Swisher Electric Cooperative, organized September 30, 1939, operates more than 2,600 miles of lines in its system at an investment of over \$9,500,000. It has 5,810 meters in five counties. Average investment per meter is approximately \$1,635.

Repayment record of REA electric borrowers is excellent. As of January 1974, electric borrowers had paid more than \$4.2 billion on their loans; \$2.5 billion repaid on principal as due, \$213.5 million of principal paid ahead of schedule, and \$1.5 billion in interest to the U.S. Treasury. Only two loans have been foreclosed in the total amount of \$44,478 in principal and interest, and these occurred over 25 years ago.
