 ing spring storm season, which will bring the possibility of tornadoes,thunderstorms, hail, lightning and flash flooding.
Tornadoes can occur at any time of the year. In Texas, peak tornado occurrence is in March through May.
A secondary tornado maximum can A second iny fornad. Tornadoes are most occur in the fall. Tornadoes are most
likely to occur between 3 and 9 p.m. but have been known to occur at all hours of the day or night.
An average tornado moves from
southwest to northeast, but tornadoes can move in any direction.
The average forward speed is 30
mph but may vary from nearly sta mph but may vary from nearly sta-
tionary to 70 mph ionary to 70 mph
Flash flooding
related killer in the United States. Nearly half of all flash flood fatailities are auto related. In your car
or truck, look out for flooding at highway dips, bridges and low areas. Water weighs 62.4 lbs . per cubic foot and typically flows downstream
at 6 to 12 miles an hour. When a veat 6 to 12 miles an hour. When a ve--
hicle stalls in the water, the water's hicle stalls in the water, the water's
momentum is transferred to the vehicle. For each foot the water rises, 500 lbs . of lateral force are applied to the vehicle. But the biggest factor is buoyancy. For each foot the water vehicle displaces $1,500 \mathrm{lbs}$. of water. In effect, the vehicle weighs
1,500 lbs. less for $1,500 \mathrm{lbs}$. less for each foot the wa-
ter rises. Two feet of water will carry
away most vehicles. Trucks with oversize tires are especially dangerous, because the large tires will ac-
tually help float the truck off the road.

## Occasionally, floating debris can

Subsequent flash flooding can occur downstream if the obstruction should suddenly release.
Lightning often strikes outside of heavy rain and may occur as far as

creased protection if you are not touching metal. Although you may be injured if lightning strikes your car, you are much safer inside a ve

Before a storm, develop a plan for you and your family for home, work
school and when outdoors. Have fre quent drills. Know the county/parish in which you live, and keep a highway map nearby to follow storm
