

## Bob Wills To Be Buried In Tulsa

Bob Wills, a country music superstar, star of 26 movies and originator of the style of music known as "country swing," died Tuesday of bronchial pneumonia at a Fort Worth nursing home. He was 70.

A spokesman for the nursing home said Wills had been in a coma for the past two months and died without regaining consciousness. She also said he had not responded to treatment and had been "totally aphasic"—unable to communicate—since admission a year ago.

The home said his wife, Betty,—his nurse since his first stroke in 1969—spent the last six days at his bedside. The first stroke left him partially paralyzed and another stroke in 1973 left him bedridden.

"His wife has been just tremendous," the spokesman said. Wills died at 1:05 p.m.

Survivors include his wife; daughters, Mrs. Caroline Johnson, Mrs. Dee Ann Arnold and Mrs. Cindy James, of Fort Worth; a son, James Robert Wills II of Norman, Oklahoma; three brothers and four sisters.

Funeral services and burial are to be in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Wills' best known song was "San Antonio Rose," but likely he will be best remembered for his "western swing," a distinctive sound his bands, regardless of the personnel, always achieved.

Wills gathered with members of his old Texas Playboys and was joined by Merle Haggard for a final recording session in Dallas in 1973.

"He apparently thought he was going to die soon and he wanted to do one more album," said Tommy Ailsup, Nashville record producer. "He was with us all day and gave his approval on all the things we recorded. We gave him a hand mike and got some 'Ahhhs' out of him. He hadn't been able to talk much because his right side was paralyzed."

Wills struggled to exhaustion through the five-hour session and then went home to Fort Worth where he suffered his second stroke.

The Texas Playboys who had gathered for a second recording session at Sunet Studios were about to tape "San Antonio Rose" and "Faded Love" when word came of his stroke. The music stopped and there wasn't a dry eye in the house.

That album, "Bob Wills and his Texas Playboys: For the Last Time," received a Wrangler Award from the National Cowboy Hall of Fame and Western Heritage Center in 1975.

Wills was joined on the record by three original Playboys, Leon McAuliffe, Smokey Dacus and Al Stricklin, who worked together in 1935, and later Wills musicians, including Johnny Gimble, Keith Coleman, Eldon Shamblin, Leon Rausch and Hoyle Nix.

It was said that when James Robert (Bob) Wills was a toddler his father, John Wills, spread the child's arms and proclaimed: "I'm going to make a fiddler out of this boy."

Bob Wills' father and grandfather were both champion fiddlers much in demand on the Texas Saturday night barn dance and social circuit. But Bob never owned a fiddle of his own until he was 18, had been away for two years, and worked as a lay preacher and in a zinc smelter.

In 1926 he married Betty Anderson and worked as a barber until 1929. His fiddle playing remained sporadic during the period and was confined mostly to area social events in Northwest Texas near his hometown of Turkey.

Four years ago, a memorial was erected to Bob Wills in Turkey, Texas, and for the past four years Bob Wills Day has been held on the last Saturday in April with a full range of activities for all the people who knew and loved Bob Wills and danced to his western swing music. Many in the area recall that "they never missed" one of Bob Wills' radio shows. Bob Wills and his renamed Texas Playboys made their base in Tulsa, Oklahoma and opened his own ballroom there.

## Farmers Urged To Attend FPC Hearing In Lubbock

Farmers from several states are expected to appear in Lubbock Thursday and Friday when a Federal Power Commission administrative law judge hears testimony on the FPC's recent decision to lower the priority for irrigation for natural gas.

Curtis L. Wagner, jr., who has been hearing technical testimony in Washington for the past few

weeks, has slated the proceedings to begin at 9:00 a.m. Thursday and Friday in the Federal Building. All the testimony to be presented will be from farmers who fear a lowering of priorities might mean a return to dryland crop production.

Many of those giving testimony are members of gas user associations that have been protesting the FPC's priority order.

John Aiken of Hereford, lawyer representing Plains Gas Users Association, and others are urging farmers to pack the Federal Building as a show of strength and concern for the priority change, even though not everyone will be giving testimony.

## Mayfield Wins State Class A Discus

Silverton High School sophomore Dayne Mayfield threw the discus the furthest he had ever thrown in competition last Friday to win the State Class A Discus championship. His distance was

156'4", a couple of feet further than the second-place participant managed.

Mayfield's best distance in the discus had been the 154'10" that he hurled the saucer at Springlake-Earth to set a new meet record earlier in the season.

The State Discus Championship returns to Silverton for the first time since Marvin Self captured the event in 1972 as a senior with a career best throw of 176'9". Self also won the Shot Put that year with 58'3½". The state record in the discus is over 186'.

"It really surprised me to win," Mayfield said. "I was the most nervous I've ever been at a meet but I was ahead all the way. I got my best on my fourth throw."

"I liked the humidity because you can throw better in it. The heavier air seems to keep the discus up longer."

"I didn't even consider winning the state championship at the beginning of the season."

"I knew he had a chance after I got down here and saw the competition," said Coach Weldon McCord. "He'd been hitting around 160' in practice."

Mayfield and his coach were accompanied to Austin by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Wayne Mayfield.

Mayfield also placed fourth in the shot at regional this year. In 1970, as a sophomore, Marvin Self won second in the shot and fourth in the discus at regional. As a junior, Self won third in the state shot put and won the state discus championship with 172'.
