USE PASTURES WISELY
Summer annual pastures can aged properly, says a forage specialist for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. The important factor is to use adequate amounts of fertilizer. Although it is best
to follow soil test recommendato follow soil test recommenda-
tions, at least 60 pounds of nitrotions, at least 60 pounds of nitro-
gen should be used at each fertilizer application. Proper use of the forage is important when it is growing rapidly. Part of the pas-
true can be fenced to permit hartrue can be fenced to permit har-
vesting of hay. Following grazing of most leaves, stallks should be shredded and nitrogen fertilizer applied to stimulate new growth.
