





A petition has been circulated among the patrons of the four rurtl routes leading out of Haskell protesting against the consolidation of these four routes into two. It is learned that every patron of all four routes signed it. The petition sets forth that it would be impossible for two men to handle all four routes, and leave here after the arrival of the 9 o'clock morning train, a n d arrive back here before the 6:45 evening train leaves, on account of the condi-

tion of the roads. The schedule time for rural carriers to leave Haskell is 10 a. m., but more often they leave at 11:30 a. m. on account of late train or FOR SHERIFF heavy mail. In order to catch the evening train they must get back before 6 p. m. A rural carrier is nothing less than a traveling postoffice. He must sell stamps, money orders, register and deliver registered letters, insured and c. o. d. packages, which of course takes up much of his time.

Haskell at best has mail twice a day, but this does reach those on rural routes the same day, which is doubtful should two men undertake to carry all four routes.

This is how Postmaster General Busleson's economy plan will work at Haskell, and judging from our FOR PUBLIC WEIGHER, Prec, 1 exchanges it will work equally as bad everywhere else. This is economy that will impair the efficiency of the rural service, yet Mr. Burleson some time ago recommended to Congress that the salaries of the first, second, third and fourth assistant postmaster generals be FOR COMMISSIONER Prec. 4 raised from \$5000 to \$7500 per year.

Here's hoping some arrangements w.ll be made for sprinkling the streets this spring.

## **Motor Rural** Carrier Examination

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced an examination for the County of Haskell, to be held at Stam ford on March 11, 1916 to fill the position of motor rural carriers at Haskell and vacancies that may later occur on rural routes from post offices in the abovementioned county. The salary on motor routes ranges from \$1,500 to \$1,800 per annum. The examination will be open only to male citizens who a r e actually domiciled in the territory supplied with mail by a post office in the county and who meet the other requirements set forth in Forms 2121 and 1977. Form 2121 may be seen posted at any post office in the county for which the examination is held, and Form 1977 and application blanks may be obtained from the offices at which the vacancy exists and where the examination is to be held, or from the United States 8 Civil Service Commission at Washington, D. C. The appointee to this position will be required to furnish, maintain, and operate a modern motor vehicle with a carrying capacity of not less than 800 pounds and a cubic capacity of not less than 80 feet. Applicants must file with their applications a statement of the equipment they will be able to provide in the event of appointment. Applications should be forwarded to the Commission at Washington, D. C., at the earliest practicable date.
