A great line up of floats, decorated cars and entries are assembled, and

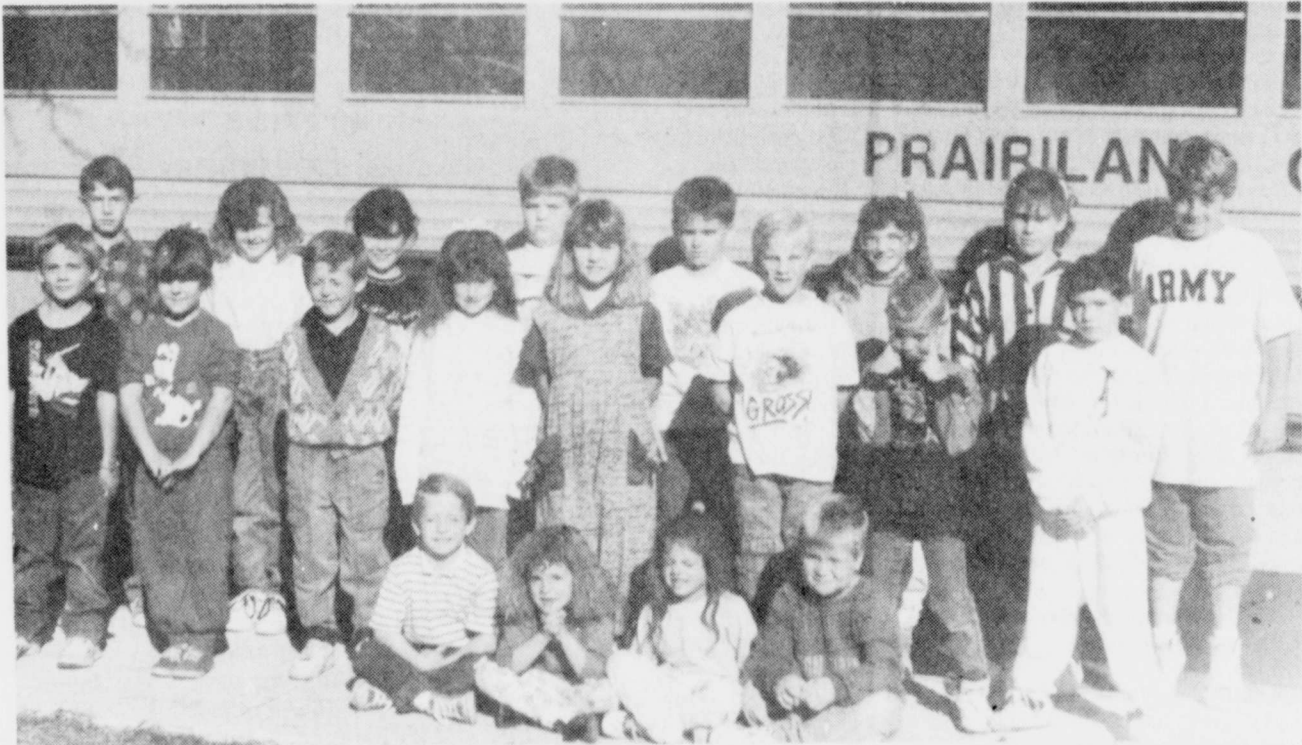
the parade, as usual, should be just the thing to get everyone into the Christmas spirit.

Policy Statement Adopted By City of Deport

The City of Deport council adopted a policy statement in their regular Monday night meeting December 10.

The policy statement provides the use of a time clock and various other changes in the operation of the city office. The vote was three to two in favor of the policy statement, with Charles Rollins, Gilbert Arriaga and Gordon Isbell in favor of, Duane Glover and Nancy Gresham against.

A. The superintendent of water and sewer of the city of Deport shall have general control of the office, the waterworks and sewer systems of the city. The superintendent shall constantly inspect all parts of all said waterworks and sewerage system and see that they are maintained in good condition for use and are being properly cared for, and that all employees of the City are attending to their respective duties.

B. The Superintendent will have authority to hire temporary employees to replace absent employees as needed to ensure that the City functions properly and with the Mayor's approval hire additional temporary employees as the need arises.

