**Hawaiian Strawberry Salad**  
2 packages 3 oz. strawberry jello  
2 8 oz. packages frozen strawberries, drained  
2 bananas mashed  
1 small (8 oz) can crushed pineapple, drained  
1 cup chopped nuts (your choice, I use pecans)  
8 oz. cool whip topping  
Dissolve jello in 2 cups boiling water. Mix well. Add 2 cups cold water. Chill in refrigerator until mixture starts to thicken. Stir in remaining ingredients and chill. After it has set, top with cool whip.

**Mouth Watering Biscuit**  
1 cup flour  
1/2 tsp soda  
1/2 tsp salt  
3 tsp Baking Powder  
Sift above ingredients together. Add 1 tbs margarine and cut into dry ingredients until pieces are the size of small peas. Add 1 cup buttermilk and beat well with spoon. Drop on well greased pan. Bake at 450 until golden brown.

**Super Delicious Scratch Cake**  
2 eggs  
2 cups sugar  
4 heaping tbs. Crisco  
1 1/2 cup buttermilk  
1 tsp. soda  
1 tsp. salt  
2 1/2 cups flour  
1 tsp vanilla  
Beat eggs with mixer until frothy, gradually add sugar, then Crisco, beat till creamy. Add buttermilk. Sift flour soda and salt into mixture. Mix until well beaten. Add vanilla, mix well. Pour

cake batter into 3-9" greased and floured pans. Bake in pre-heated 350 degree oven. Check with toothpick at 25 minutes. Ice with caramel icing or any icing of your choice.

**Caramel Icing**  
Place 1/2 cup sugar in iron skillet over low heat.  
Mix in saucpan:  
2 cups sugar  
3/4 cup milk  
1 stick butter or margarine  
1 slightly beaten egg  
Stir this mixture over low heat until butter melts. Increase heat and cook until it boils rapidly. Meanwhile, the sugar in the skillet has begun to melt. When it is a light brown, pour it into the boiling mixture in saucpan, stirring fast and constantly. Cook until the soft ball stage is reached (put a few drops of icing in a cup of cold water, when icing can be rolled into a soft ball, take off burner) or you can use thermometer. Add one teaspoon vanilla and beat. Ice cake and enjoy!

**Blueberry Banana Pie (Makes 2)**  
1 cup sugar  
1 8 oz. package cream cheese, room temperature  
Mix these ingredients till creamed. Mix 2 packages Dream Whip as directed on box. Add cream cheese mixture to Dream Whip mixture. In two already baked pie crusts (homemade is best) slice one layer solid of bananas. On top of bananas, spread cream cheese and dream whip. Then pour 1 can blueberry filling (1 1/2 can for each pie) on top. Chill. Strawberry can be substituted for blueberry.

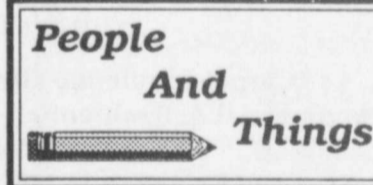

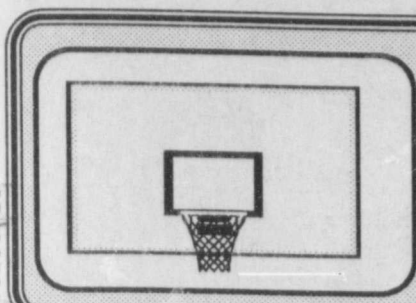

# Baker To Compete In Houston Calf Scramble

Benny Baker, 14 year-old FFA member from Deport, will compete in the 1991 Houston Rodeo calf scramble on February 22 in the Astrodomo.

The calf scramble is an exciting part of the Houston rodeo action, featuring The Juds as part of that evening performance.

Benny is son of Dexter and Nancy Baker and will compete for one of 252 calves to be awarded at the 1991 show.

Additionally, as many as two youngsters from each of the 18 performances will be awarded "hard luck" certificates for their efforts in attempting to catch a calf, resulting in 36 more certificates actually given.

Currently, more than 1,000 students are on Show-sponsored scholarships. The show's educational commitment for 1990-91 school year exceeds \$2 million.

Beginning with athletic competition in the Astrodomo, the program ends 12 months later with top-notch

competition in the Astrohall showing.

