Dr. Art Onken, TAES soil chemist, is studying the best combination of nitrogen fertilizer with phosphorus. Nutrient uptake by

To farmers growing crops other than funflowers, this amounts to an undesirable weed infestation. Abernathy is checking on a num-
ber of herbicides, applied both pre-plant and pre-emergence to preplemine the most effective ma-
