
Antique wagons and farm implements will be displayed on the lawn in front of the administration building with covered wagon rides available.



Getting A New Perspective On Old Places..Or "How I Spent My Summer Vacation" They have no running water, al-

Our vacation acounts have become an annual thing in the papers, although I still haven't figured out why. Some people aren't interested, I'm sure, but a lot of people have asked for it, so here goes!

The state of our pocketbook decreed that no exotic places would be on the agenda this year for our yearly,10 day holiday. What to do when Iceland is out, when New Zealand is zapped? Well, we decided to revisit an old favorite place, but take a look at it from a different perspective.

We headed out for Colorado, a state we have paid visits to six or seven times previously, but this time, instead of merely taking a few hiking trails, driving around through the roads and staying in motels we decided to start at the bottom (literally) and work upward (literally)

During the course of our visit we went whitewater rafting, ascended in a hot air balloon, and took one of the most harrowing full-day jeep trips imaginable. We also met a number of interesting people and one very nice dog

With the car packed (what a luxury, no flight schedules to meet and anything we could cram in the trunk we could take) we headed out through the west Texas countryside. I confess, I don't care for that portion of our state, no trees, no rivers. We spent the night with relatives in Amarillo and headed out for worse country...the barren desert-like area of New Mexico. Finally though we made it into the pleasant mountains around Taos.

At Taos we wandered around the historic old plaza, looing at some really lovely art work, but not even considering buying... Taos prices are just too high.

We explored the ancient Taos Pueblo, the oldest continutally inhabitated dwellings in the Northern Americas. About two hundred Tiwa Indians live within the adobe structures, which are four to five stories high.

though there is a lovely, clear stream chuckling through the center of the village. They have no electricity, although it is available, they just don't want it. The pueblos are virtually unchanged from 900 years ago when they were built. They do, however, have doors now. In the old days, they had holes in the roof. That way, when enemies approached, they just climbed up their ladders, skinnied down into the homes, and pulled the ladders in after them! A beautiful Indian girl took us around, telling us the history of the structures, pointing out the curious mixture of Catholic religion (brought by the Spanish) and traditional Indian beliefs that they have.

We admired the beautiful beadwork, stone carving, wood carving and pottery the people had for sale, and enjoyed the scent of hot fry bread cooking in oil. The cultural achievements and skills of these so-called "primitive" people were impressive.

Then we proceeded to load up and head on towards the tiny town of Natrop, Colorado.

At Natrop that evening we were intrigued with the Mt. Princeton Hot Springs. Two huge pools contain the hot mineral waters, which don't even smell bad the way most mineral waters do.

If man made pools weren't appealing, there was always the river itself. There folks would build little rock ponds channelling icy cold water into the hot spring water until they managed to regulate the temperature to suit their personal taste. Then they would stretch out, relaxing under the influence to warm water and muscle soothing minerals.

We stashed our bags with a Texasborn hotel managerat the hotel, then went to check in for our raft trip at Four Corner's Expeditions, just down the road. That was where the real fun began

We had scheduled a two day trip down the Arkansas River right through the Royal Gorge.

The first hint that everything was really going to be a blast was when this 5 foot high bright red headed little gal came bouncing up, hair escaping from a baseball cap and in one long breath exclaimed "Hi, I'm Esther..we're going on the raft trip with you, I know I look about 14, but I'm a senior in high school and we're going to have fun!" She was right, we did.!

Our guide, Mike Brady, turned out to be a personable young man attending Colorado State and working his third summer on the river. His contributions to the fun proved considerable too.

Esther's parents, Dr. and Mrs. John Wright (John and Gynell) proved to be assets also. John teaches English at a Christian College in Illinois. After raising four daughters, Gynell has recently gone back to college and is going to teach high school Spanish this fall.

Never having rafted before, they were excited and a little apprehensive too. On the Brown's Canyon portion of our trip wet suits aren't needed, and we simply stripped down to the bare essentials. No, we didn't skinny dip, but jewelry, makeup, excess clothing, billfolds and baggage just don't have a place on the river. That is one of the fabulous things about rafting, the world narrows down to the water and it's channel and you...nothing else. Anyone who could talk business or fail to appreciate the simplicity of it would have to be one devoted workaholic!

A short bus ride, a simple explanation by Mike "look folks, the river's down there and we're up here, who's gonna help tote the boat" and we vere in the water. Of course, poor "Mom" (Gynell swiftly came to be called Mom) was a little paler after hearing the safety talk of "wraps " "flips" "swims" and waves.

