All was well, though bitter cold and windy.

And, within the space of 45 minutes no less than four people stopped to offer assistance.

I appreciate it. I appreciate it more than they will ever know. If there had been a problem I would have definitely taken them up on their offers.

But would someone please explain why it never, ever comes about that help is there when you don't need it...but when you do need help the road is empty, and friends are somewhere far, far way!

Murphy's law again! And there is no denying that it exists!

Council hears from citizens, attend to lengthy agenda

The Deport City Council attended to a full agenda with a room full of visitors Monday night.

First on the agenda was Bill Hayter of Hayter Engineering, who proposed to the council to pay Richard Drake Construction 90% of the total amount of the road construction project on Ruth and Trail Streets. The payment, in excess of \$48,000 was accepted by the council. Hayter advised the council of some spots in the asphalt that need to be sealed as a result of more gravel in some places.

Joe Ballard and Juanita Davis of Deport accompanied by their surveyor, Jim Nelson, asked the council for permission to re-plot property in the Bell Survey in order to abandon proposed streets that were never built, since the original survey.

Council discussed the proper action to take in regard to a culvert on

Kelsey Street that the city is owed \$128.

The council raised water meter deposits from \$75 to \$125.

They also passed a resolution for the purchase of a new fire/ first responder truck.

The note for the purchase of the truck will be made through Guaranty Bank-Deport.

Council agreed to obtain services from McClanahan and Holmes to conduct an audit for the city for the 1998 year.

Council discussed the possibility of hiring law enforcement for the city. No action was taken.

Donny Darden was approved by the council to serve as Fire Chief for the Volunteer Fire Department.

The council discussed, but took no action on annexation of property outside the city limits

Darden elected Deport Fire Chief

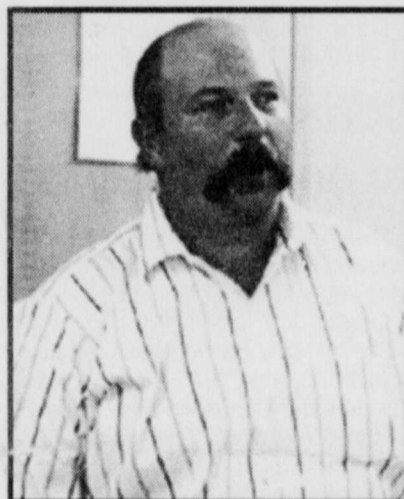
Donny Darden was approved Monday night by the Deport City Council as Fire Chief of the Deport Volunteer Fire Department.

Eudy receives President's Award

Ricky Eudy, Texas Utilities Railroad Electrician, received his company's highest honor, the President's Lifesaving Award, on January 4 at a reception attended by co-workers, friends and family.

Eudy's award followed an accident that happened one year earlier where Eudy and his wife Deena, formerly of Cuthand, now of Mt. Pleasant, were visiting his family when he was led to what he thought was a rumble of thunder.

The sound turned out to be an overturned car with flames spreading from its engine compartment. Two of the three occupants, a man and woman in the front, survived. A third woman was fatally injured on impact. All were trapped in the vehicle.

John Henry, conscious and coherent, was trapped on the passenger side. Peggy Preston, bleeding and critically injured with numerous fractures, hung from her seatbelt on the passenger side, her body pinned in the wreckate, her face in oil dirt.

Finding a gap in the wreckage, Eudy handed his pocket knife in to Mr. Henry, who cut his seatbelt, but his only route of escape was across Miss Preston. With the help of Eudy's

family, they lifted Mr. Henry across Miss Preston.

Eudy, his nephew and a neighbor tried lifting the car by its rear bumper while the others moved into position to help free the trapped woman.

When they couldn't life the car from above, Eudy crawled beneath it on hands and knees and tried again. He was finally in a position to move her and while his family tended Mr. Henry, he monitored Miss Preston's pulse and breathing until rescue workers arrived.

Eudy graduated from Rivercrest High School in 1969 and began working for TU within the week. He began working with meter checking crews before joining Texas Utilities Mining Company as an electrician's helper in 1976. Today he is a licensed electrician operating the electric trains hauling coal from the mines to the Monticello generating facility.

Trained in first aide, rescue and safety procedure before going out on a job, each year more than 800 local TU employees spend eight hours in safety and first aid refresher courses.

Tex-Mex Cheesy Potato and Corn Chowder-this spicy and healthful chowder is easy to make and also low-fat.


Parmesan-Green Onion Biscuit Wedges-these are great right out of the oven and by themselves. Also serve with winter soups and stews.

January 14, 1998 Just Recipes!

