And what of my two house cats? Well, both are usually very, very shy with strangers. They vanish not to be seen at







### Deport Housing residents to have porch sales





### Women speak up about breast cancer treatment

COLLEGE STATION - Somewhere in this country a woman has just been diagnosed with breast cancer. Questions race through her mind as she tries to comprehend the significance of the disease and how her life is now turned upside down

The first decision she faces is how to treat the disease. Does she help choose the treatment or does her doctor make the decision for her?

According to researchers at Texas A&M University and Scott and White Clinic and Hospital in Temple, Texas, a woman can be actively involved in deciding her treatment which in turn may give her a sense of control over the disease and a better outlook on life. This involvement in treatment consultation is accomplished through simple communication.

"A patient concerned about health or facing options for treatment should do three things: ask questions, express concerns and share opinions. Most doctors want to accommodate patients, but when a patient is real quiet or passive it's hard to know how the patient feels about the options for treatment. Involvement requires an active, communicative patient," said Richard Street, Texas A&M speech communication professor and head of the

The researchers found in their first study that breast cancer patients who were more involved in deciding treatment were college-educated and younger than 65.
