## Prairiland Accepts Bids For Upcoming School Year Services

The Prairiland CISD Board of Trustees met in regular session Monday night, accepting several bids for services in the upcoming school year.

The bid from Oak Farms was accepted for providing milk. The fuel bid from Blankenship Oil Company was accepted, as was the bid from Professional Computer Services on MacIntosh Computers.

No action was taken on the bread bid at this meeting.

In other business the board agreed to approve acceptance of bids on the sale of property by the appraisal board and authorized John Dunagan to sign deeds.

No action was taken on the tax

report.

Budget amendments were approved as was an update on Policy #46.

It was agreed to sell bus number 10, a 1980 Chevrolet bus.

The 1994-95 high school schedule was approved.

A contract with Chisum CISD on transfers was accepted.

The Workers Compensation Insurance plan was renewed with Hibbs-Hallmark Company.

A report from Dr. Richard Nash was given on AEIS scores.

The student handbook and code of conduct book was approved for 1994-

95.

The board voted to become a member of the State Purchasing Agency.

The board then went into executive session at 9:45 p.m. and came out at 10:40 p.m.

Sue Ward was hired as coach/teacher at Blossom Junior High.

Salary increases/pay schedule for custodians/maintenance personnel was accepted.

Principals were given the authority to hire aides for campuses as needed.

Minutes were approved as read as was the financial report and payment of bills.

## Deport Council Discusses Problems

The Deport City Council discussed several problems in their regular meeting Monday night, July 11th, including a problem with the polycarts used in Deport for trash pickup. Waste Management notified the city that some of the carts are not being pulled close enough to the curb. It was decided that instructions would be put on the water bills as well as being published. In the future ALL carts should be placed up next to the street or curb.

A discussion was held including Greg Liska and Mike Vallendingham about the problem with the decaying buildings at the north end of Main Street in Deport.

A good response has been received on the letters sent out on property and sewer problems, it was reported.

The council accepted the bid for the house on Pecan St.

A discussion concerning opening

a street was held, but action was tabled until next meeting.

Mayor Charles Foster read a letter explaining the rate increase from Douglas Cablevision.

It was decided that City Secretary Sharon Francis should look into what needs to be done with preserving the records.

Minutes were approved as read, financial report approved as presented, payment of bills okayed.