Tex-Mex Cheesy Potato and Corn Chowder

1 cup chopped celery
1 cup chopped onion
2 tablespoons butter or margarine
1 carton or 2 cans chicken broth
8 cups peeled and cubed potatoes
1 can whole kernel corn with red and green peppers
1 can chopped green chilies
1 package Pioneer No-Fat Country Gravy mix
2 cups skim milk
4 ounces Mexican Velveeta-1/2" cubes

In large saucepan, cook and stir celery and onion in butter over medium-high heat until tender (about 5 minutes). Add broth; bring to a boil. Add potatoes; cook over low heat for 20-25 minutes or until potatoes are soft, stirring occasionally. Stir in corn and chilies; return to boiling. Dissolve gravy mix in milk; stir in boiling mixture. Add cheese. Cook and stir over low heat until cheese is melted. 6-8 servings.

Parmesan-Green Onion Biscuit Wedges

3 cups Pioneer Low Fat Biscuit and Baking Mix
1/2 cup shredded Parmesan cheese
3 tablespoons finely chopped green onions and chives
2/3 cup skim milk
1/2 cup fat-free peppercorn ranch salad dressing
garlic salt

In large bowl, stir together biscuit and baking mix, cheese and green onions. In 1 cup glass measure, combine milk and salad dressing. Stir into baking mix to form stiff dough. Turn onto surface dusted with additional baking mix. Knead 10 times. Roll dough into circle about 1/2 inch thick. Cut into 12 wedges. Place on baking sheet coated with cooking spray. Sprinkle with garlic salt. Bake at 400 degrees for 12-15 minutes or until golden brown. Makes 12 biscuits.

Mexican Meatball and Salsa Chili

1-1/2 pound ground beef
1/2 cup dry bread crumbs
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 large onion-chopped
2 teaspoons vegetable oil
2-1/2 can Mexican-style tomatoes
1 jar salsa(your taste)
2 teaspoons ground cumin
1 teaspoon chili powder
1 teaspoon finely chopped jalapeno pepper
1 package Pioneer Brown Gravy Mix (not fat or regular)

In large bowl, stir together ground beef, bread crumbs, salt and pepper and shape into 1-inch balls. Place on baking sheet; bake at 400 degrees for 15 minutes or until no longer pink. Meanwhile in 4-quart saucepan or Dutch oven, cook and stir onion in oil until tender. Add 2 cups water, tomatoes, salsa, cumin, chili powder and jalapeno pepper; bring to a boil. Dissolve gravy mix in 1/2 cup cool water; stir into boiling mixture. Add meatballs; reduce heat and simmer 10 minutes to combine flavors. 8-10 servings.

Cheesy Ranch Pinwheels

3 cups Pioneer Buttermilk Biscuit and Baking Mix
1 tablespoon chopped fresh cilantro leaves
1 cup skim milk
3 tablespoons prepared ranch salad dressing
1 cup finely shredded Colby-Jack cheese

In large bowl, stir together biscuit and baking mix cilantro and milk to form a stiff dough. Turn out onto surface dusting with additional biscuit and baking mix. Knead 10 times. Roll dough into rectangle about 1/2 inch thick. Spread with salad dressing; sprinkle with cheese. Beginning with long side, roll up like a jelly roll. Cut into 1/2-3/4 inch slices; place on baking sheet coated with cooking spray. Bake at 400 degrees for 10-12 minutes or until biscuits are golden brown. Makes 12-14 biscuits.

No-Fail Divinity


4 cups sugar
1 cup light Karo syrup
3/4 cup water
1/8 teaspoon salt
3 egg whites
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 cup chopped nuts

Combine syrup, sugar, water and salt in a 2-quart casserole. Cook in microwave 20 minutes or until candy thermometer reads 260 degrees. Stir every 5 minutes during cooking time. While syrup cooks, beat egg whites until very stiff. Gradually pour hot syrup over egg whites and continue beating at a high speed until mixture is thick and candy starts to lose it's gloss. (Usually about 12 minutes). Add vanilla and nuts to candy and drop by spoonfuls onto wax paper. Makes approximately 7 dozen pieces.

Large and Luscious Chocolate Cookies

1 cup granulated sugar
1 cup packed dark brown sugar
1/2 cup butter-softened
1/2 cup margarine-softened
2 large eggs
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips, melted and cooled at room temperature
3-1/3 cup Pioneer Buttermilk Baking Mix
2 cups large semi-sweet or milk chocolate chips or chunks
1 cup white chocolate chips

In large mixer bowl, beat sugars, butter and margarine until creamy, about 3 minutes. Add eggs and vanilla; beat until light and fluffy. Add eggs and vanilla; beat until light and fluffy. Mix in melted semi-sweet chocolate. Add baking mix; beat on low speed until blended. Mix in large chips. Chill dough for at least 1 hour. Line 9-inch heart-shaped pan with aluminum foil and coat with cooking spray. Spread about 1-1/2 cups dough in pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 15-17 minutes or just until center is almost set. Do not overbake. Cool in pan for 10 minutes. Lift foil with cookie to wire rack and cool completely. Repeat with remaining cookie dough. Melt white chocolate and use to decorate as desired.

