State sales tax holiday coming up in August

Texas families have an opportu-
nity to stretch their clothing budgets during the second annual Sales Tax Holiday, Aug. 4-6. Texas Comptroller Carole Keeton Rylander said.
"On the first Friday, Saturday and Sunday of August, no state or local sales tax will be charged on most clothing and footwear priced under
$\$ 100$," Comptroller Rylander said The timing of the Sales Tax Holiday is intended to help parents outfit their children for the new school year. However, the tax break is not limited to children's school clothes.
Highlights include: Most clothing highlights include: Most clothing
and footwear priced under $\$ 100$ is exempt from sales taxes. Consumers may purchase as many tax-exempt items as they wish. marily for athletics or protective wear, such as golf cleats or football pads, are not tax exempt. However,
athletic clothes that are commonly athletic clothes that are commonly used as street wear, such as tennis
shoes, baseball caps and jogging suits are eligible for the tax exemption. Not included in the Sales Tax Holiday are accessories, such as jewelry and watches and iterns that are