The calf scramble event involves 28 energetic youngsters pitted against 14 vigorous calves. Each youngster is committed to capturing a calf, haltering and bringing it to the finish line, but only the successful ones receive \$800 calf purchase certificates.

The certificate, donated by a sponsoring firm or individual, is used to purchase a purebred registered beef or dairy heifer. The calf is raised by the winner for special showing competition at the following year's show.

Winners are required to submit financial records, photographs and a scrapbook to the calf scramble office to detail the progress of the venture.

To date, the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo calf scramble has put 11,813 animals valued at more than \$2.6 million into the hands of Texas youth.




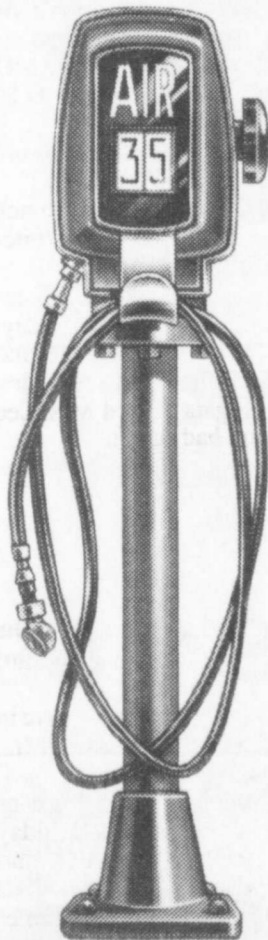

## Taxpayers Ask IRS

### Dependents and Exemptions

These are typical of questions asked by taxpayers and are presented as a public service of this publication and the IRS.

**Q.** What qualifies a person to be claimed as a dependent on my tax return?

**A.** Five tests are used to determine dependency in order to claim an exemption on your tax return. They are: member of household or relationship test, citizenship test, joint return test, gross income test and support test. Each of these rules has its own criteria. If you have a question as to whether or not to claim a dependent, consult the instructions in your tax package.

**Q.** Even though my dependent did not live with me the entire year, does he or she still qualify as a dependent on my tax return?

**A.** Yes, if he or she meets all of the tests mentioned above, he or she may still qualify as a dependent.

**Q.** How much is each exemption for a dependent worth?

**A.** For tax year 1990, each exemption, including yourself, is \$2,050.

**Q.** What do I do if I need more time to file?

**A.** You must apply for an extension of time to file using Form 4868, *Application for Automatic Extension of Time To File U.S. Individual Income Tax Return*. You must file Form 4868 by the regular due date of your return, and you must enclose payment of any tax you estimate you will owe. You will then be allowed four more months to file your return. You cannot file Form 1040EZ if you get an extension.

**Q.** Is there any kind of income that is not taxable?

**A.** Yes. Some of the most common forms of nontaxable income include child support, life insurance proceeds, accident and health insurance proceeds, welfare benefits, worker's compensation and similar benefits for sickness and injury, gifts and inheritances, and, under certain conditions, gain on the sale of your home if you are 55 or older. See Publication 525, *Taxable and Nontaxable Income*.

## HEALTH HINTS

### Coffee Mugs and Microbugs

The office coffee break: A time to relax and enjoy a hot, steaming cup of coffee—and bacteria? Surprisingly, many people don't realize that drinking from a reusable coffee mug instead of a clean, sanitary disposable cup, can be a good way to catch a cold or other illness.

Fact is, most people don't or can't take the time away from work to clean coffee mugs properly—they just give them a quick rinse. To properly sanitize a mug, it should be washed thoroughly and then rinsed for 30 seconds in water of 170 degrees or more. The tap water in office sinks and rest rooms rarely gets that hot.

A good detergent should also be used—something many offices don't have on hand. Sink areas in washrooms and office kitchens often harbor bacteria since so few workers bother to clean up after use. Over time—due to lack of proper cleaning—grime, residue and bacteria accumulate on the cup. Also, office workers often mishandle their cups, spreading germs from dirty hands. Cups are frequently used by more than one person and not properly cleaned. The result: You could be exposed to bacteria and viruses that cause colds and flu and even diseases like hepatitis A.