But we were on the water, drifting along happily, and learning about one another quickly. For now, that's all the room I have to recite, so, to those who are interested, tune in for the REAL excitement next week..there's waves coming up!



The ninth signup that ended last Friday for the Conservation Reserve Program netted 40 more offers for the 10-year land retirement program in Lamar County. Landowner bids were transmitted by computer on MOnday night for acceptance or revision. Within two weeks we should know which contracts are eligible for approval. This phase of the contract approval relates primarily to the price the contract was bid into the program. If it is too high, it will be rejected. In previous signups, a \$40.00 maximum was the most USDA would pay in annual rental payments under the CRP in northeast Texas.

There is a direct relation between the health of animals slaughtered for food, food quality in general, consumers and USDA inspection. We all want good, clean, wholesome food. USDA inspectors at virtually every step of the food processing chain serve a vital link in assuring that the food we buy in our local meat markets and grocery stores is everything it should be.

Slaughter statistics provided by USDA's Federal State Inspection Service for May 1989 indicate that meat quality is overall very good. Out of thetotal 536 million animals slaughtered for food in May, only 1.04% were rejected for some reason. A look at the statistics in each meat category indicated the worst

offenders were usually older animals that were being culled. The slaughter classes showing the highest number of animals had, on the average, a significantly lower incidence of car-

cass condemnation. In the red meat category which includes beef, veal, pork, lamb and mutton,a total of 10,184,101 animals were slaughtered in May. Of thi snumber, 23,951 or 0.24% were condemned due to disease. Number wise, barrows and gilts led with total kill of 6.3 million head but only 0.12% condemnation. Steers and heifers kill totaled 2.26 million head and 2,569 carcasses being condemned. The worst offenders requiring condemnation by USDA inspectors were mature sheep, 5.4%; Bob veal, 1.97% and aged cows, 1.61%.

In the poultry category, a total of 526,621,202 fowl were slaughtered with a total condemnation percentage of 1.06%, or 5,573,254 total condemned carcasses. The worst offenders as far as quality which required condemnation included light fowl, 4.14%; old and young breeder turkeys, 3.7%; heavy fowl, 3.3%; guineas, squabs and pigeons, 1.34%; and ducks, 1.21%. Young chickens, which make up 93% of the total poultry kill, or 486 million birds, required only 0.97% rejection. The second highest slaughter rate for poultry was young turkeys at 21.4 million. Their rejection rate was 0.87%.



Horse Fly Population Explodes

Livestock in the area will long remember Sunday, July 16 as the day the horse fly population exploded. Prior to Sunday, there was an occasional horse fly, but such was not the case Sunday afternoon as there was a heavy hatch Saturday night and Sunday morning.

There are a couple of concerns for livestock producers with a hose fly problem. Number one is that there are no insecticides that will control the fly. None of the sprays or ear tags will phase the pest. The only sure control measure is a couple of brickbats.

The other concern is that the horse fly is thought to be the chief carrier of Fly Fever or anaplasmosis. It would not be too surprising to see a dramatic outlook of the disease in unprotected herds in about 10 days to two weeks.

Fly Fever is a blood disease that can be spread by blood sucking insects from carrier animals to other members of the herd. Since the disease has been in cattle herds in the area for at least 25 years, most herds have infected cattle. The disease is transmitted from the carrier animal to the rest of the herd by the horse fly. The Fly Fever causing organism can only survive for a short time, second soutside the animal; therefore, the

carrier animal will have to be very close for infection to occur. Cattle from two herds sharing a shade tree on a property line would be a logical way for the disease to spread.

There are two ways of protecting the herd from the disease. The most common method is feeding a Fly Fever supplement or anaplaz block. The other is vaccination of the herd. There are some producers that vaccinate their herds annually for the disease. Most of these herds are dairies since the tetracycline cannot be fed free choice to lactating milk cows. The vaccine cannot be given to pregnant cows.

If you are only now providing the supplement, you will want to check the herd daily for suspects. Cows lagging behind the herd should be watched closely. Animals with Fly Fever will be anemic. Udders, vulva and mouths and area around eyes will be yellowish. These animals should not be excited. Check with your veterinarian for treatment suggestions should you have a cow.

There may not be a single case of Fly Fever in the county this year, but it is a pretty safe bet that there will be many cases unless precaution measures are taken.
