





Q. What are some of the char acteristics of a good breeding bull not necessarily required for good beef cattle?

A. Most notable characteristics for breeding bulls not necessary in beef cattle include: a masculine appearance, breed markings, constitution and a good weight-to-age

CONSTITUTION — Usually described as the positive tendency of an animal to perform well and survive during advanced age. Physical characteristics indicative of a good constitution are full development of the forequarters, wide-open and broad nostrils, strong straight back and good body width and depth.

MASCULINITY - Evidenced by the appearance of the bull. General features to look for are a full neck, strong horns (when this is a breed characteristic), full forehead with good development of chest and shoulders.