A better idea than using a reusable coffee mug at work is to use a disposable cup. Public health experts recognize the sanitary benefits of single service products. With disposables, you never have to worry about the bacteria problem or have to spend time away from your desk washing your cup in the sink. Disposables are clean because each

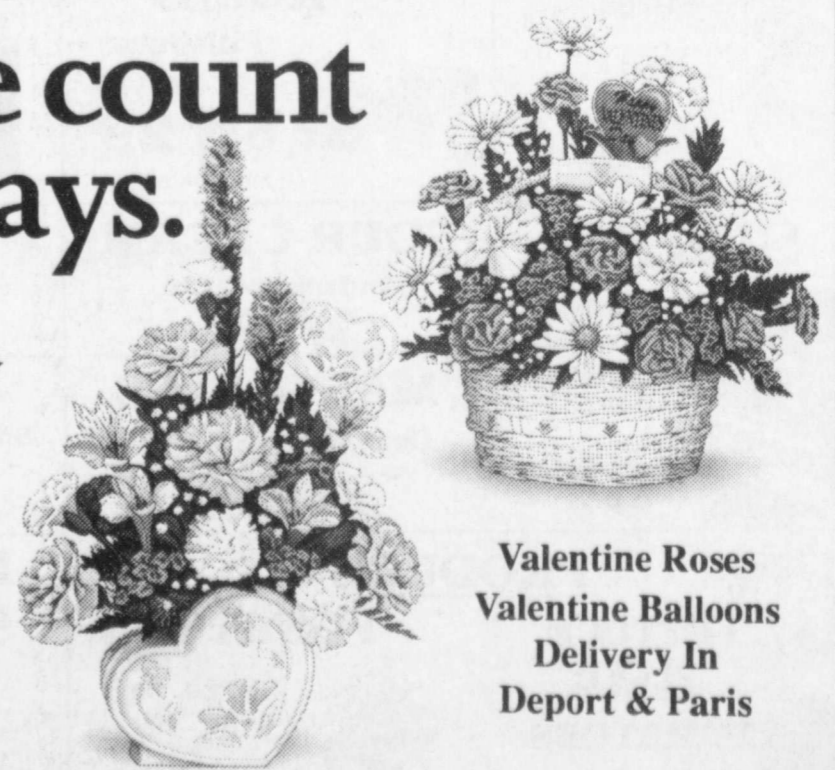

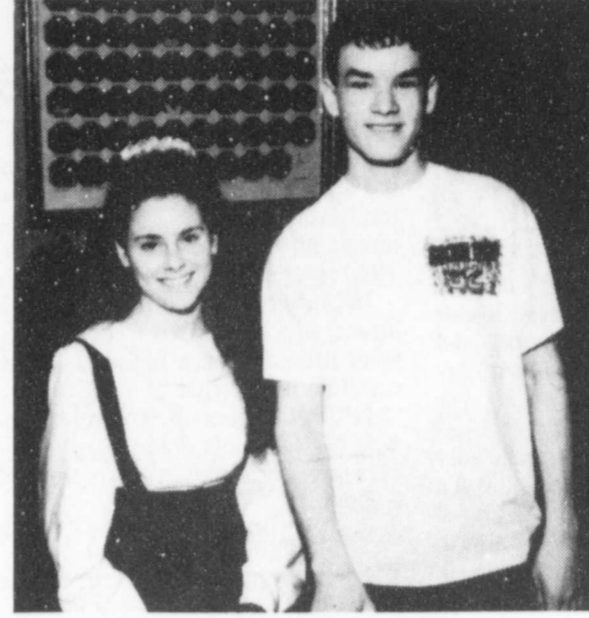

**UNTAXED MONEY**  
 he earned income credit originally enacted in 1975, is a refundable tax credit. That means the credit can reduce the amount of income tax you owe, and if the credit exceeds what you owe, the IRS will send you the difference. The credit is intended to provide tax relief for low-income workers with children. Over the years, the maximum amount of the credit has been increased to offset the impact of inflation and social security tax increases. Before passage of the 1990 tax law, the credit was 14% of earned income (maximum credit of about \$950), reduced by 10% of earned income exceeding \$10,730. Earned income means wages, salaries, or self-employment income.

