

We would like to add a note to Louise Osburn's column of last week. Our son, Morris Latham Foster, was the last baby delivered by Dr. Grant, who suffered a heart attack a short while before Morris was to be born.

He had told me though, with a pat on the shoulder, "Billie, if I'm not here when the time comes, I'll be somewhere about!" He was. On October 19, 1951, Dorothy Grant, Dr. Grant's daughter-in-law, brought him to the hospital when I went into labor. They along with the adults supervising, enjoyed a day of swimming, picnicing, and a lot of good fellow-


After leaving Turner Falls Park they spent the night in Ardmore where they enjoyed more swimming and a surprise birthday party for Amy Strickland.
