
It's enough to make me forget the reason I'm putting those lights out!

Fried Twinkies cup milk 2 tablespoons vinegar

tablespoon oil cup clour teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt V2 teaspoon vanilla 6 frozen Twinkies 4 cups vegetable oil for frying

Heat oil to 375 degrees. Prepare batter by mixing milk, vinegar and oil. Blend in another bowl flour, baking powder and salt. Whisk dry ingredients into wet ingredients until smooth. Refrigerate while oil heats to proper temperature. Dust Twinkies with flour and dip into batter. Rotate unti batter until Twinkie is covered all over. Place carefully in hot oil. Twinkies will float, so it must be held under until golden brown; about 3-4 minutes. Remove to paper towel and let drain. Can be dusted with powdered sugar.

When mixture boils, reduce heat and place a lid on pot for 60 seconds. When time is up remove lid and let boil lightly until mixture reaches a soft boil stage. Turn off heat and add chips, vanilla and marshmallows. Stir gen-

tly until all is melted. Pour while mixture is still hot int a glass or stainless stelle mixing bowl that has been sprayed with Pam. Add nuts and stir well. Pour into 9x9 pan that has been sprayed with Pam and let fudge set to cool