The Revenue Reconciliation Act of 1990 made significant changes to this credit, effective for 1991, (on tax returns that will be filed in 1992). First, the credit has been adjusted for family size. Taxpayers with two or more qualifying children will receive a larger credit than taxpayers with only one qualifying child. Second, the credit percentage will increase over the next four years from the 1990 rate of 14% to the 1994 rates of 23% for households with one qualifying child and 25% for households with two or more qualifying children. The reduction percentage as income goes up increases from 10% in 1990 to almost 18% in 1994.

A supplemental 5% credit is available to taxpayers with a qualifying child under age one at the close of the tax year. A new health insurance credit of 6% is available for premiums paid on health insurance coverage for one or more qualifying children. For purposes of the credit, the taxpayer must have a "qualifying" child, stepchild, grandchild, or foster child. The child must reside with the taxpayer for over half the year (full year if foster child). Temporary absences due to education or illness are disregarded. Finally, the child must be either: (1) under age 19, (2) a full-time student under age 24, or (3) permanently and totally disabled at any time during the tax year. 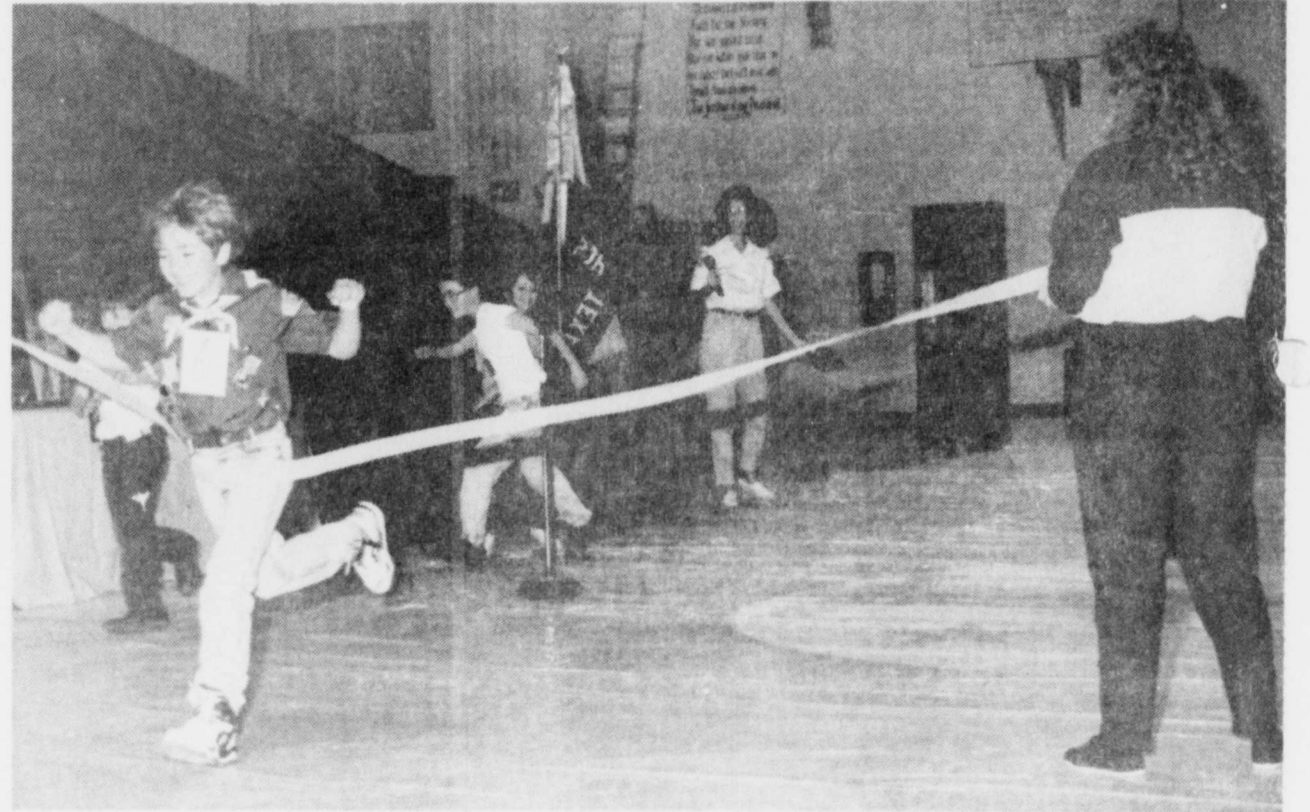


