## Blood Drive Is This Saturday

This Saturday, March 6, from 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. there will be a blood drive for Rev. C.G. (Glenn) Renfro. This will be held at the Deport American Legion Building at the north end of main street in Deport.

A blood goal has been set of 50 units of blood.

A number of questions have been asked concerning who can and cannot donate blood. The question has been asked if blood could be purchased.

Blood cannot be purchased through Stewart Blood Center. It could be purchased, they think, through the hospital.

As to who can donate blood, virtually anyone.

People who are on high blood pressure medicine can usually give blood, even if they are on medication. Blood pressure will be checked, and if it is abnormally high they will not take blood. There are other conditions which would keep someone from donating, such as pregnancy.

The best thing to do is call Stewart

Blood Center's office in Paris at 785-9399 or ask your questions the morning of the blood drive.

To those with a "needle phobia" it is well to note that they will not persist in trying to take blood if a vein is difficult to find. They also say that they do this all day, and frequently are told how easy and painless they make the procedure.

The entire blood donation takes about 20 minutes, ten minutes to fill out the medical history card and ten minutes to take the blood.

It is safe, with technicians using every precaution. Blood type is not a factor, as it is a replacement drive.

Rev. Renfro has been a very important part of this area, ministering to hundreds during their time of need.

Now, he faces serious kidney surgery, which can require large amounts of blood.

This is a chance to say, in some small way, "Thank You" to him. And, if he does not require the blood, there are many others who will benefit from the blood taken.

## Assessment Program Adopted At Prairiland

In April 1992, the State Board of Education adopted a redesigned student assessment program which includes modifications to the current TAAS program. The modifications include reducing the number of grade levels assessed to Grades 4, 8 and 10 (exit level).

The spring schedule for TAAS includes test administration in March and May. The spring administration of TAAS writing test, both the written composition and writing multiple choice portion, will be March 11, 1993 for grades 4, 8 and 10 (exit level). The TAAS tests for reading and mathematics will be administered in May. Both sections of the exit level TEAMS test will also be administered to eligible individuals

in May. Parents will need to see that their children are in school on March 11, 1993 for the writing test. All students in the state will be tested in writing during the March testing. No make up test are allowed.

It will be to the students benefit if the parents can see to it that they get a good night's rest and a nourishing breakfast.

Both the elementary schools, Blossom and Deport, will be testing the 4 and 8 grades and Prairiland will be testing 10 grade and any student in grades 11 or 12 who has not previously mastered a part of the test.

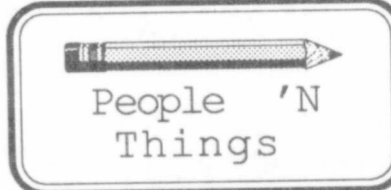

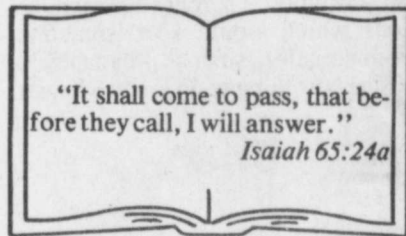

This week I went to Deport, and interviewed one of my favorite people. I could have written an article about my daughter-in-law, Lila Screws, without an interview, but I wanted her to write her recipes for me, and I wanted to take her picture. If I didn't goof up the picture, you are looking at a picture of a very pretty girl. She and our son, Mike, have been married almost 13 years and they have three daughters, Bren 11, Kara 8 and Hali 4.

I wanted to feature Lila earlier, but they were building a new home and moving in. I didn't want to intrude on what had to be a very hectic time. The new home is lovely. I think Hali's description is probably the best I've heard, she says it's "bootiful".

Lila works at Deport School as an aide. She keeps records for the children's breakfast and lunch programs. She also assists the teachers as needed. Lila has been working full time at the school for a year. Before that she was a substitute teacher and did private babysitting at home. ### German Chocolate Pie

By Lila Screws

1 cup granulated sugar  
1/2 cup firmly packed light brown sugar  
1/2 cup evaporated milk  
1/2 cup chopped pecans  
1/2 cup shredded coconut  
2 eggs, beaten  
1/4 cup melted butter  
9" unbaked pie shell

Preheat oven to 400. Blend all ingredients except crust in mixing bowl. Pour into pie shell. Bake 30-35 minutes, until filling is set. Let cool, then chill several hours before cutting.

### Oatmeal Scotchies

2 cups all purpose flour  
2 tps. baking powder  
1 tsp. baking soda  
1 tsp. salt  
1 cup butter or margarine, softened  
1 1/2 cups firmly packed brown sugar  
2 eggs  
1 1/2 tsp. milk  
1 1/2 cups quick cooking rolled oats

Preheat oven to 375. In medium bowl, combine flour, baking powder, soda and salt. Cream butter and brown sugar. Beat in eggs, milk and oats. Stir in dry ingredients and butter-scotch morsels. Drop by tablespoonfuls 2 inches apart on greased cookie sheets. Bake 10-12 minutes until golden brown. Cool 5 minutes. Gently lift with spatula and cool completely on racks.

