Kristin Lee Lawrence has been named Valedictorian and Rachel Inga h as Salutatorian of the class.



The Pattonville Community Center and VFD monthly business meeting is at 7:00 p.m. Monday, May 25.


Deport to have Clean Up Days this Friday and Saturday



use 1/2 amount of water as directed 2 cans frozen orange juice 2 cans frozen pineapple juice 2 cans frozen lemonade sugar to taste

2 quarts ginger ale Combine Kool-Aid and water as directed. Add frozen juices: add water as directed on cans. Sugar to taste. Refrigerate. When ready to serve add ginger

In a 4-quart non-metal container, cobine lemonade, limeade, sugar, egg whites and crushed ice; mix well. Cover and freeze, stirring occasionally. Remove container from freezer 30 minutes before serving. Spoon 2 cups sluch mixture into blender and add I cup club soda and blend until frothy.