C. The Superintendent will be authorized to sign employees in and out in place of a time clock in abnormal of emergency situations.

D. The Water & Sewer Superintendent will be authorized to approve overtime in emergency situations.

Normal working hours for city employees will be from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. with one hour off for lunch.

Employees to punch in on the time clock at the beginning and ending of their day and for the lunch period.

Subject: Record of Employees hours from Time Clock:

Employees will be considered as being late if clocked in more than 5 minutes from their authorized times. Example-5 minutes late same as on time, 6 minutes late, 6 min. deducted from employee time card.

In other business it decided that if there was no cost to the city a street light on Clarksdale street could be moved. A street light on Dewey Street died for lack of a motion.

Nancy Gresham made the motion to pay the Deport Nursing Home for the overcharged water bills in the amount of \$434.68 a month. Motion was seconded by Duane Glover and carried 100%.

Motion was made and carried 100% to get a Christmas card ad in the Deport Times.

Charles Rollins made the motion to have a mail slot for bills placed on the wall by the window.

Rollins made the motion to post office hours on the window, have them painted under the City Hall sign. Motion was seconded by Gilbert Arriaga and carried 100%.

Gilbert Arriaga made the motion to have the time clock as a form of recorded keeping for employee hours. Motion was seconded by Charles Rollins, vote carried, 3 for, two against.

Charles Rollins made the motion to have all ordinances and policies to be signed and dated, seconded by Gordon Isbell, carried, 3 for, 2 against.

The Policy book and ordinance books will be put together sometime after the first of the year of 1991, it was decided.

Water Grant and Planning Grant was discussed, and information on the Certificates of Deposit were discussed.

C. The city of Deport will give compensatory time and compensation for overtime in accordance with current law.

D. All vacation times must be approved in advance by the Water and Sewer Superintendent and Mayor to ensure that the city functions properly.

A. The Mayor pro-tem will have authority to sign checks.

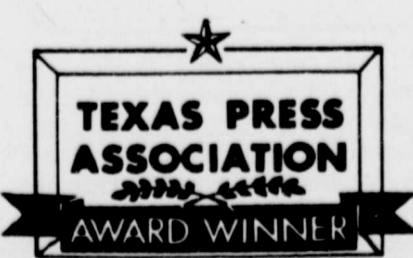

Italian Cream Cake

2 cups sugar
1/2 cup crisco
1/2 cup oleo
2 cups flour
1 tsp. soda
1 cup buttermilk
5 eggs, separated
2 cups coconut
1 cup chopped pecans
1 tsp. vanilla

Cream together sugar, crisco and oleo. Add eggs, 1 at a time, and add buttermilk soda mixture alternately with flour. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Fold in gently. Gently fold in coconut and pecans. Bake at 325. Let cool then ice layers and sides. Makes 3-9 inch layers.

Cream Cheese Icing

1 8oz. pkg. Cream Cheese
1/2 cup oleo
1 box powdered sugar
1 tsp. vanilla

Cream all ingredients together.

Strawberry Cheesecake

1/2 box vanilla wafers
1/2 cup butter, melted
1-8 oz. cream cheese softened
1 cup sugar + 5 tablespoons
2 eggs slightly beaten
1 tsp. vanilla extract
2 cups sour cream
1 box frozen sliced strawberries, thawed
2 T. cornstarch

Crush vanilla wafers; mix with butter. Press mixture into 8x10x2 baking dish. Combine cream cheese, sugar, eggs and vanilla; mix until creamy. Pour into crust. Bake in preheated 350 oven for 20 minutes or until set. Let cool. Combine sour cream and 5 tablespoons sugar; beat with electric mixer for 2 minutes. Pour over cream cheese filling. Bake in preheated 450 degree oven for 5 minutes. Let cool. Drain strawberries; reserve juice. Combine 1/2 cup sugar, cornstarch and reserved juice in saucepan; cook until thick, stirring constantly. Let cool. Stir in strawberries, spread over cheesecake. Chill until ready to serve.