### Chess Cake

1 stick oleo, melted  
2 eggs  
1/4 cup oil  
Butter cake mix

Mix all together, spread in 13x9 greased pan.  
1 stick oleo, room temperature  
1-8 oz. cream cheese, room temperature  
2 eggs, beaten  
1 box powdered sugar

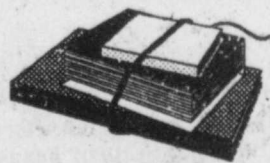
Mix and spread over first mixture. Bake at 325 for 1 hour.

### Sour Dough Biscuits

1 tsp. sugar  
1/4 very warm water  
1 pkg. rapid rise yeast  
1/2 cup sugar  
self-rising flour  
buttermilk

Put yeast and 1 tsp. sugar in water and stir. Let it dissolve for about 30 minutes. In large mixing bowl, put 1/2 cup sugar and 2 cups buttermilk. Now add the yeast mixture and stir. Add enough self-rising flour to make it doughy where you can knead it. Pour the dough out on floured dough board or any flat surface and work it. Add a little flour to the dough if it is too sticky. Roll dough out about 1/4-1/2 inch thick. Cut out the biscuits and put in oiled pans. Preheat oven to 425 and cook til brown. You can freeze the uncooked biscuits in oiled pans until ready to use. Be sure to set them out early enough for them to thaw completely.

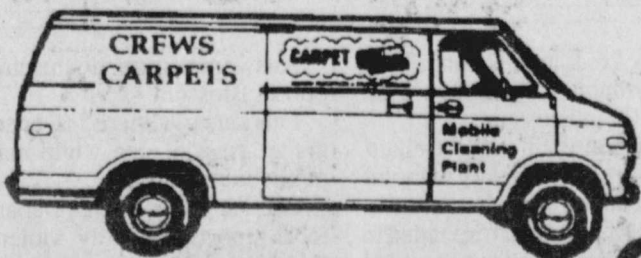

Stephen Storey is a graduate of

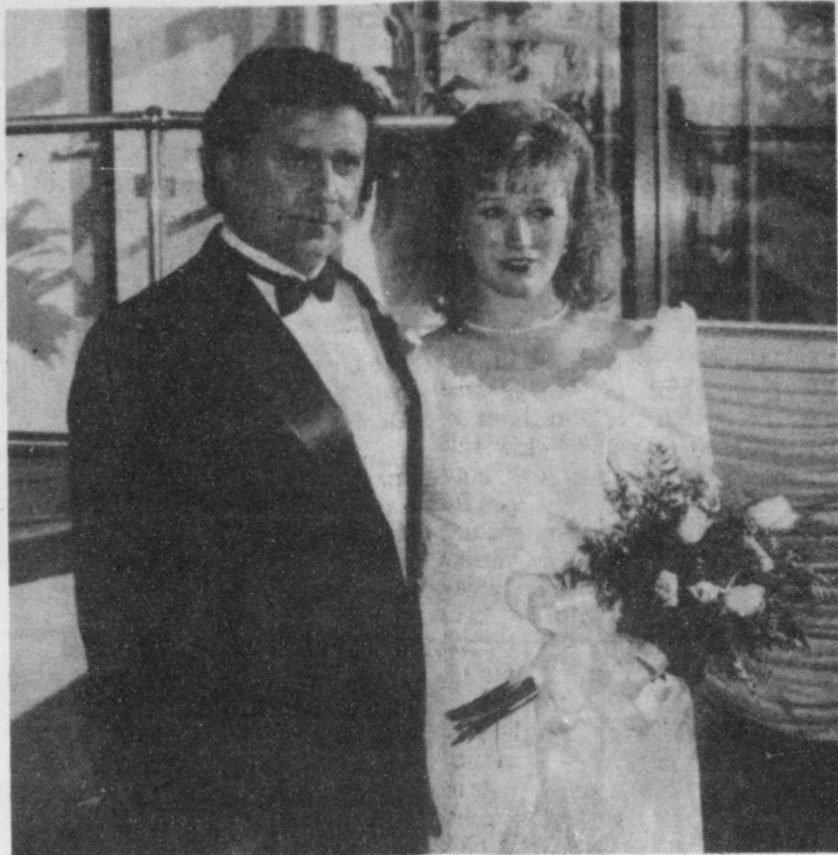
Paris schools and the University of Texas in Austin. He was a member of the Delta Tau Delta fraternity. He is president of Pavillon Bank in Dallas.
