Deport Council To Apply For Baseball Complex Grant

The Deport City Council voted to sponsor a grant application for a new baseball complex to be built north of the city at their regular meeting Monday night. Hayter Engineering will submit the application for consideration by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

They also met with Dickie Davis, who asked for city water and sewer connections to be installed to a new shop building recently constructed east of Sonny and Juanita Davis'

home. No action was taken at the present time.

The council finalized sewer and water grant number 700841.

They approved the mailing of letters to city property owners who need to clean up their property and discussed the Fire Truck insurance process which is continuing on the fire truck wrecked in December.

Councilman Duane Glover is working with the company, and hopes

the matter can be resolved soon.

In other business the council voted to purchase five loads of gravel to be put on streets which are on bus routes.

They discussed a letter from the Texas Employment Commission in regard to a former employee.

They also held a discussion about plumbers installing sewer lines in the city without permits.

Minutes were read and approved, financial report approved and bills paid.

clearly stated, if the story is in story form it helps immensely.

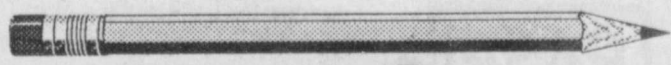
Remember, we don't know everyone, and we don't automatically know what someone's name is.

Tostados

- 1 1/2 lb. hamburger
- 3 cans refried beans
- 2 small cans taco sauce
- Tortillas
- Non fat sour cream
- Lettuce
- Tomatoes

Brown meat, drain. Add salt and pepper to taste. Add beans and sauce; let simmer for 15 min. Serve on warm tortillas with lettuce tomatoes, onions, and sour cream. Good with picante sauce.

- 1 8 oz. pkg. cream cheese
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 1 tsp. vanilla

Slice cookie dough and press into a pizza pan. Bake according to directions on package. Beat cream cheese, sugar and vanilla until fluffy and spread over baked, cooled cookie crust. Arrange fresh strawberries, banana slices, orange sections and pineapple chunks in circles on dough. You may want to use Fruit Fresh to keep bananas from turning. Canned pie fillings could also be used for expediency.

Makes It's Own Crust Custard

- Spray Pam
- Corn Meal
- 2 eggs or 1/2 cup eggbeaters
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 1/4 cup milk or canned skim milk
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 tsp. flavoring (vanilla or lemon) or you can use
- 1 tsp. lemon juice
- 2 Tablespoons flour

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Spray pie pan with Pam or other spray. Be sure to coat well. Put in about a heaping tablespoon of cornmeal, and shake it around the way you do flour in a cake pan. Discard loose meal. In a mixing bowl, beat eggs or substitute and sugar until fluffy. Gradually mix in flour and salt. Add milk and flavoring. Beat until well mixed. Pour mixture into pie plate, and cook until set and light brown. It should be firm. Cook approximately 30 minutes. Note: If you use the eggbeaters and canned skim milk, the pie will be practically fat free.