Green Enchiladas

1 lb. lean ground beef
1/4 tsp. minced garlic
3/4 cup evaporated milk
1 pkg. green onion dip mix
1 sm. can chopped green chilies
1/2 lb. grated longhorn cheese

1 tsp. salt
1 cup sour cream
1 can cream of chicken soup
1/2 lb. grated American cheese
1 sm. can chopped pimentos
1 cup chopped onion
1 dozen tortillas
1/2 cup corn oil

Preheat oven to 350. Add salt and garlic to beef and brown slightly. Heat soup, milk and American cheese and sour cream in top of double boiler, until cheese melts. Add green chilies, onion dip and pimentos. Stir and remove from heat. Add longhorn cheese and onion to the meat and mix well. Soften tortillas in hot corn oil, drain thoroughly and fill each tortilla with meat mixture. Roll lightly and place in an 8x10x2 baking dish. Pour cheese over top, cover with aluminum foil and bake at 350 for 30 minutes. Makes 12 enchiladas.

Creole Gumbo

2 tsp. flour
1 cup chopped onions
1/4 cup chopped parsley
2 cloves garlic
1 No. 2 can tomatoes
1 can okra
2 lbs. shrimp (deveined)
1 cup crab meat
3 cups chicken stock
4 bay leaves
Pinch of thyme
salt and pepper to taste
1 cup cooked chicken
2 tsp. gumbo file

Brown flour in 2 tsp. fat in skillet until dark; add onion, parsley and garlic. Sauté onion mixture until tender; pour into deep kettle. Simmer tomatoes and okra together for several minutes; add to onion mixture. Add shrimp, crab meat, chicken stock, bay leaves and thyme; season with salt and pepper. Simmer gumbo for 1 hour and 30 minutes. Stir in chicken and simmer 15 minutes longer. Add gumbo file. Serve over cooked rice.

Guacamole Salad

1 head lettuce
1/2 onion
2 tomatoes
2 avocados
salt and pepper to taste
1/4 cup Picante sauce

Cut lettuce and tomatoes and onions and avocados together. Salt and pepper. Add Picante sauce right before serving and mix well.


The Lady Patriots had 32% field goal percentage while the Lady Rebels could only manage 20%. The final score was 62-56, Patriots.

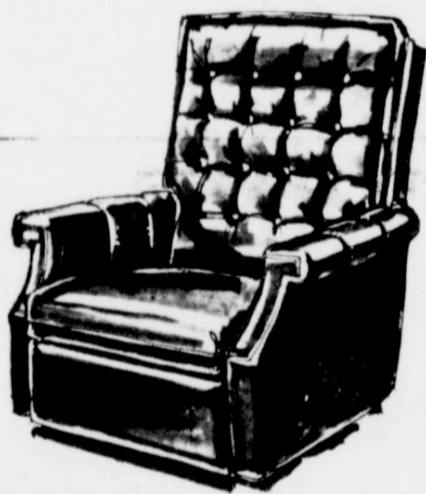

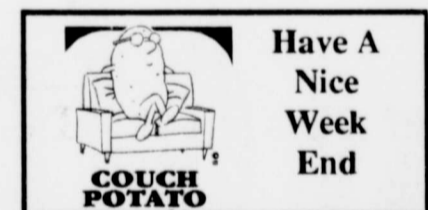

Nursing Creates New Career For Local Woman

 When Doris Elmore of Deport lost her job at Hollywood Vassarette factory in Paris, she had no immediate plans to get back in the work force.

And certainly had no plans of going to college, until she discovered that she was eligible for financial aid. So, she changed her mind and decided to pursue a nursing career, enrolling in the nursing program at Paris Junior College.

After being out of school for more than 25 years, she found out that college was tough.

"Being out so long made it difficult for me because I was older than most of the students. Learning chemistry, biology and other subjects that relate to nursing was tough," Elmore said.

In the summer of 1988 she started her college career. Part of the nursing program including doing rounds at McCuiston Regional Medical Center to learn how to treat patients and other aspects of nursing. She attended school two days a week, and made rounds at McCuiston two days each week.

"You choose your patients, but your instructors and other nurses are there to help you when you need it. The more you learn, the more you get to do," Elmore said.