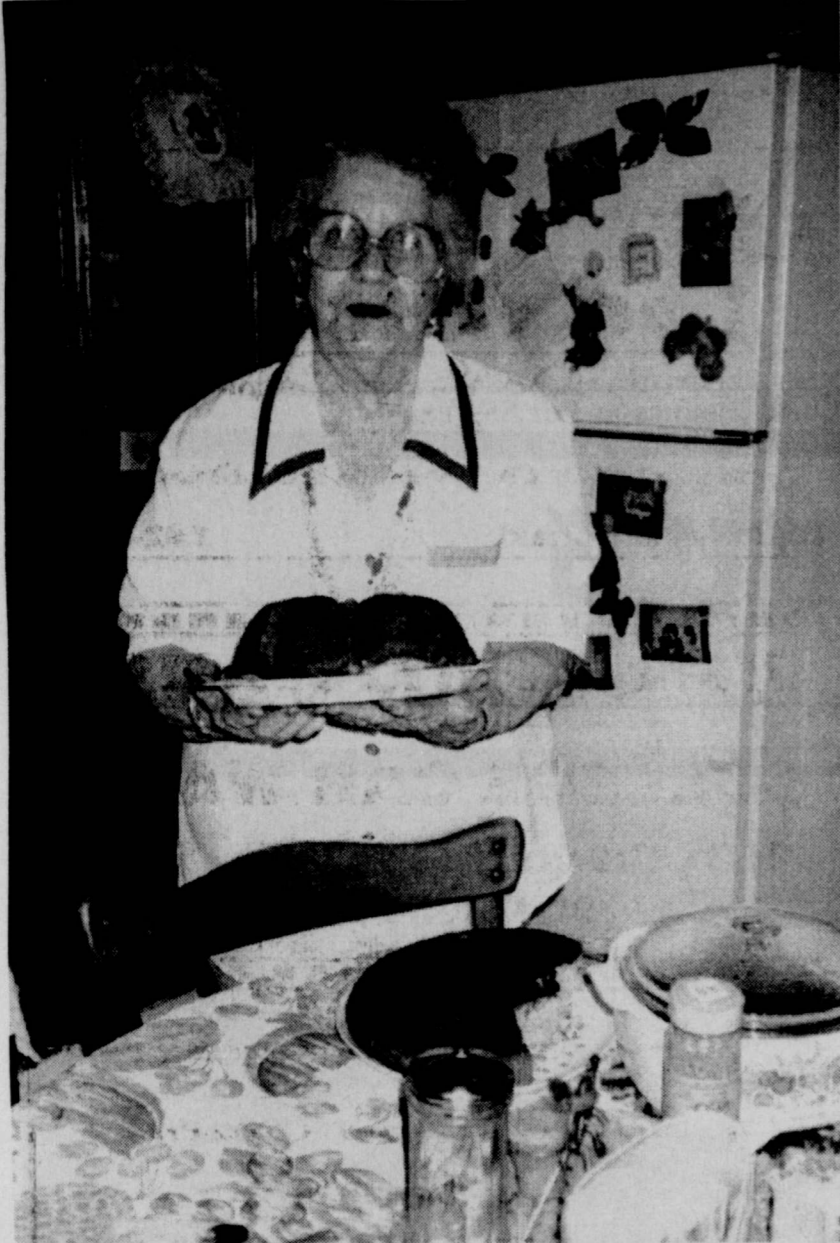

This week's featured cook is Mrs. Orene Bonner and is one of those people that, when you sit down to talk to her, you look up and it is three hours later. Everyone that knows her loves her and she is affectionately known as "Mom" Bonner.

Monday was a special day for her. She celebrated her 85th birthday and says that her birthday is very special to her. Her mother always told her that was her day and no one could take it away from her.

She has been married to Mr. Bonner for 65 years and they have three children. I tell everyone that my baby is starting high school this fall, well Mrs. Bonner says her babies will all be in their 60's in August and is so proud of every one of them.

Her oldest, Larry, lives in Sylvan and is married to Melonese. She has another son, M.H. and he is married to Martha. They live in Arlington. Her daughter Rita and her husband, Jack, live in Bedford.

She loves to have visitors and relatives come to see her because she loves to cook and this is her way of sharing with everyone.

They moved to Blossom in 1931 and both have seen many changes in the area, both when Blossom was in its heyday and Blossom as it is now.

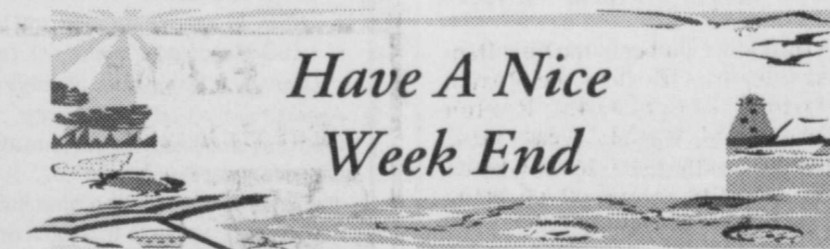

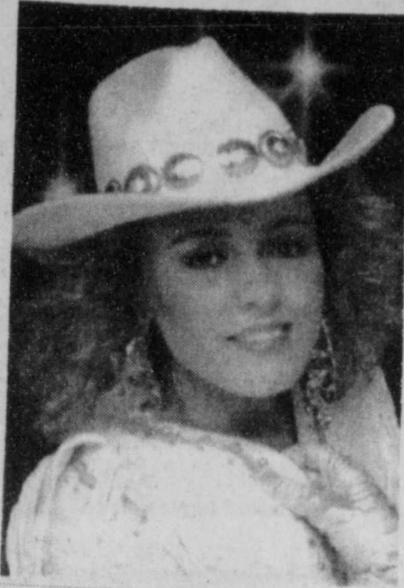
