Wrote This On Monday Morning...and someone out there evidently heard...winter's here!

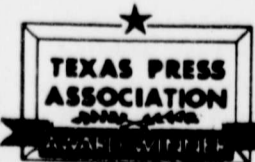
Tuesday 42 Club Meets

Country Cooking

"Country Cooking" comes from Mutt and Odell Harvey. Odell is sharing with us some of her favorite recipes she has accumulated and used during a lifetime of cooking. And for the next two weeks, the recipes she has shared with us will be listed in the Country Cooking column.

Mutt and Odell have been married for 57 years. They have two children, a daughter, Sue, and her husband, Buddy; a son, Charles and his wife, Scarlett, five grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. They have lived around the Pattonville and Milton area most of their lives. As a matter of fact, Mutt still lives on the same spot of ground where he was born 77 years ago.

Both Mutt and Odell are active members of the First United Methodist Church of Deport.

Odell's biggest hobby is cooking. She loves to collect and try new recipes. Her grandchildren are always asking her if a dish is new and most of the time they enjoy the new recipes. Odell says that turkey and dressing, cranberry sauce, green beans, candied yams, cole slaw, pecan pie, hot

rolls and their traditional Big Ben cake makes up their old fashioned traditional Christmas menu. These are the basics, however, and anyone could add any other dishes to complete the meal.

The Big Ben Cake has been served at her family Christmas dinners for as long as she can remember, she knows it has been handed down for at least 75 years.

She insists on cooking the entire Christmas dinner and all her family has to do is come and eat. She does most of the cooking in her house and the only thing Mutt cooks is toast and he makes the coffee. He's not much on cooking but he does help with the cleaning. When I arrived at their home the other night, he had just cleaned the oven, so he does do his share.

All the desserts shown are the ones Odell baked and donated to the church bazaar held a couple of weeks ago. She sent a chocolate pound loaf home with me and it was delicious.

Big Ben Cake

1 cup Crisco
2 cups sugar
3 cups sifted flour
1/2 tsp salt
3 tsp baking powder
1 T. vanilla
1 cup milk
8 egg whites

Cream crisco and sugar til fluffy, add sifted flour, salt and baking powder. Alternately with milk-vanilla, beginning and ending with flour. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Bake in four layers in a 350 degree oven.

Filling

8 eggs well beaten
1 cup sugar
1 cup milk
1/4 cup oleo
pinch of salt
1 tsp. vanilla

Boil all together til thick. Add
1 cup dates
1 cup raisins
1 cup chopped pecans
1 cup English walnuts
1 cup coconut

Put this between the layers.

White Icing

For top and sides of cake, melt 1/2 cup oleo in sauce pan. Ad 2 1/2 tbsp. flour and pinch of salt. Add 1/2 cup of milk, slowly, stirring constantly. Boil 1 minute. Remove from heat and add 3 cups of powdered sugar and 1 tsp. vanilla. Beat til creamy.

Raisin Pie

2 cups water
2 cups raisins
1/2 cup sugar
2 Tbsp. flour
1/4 cup lemon juice

Bring water to boiling, add raisins and a chopped apple and cook five minutes. Mix sugar and flour and stir in raisins. Lower heat. Cook, stirring all the time til thick and clear. Add lemon juice and nuts. Pour in unbaked crust cover with top crust. Bake at 425 degree oven for 30 minutes or until browned.

Fruit Salad

1 can fruit cocktail
1 small can chunky pineapple
1 small can mandarin oranges
1 large bottl emarashchino cherries
1 tsp. size cool whip
1 3 1/2 oz. box pistachio flavor instant pudding

Fold all together, refrigerate.

