Large Ball Park **About Completed**

Haskell will have one of the best ball parks in this part of the state, and if the plans and hopes of the manager of the Haskell Baseball Association are realized, Haskell will also have the leading ball team.

The park is being erected on the block just east of the Banks Wagon Yard on the ground formerly used as a cotton yard. It is 300x 325 feet, will be entirely surrounded by a high plank wall. The grandstand will be 70 feet long, and built to accomodate a large crowd:







An Ordinance

An ordinance levying taxes and providing for the assessment and collection of the same, in and for the City of Haskell, Texas, for the year 1916.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Haskell:-That the following taxes be and are hereby levied for the year 1916 upon each one hundred dollars valuation of property subject to taxation in said City of Haskell for said year:

For General purposes, Twentytive cents, fifteen cents of which together with all poll tax to be placed to the credit of the New General fund and ten cents together with all occupation tax to be placed to the credit of the

Old General Fund. For Street and Bridges, fit-

teen cents. For interest and sinking fund for Street Improvement Bonds, \$4,500.00 three and one-quarter cents.

For interest and sinking fund for sewerage bonds, \$6,000.00, four and one-half cents. For interest and sinking fund for Water-Works Bonds, \$19,000 fourteen and three-quarter cents. For interest and sinking fund for Water-Works Extension Bonds, \$3,500.00, two and onehalf cents. That there be and is hereby evied a poll tax of one dollar as provided in Article 489. Revised Statutes, 1895, upon all persons therein named, and when collected, shall be placed to the credit of the New General fund. That there be and is hereby levied an occupation tax of onehalf of that levied by the State, upon all persons, firms and corporations following taxable occupations in the City of Haskell, Texas. The taxes herein levied shall be assessed by the assessor, and the Gollector shall collect the same, and pay same over to the Treasurer as required by law, and the Treasurer shall place same to the credit of the respective funds and purposes herein mentioned.

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
The City Council Holds an Interesting Meeting The City Council met in regu-

lar session Thursday, and in connection with their regular routine of work, the question of making Haskell a cleaner and more sanitary town was thoroughly discussed. An Ordinance making it an offence to spit upon the sidewalks or the stairways in the city of Haskell was passed, and the Marshall was instructed to strictly enforce same. If you will investigate the filthy condition of the sidewalks and stairways on the north side of our public square you will see at once the necessity of such an ordinance. The spring and summer months being upon us, the time of weeds and other obnoxious growths, the City Council have purchased a weed mower which they expect to use upon their streets and alleys and the co-operation of the citizens are requested to see that their vacant lots and premises are kept free from weeds and other obnoxious growths that will marr the beauty of Haskell.

The City Health Officer was present and discussed thoroughly the sanitary condition of the town. On account of the unsanitary condition of so many hog pens in the city limits he thought it advisable for the City Council to pass an Ordinance eliminating the hogs from the city limits. In his remarks stated that the accepted theory is that the much dreaded disease of Pelegra is caused from the unsanitary conditions of the hog pen and he thinks it advisable for the citizens of Haskell to begin in time to prevent the spread of this disease in Haskell. The hog pen is the breeder of flies and the germs of Typhoid fever and blood poison.

This ordinance will come before the City Council at their regular meeting in June and he asks for the co-operation and the views of the people of the town in eliminating these unsanitary conditions.

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