"It's kind of like working yourself up a ladder. You just take it one step at a time until you reach a point where the supervisors feel you can handle

it," Elmore said.

Last spring she started working at McCuiston on weekends as a "float nurse" - a nurse who works wherever is needed and in May she graduated from PJC with an associate's degree in nursing. One week later, she started working in the intensive care unit at McCuiston as a "graduate nurse," but in August she learned that she had passed the state board test to become a registered nurse.

Elmore said a lot of the responsibilities of a graduate nurse and RN are the same, except that as a graduate nurse there is someone helping you with your duties.

"The unit charge nurse gives you more responsibilities such as taking care of more patients and doing more jobs after you become an RN," she said.

She said her job is stressful, but she knows that the other nurses and the patients depend on her.

"I had always wanted to be a nurse, and now I am helping people recover back to health. Knowing you've done something for someone is the most gratifying part of my job," Elmore said.

Elmore said the transition from a graduate nurse to an RN was easy due to the help she received from her co-workers along with the experience she had.

This is a great career for people to get into, it takes patience, but it is worth it."

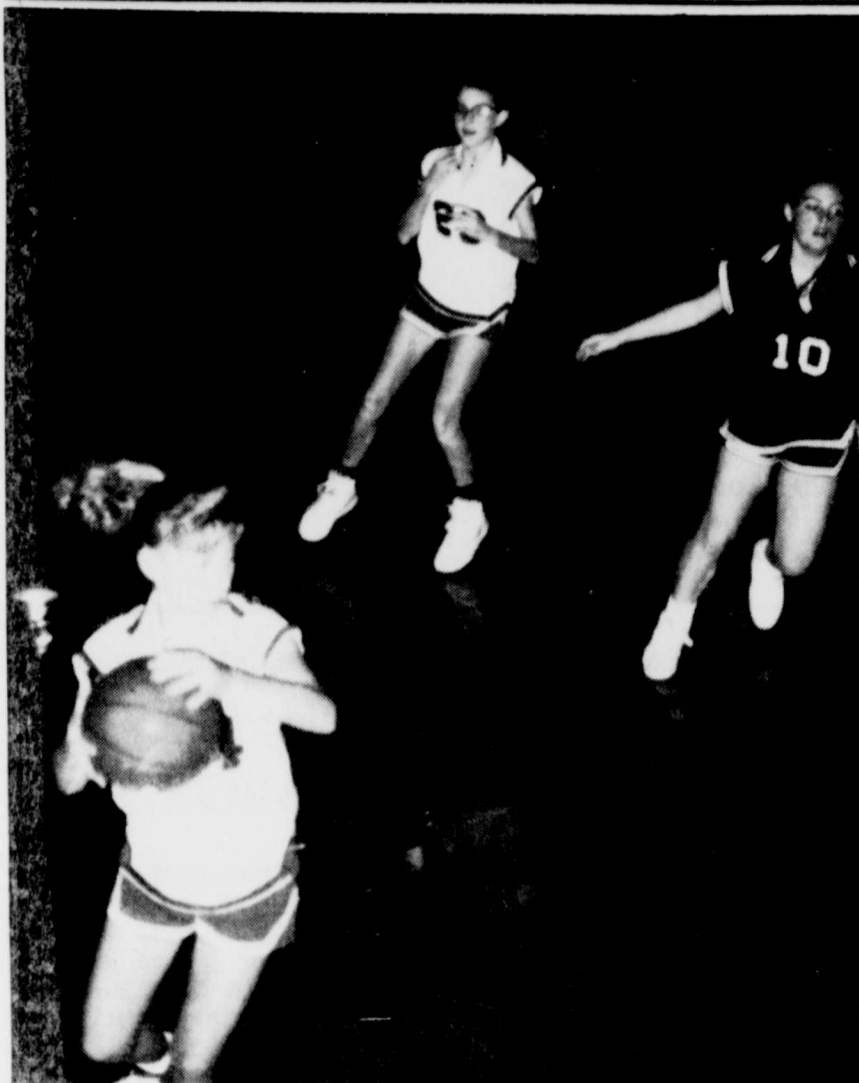