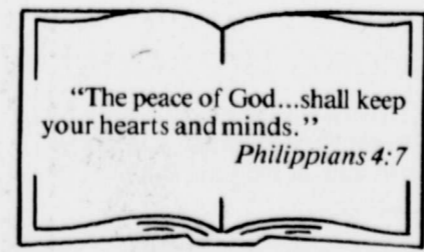

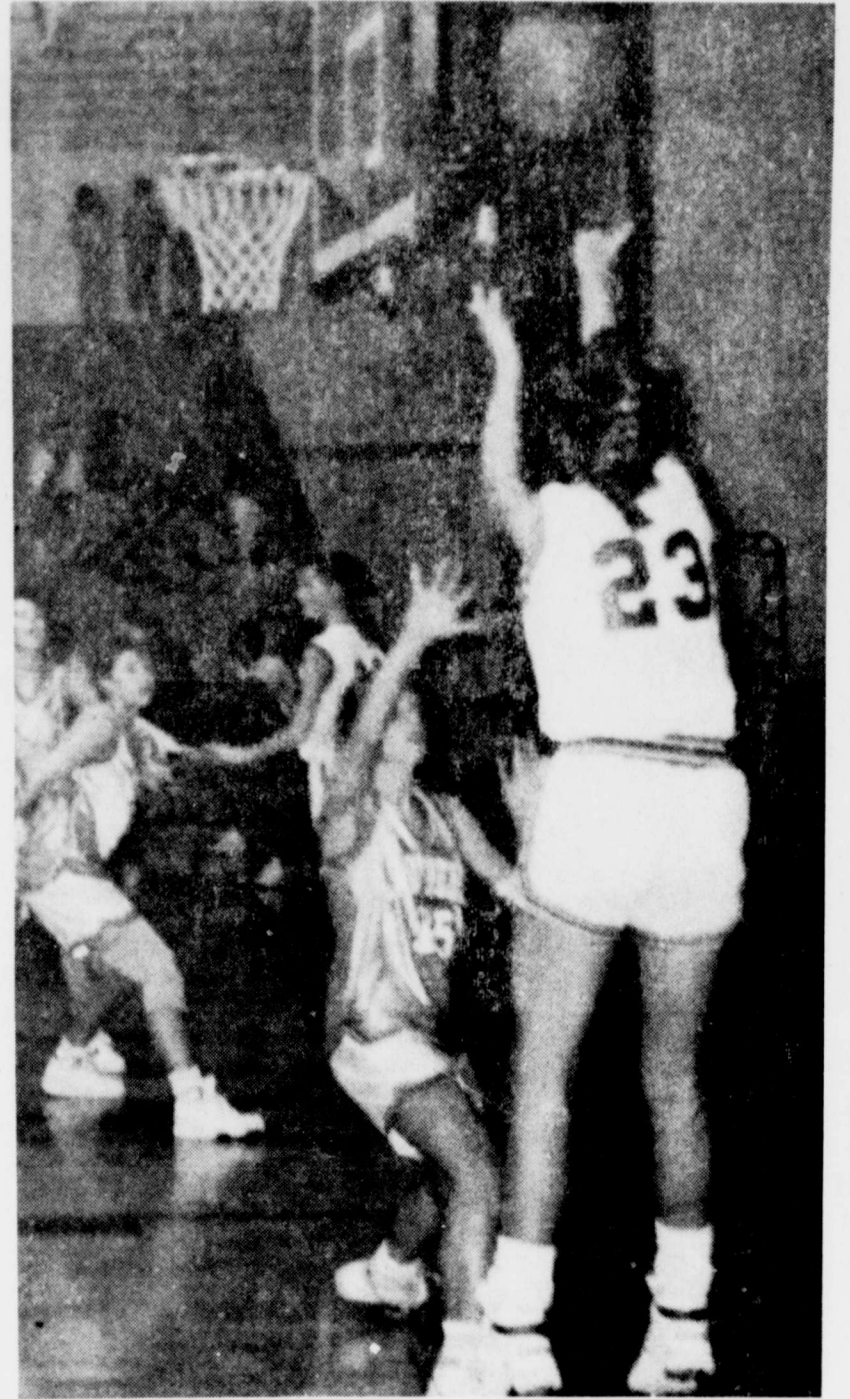

Broil for one minute, cool and serve.

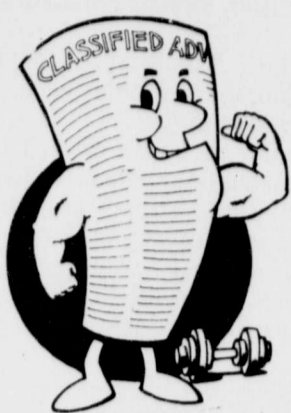
