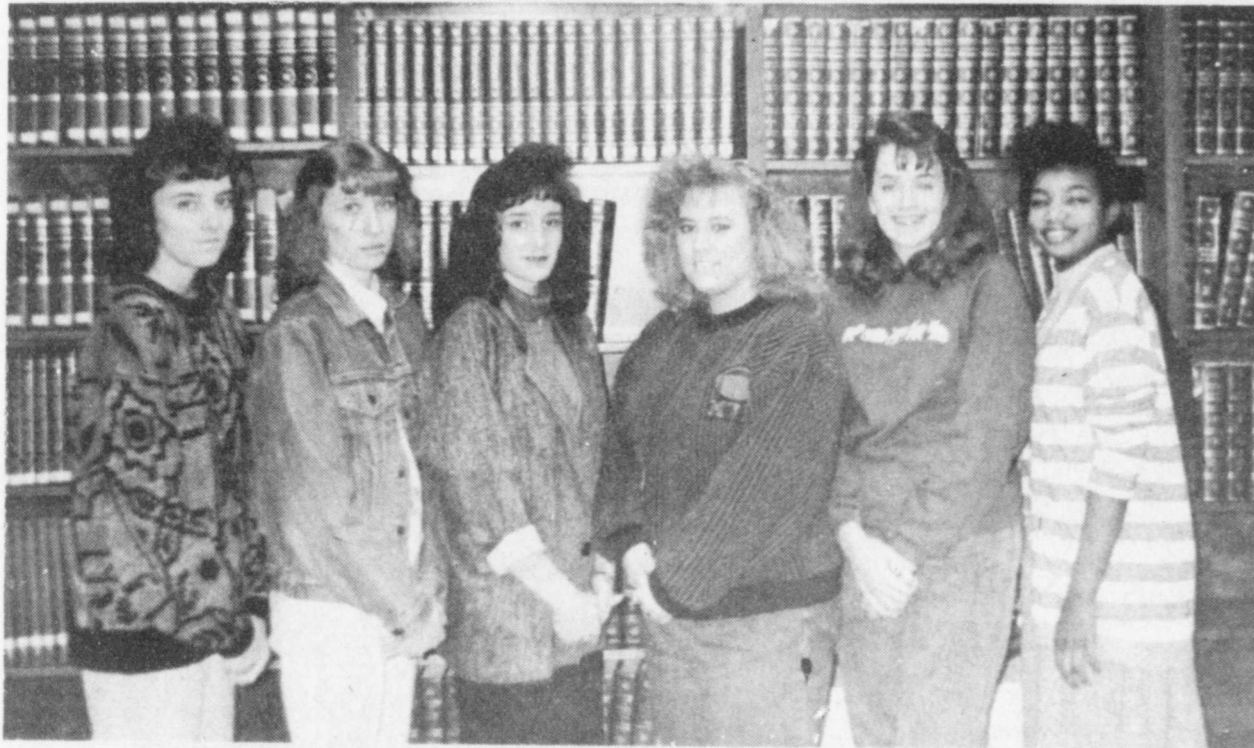