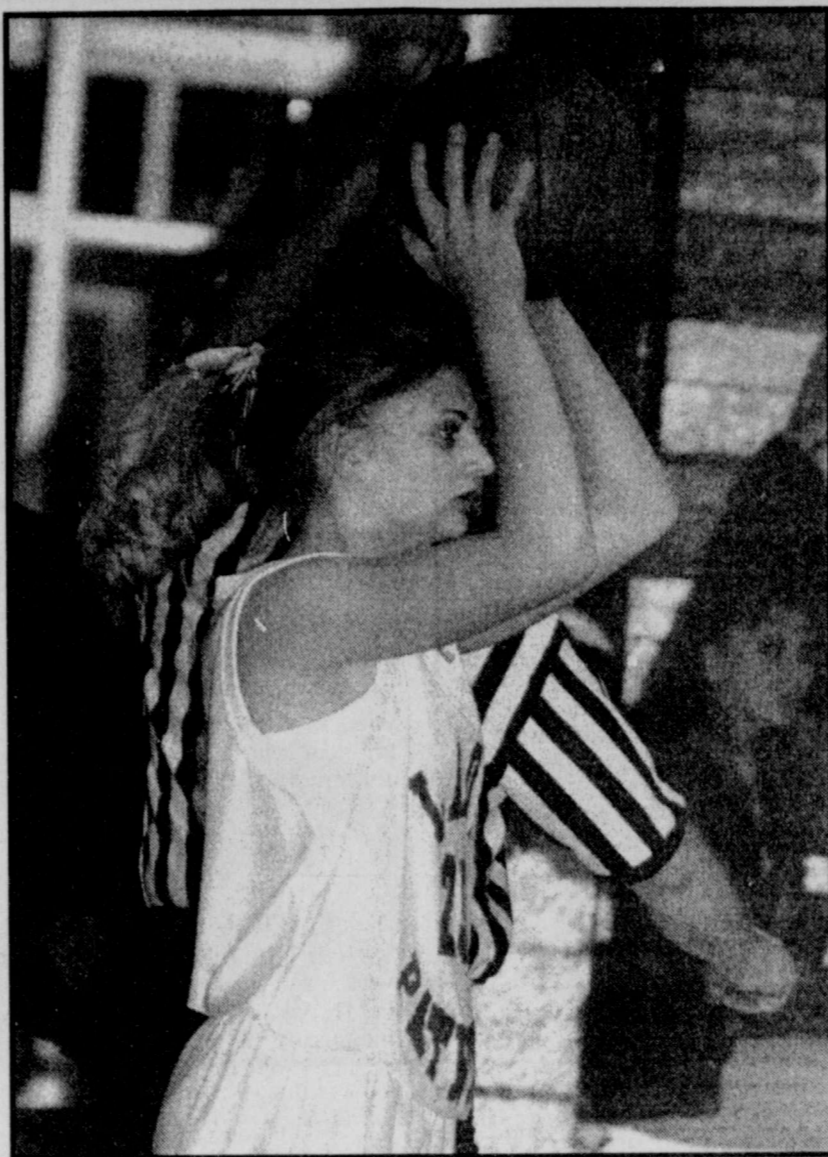

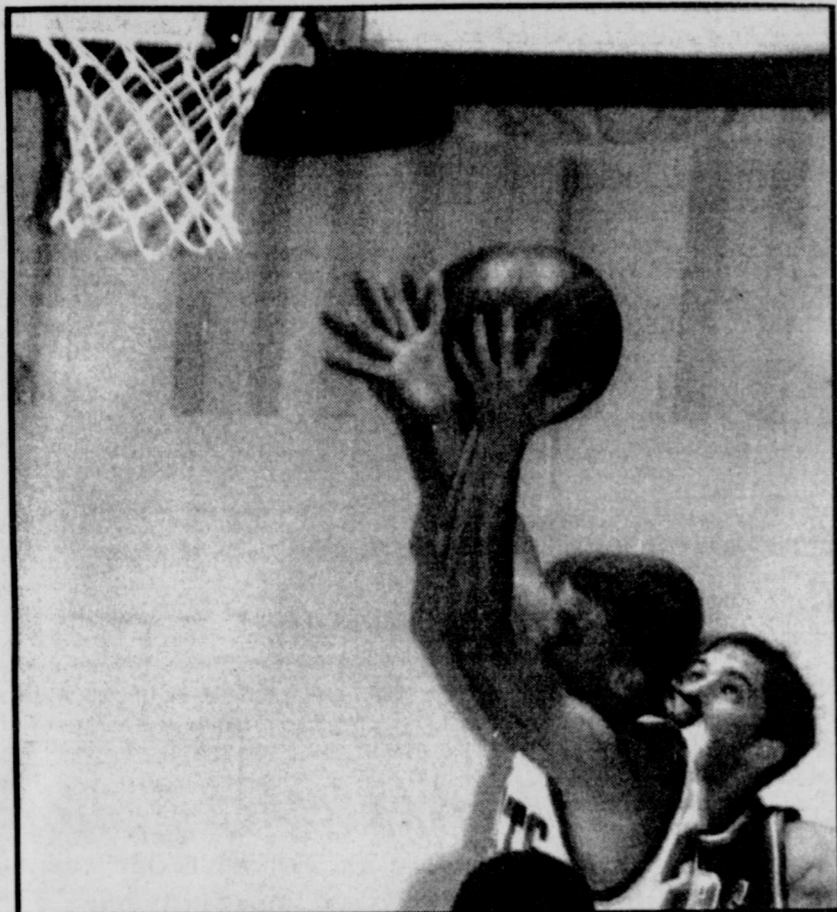
and Jordan Hunold each had two.

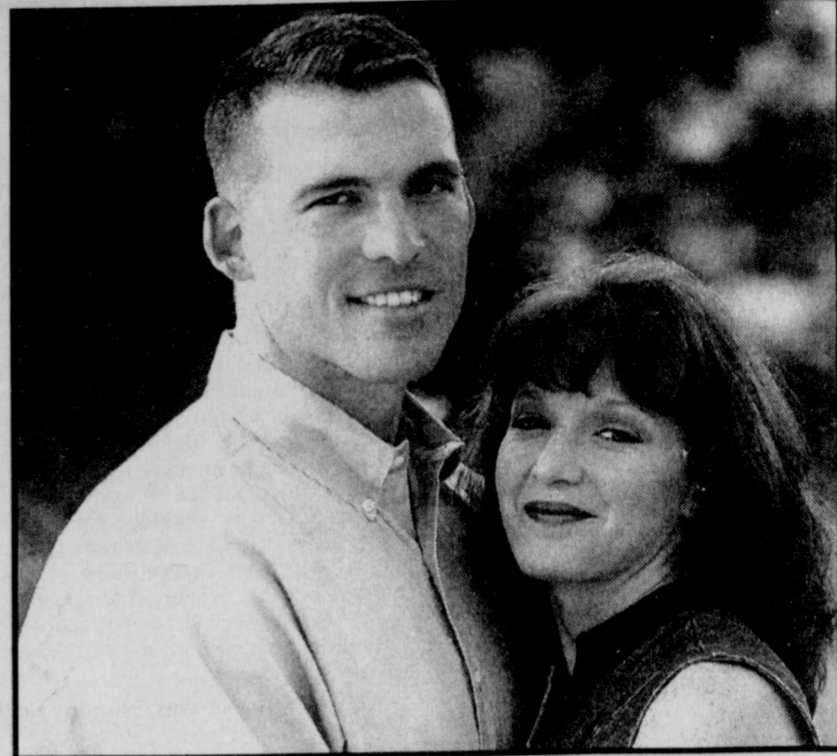

FOOT NOTES

IN A PINCH?

Burning pain in the forefoot, shooting pain and dull, pervasive ache are some of the most commonly described symptoms of a neuroma. The source of the pain is an enlargement of the sheath that surrounds one (or more) of the intermetatarsal nerves. The most common location is the area between the third and four toes and metatarsals. This particular site is most vulnerable because it is the thickest and is the junction of several different nerves. This condition is often caused by shoes that cramp the toes, causing a pinching of these nerves. Pronation of the foot may also exacerbate this condition. Your podiatrist may provide relief with orthotics, steroid injections, or, in severe cases, surgical removal of the neuroma.

Don't wait for the pain and the problem to disappear. Most likely they won't and you'll be left with a worse condition than when the problem was still new and relatively minor. 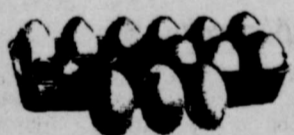

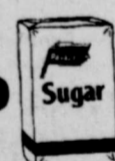

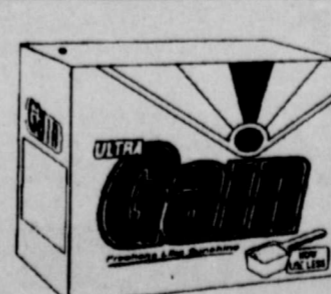
