Thanks to Louise Watkins Osborne of Paris, daughter of the late Sam and Essie Watkins, for her memories of bus driving back in the

Deport had a school bus in the years of 1934-35. My father, Sam Watkins, was a bus driver from 1934-35 until 1938 or 1939.

He lost his job under a new school

law because he just had one eye. Deport High School was new then, and he drove the bus from Deport to Hoovertown. In winter the roads were so bad that when it rained the bus was always in the ditch. Sometimes my daddy would walk back to town or one of the Wright's men or the Hignight's men would get the mules and pull the bus out.

The bus always ran -sleet, snow or rain. It makes me smile when I see our schools close for a day or two because of a little sleet or snow, even though we have good roads now.

The bus was red with real wood on it. Daddy earned \$25 a month in

I was in the first grade and my teacher was Miss Thelma, now Mrs. Thelma Warren. The school looked so big to me, and daddy always told me "go to Miss Thelma for help". He was right, because she was so good and loved all kids.

As far as I know Sam Wright and Grady Wright are still in Deport, but most of the kids that rode my dad's bus have moved on are passed on.



This week's featured cook is Mrs. Orene Bonner and is one of those people that, when you sit down to talk to her, you look up and it is three hours later. Everyone that knows her loves her and she is affectionately known as "Mom" Bonner.

Monday was a special day for her. She celebrated her 85th birthday and says that her birthday is very special to her. Her mother always told her that was her day and no one could take it away from her