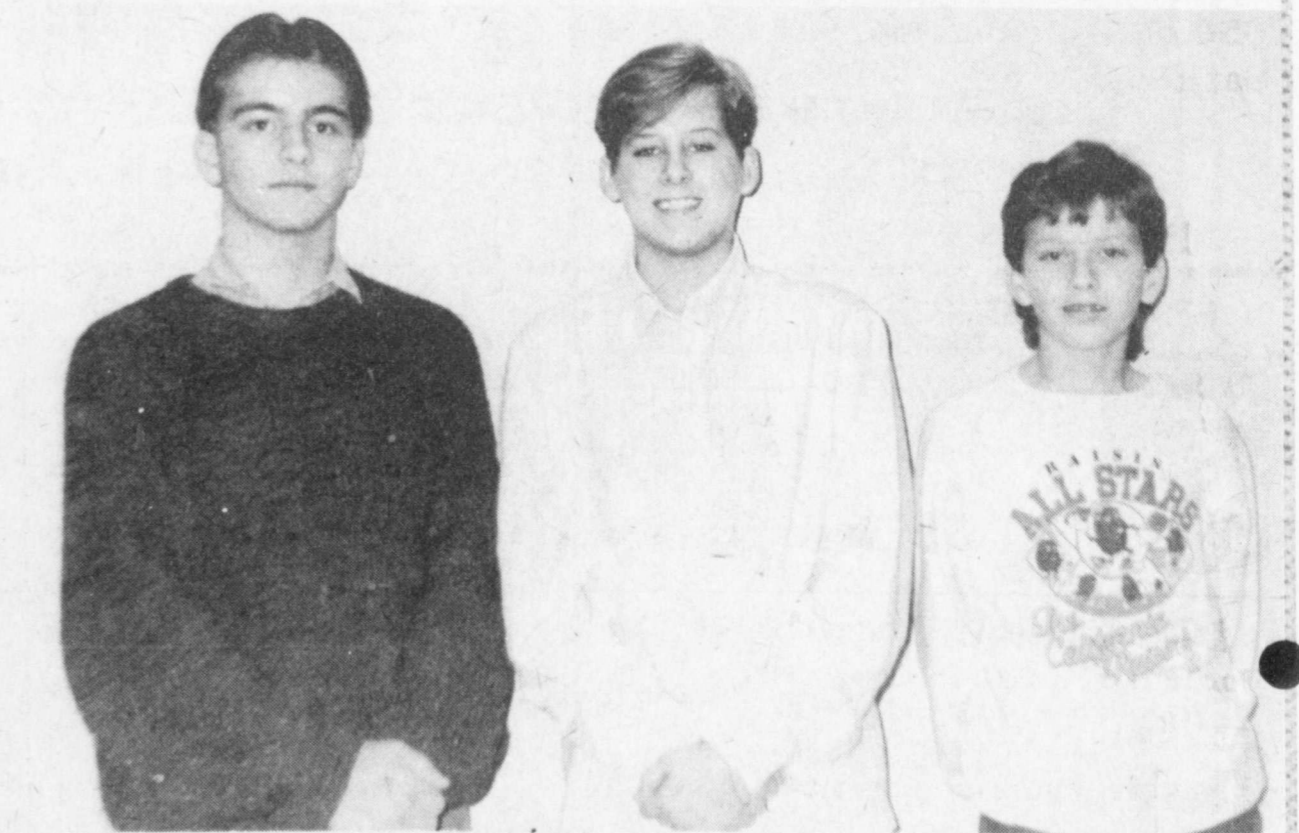

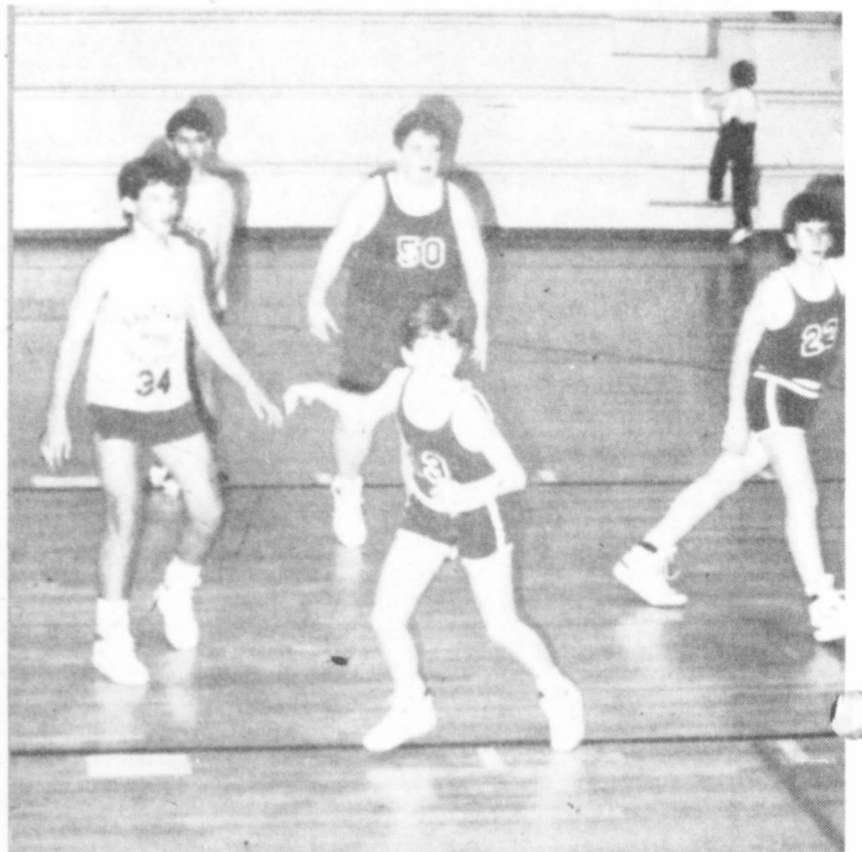
