Large Ball Park About Completed

Haskell will have one of the best ball parks in this part of the state, and if the plans and hopes of the manager of the Haskell Baseball Association are realized, Haskell will also have the leading ball team.

The park is being erected on the block just east of the Banks Wagon Yard on the ground formerly used as a cotton yard. It is 300x325 feet, will be entirely surrounded by a high plank wall. The grandstand will be 70 feet long, and built to accommodate a large crowd.

The Haskell Baseball Association is composed of twelve of the leading business men of Haskell, with J. M. White as manager of the ball team.

Ball players will begin practise the first of next week, and will work one hour each morning and two hours each evening, and hope to have the first game the following Saturday evening.

An Ordinance

An ordinance levying taxes and providing for the assessment and collection of the same, in and for the City of Haskell, Texas, for the year 1916.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Haskell: That the following taxes be and are hereby levied for the year 1916 upon each one hundred dollars valuation of property subject to taxation in said City of Haskell for said year:

For General purposes, Twenty-five cents, fifteen cents of which together with all poll tax to be placed to the credit of the New General fund and ten cents together with all occupation tax to be placed to the credit of the Old General Fund.

For Street and Bridges, fifteen cents.

For interest and sinking fund for Street Improvement Bonds, \$4,500.00 three and one-quarter cents.

For interest and sinking fund for sewerage bonds, \$6,000.00, four and one-half cents.

For interest and sinking fund for Water-Works Bonds, \$19,000 fourteen and three-quarter cents.

For interest and sinking fund for Water-Works Extension Bonds, \$3,500.00, two and one-half cents.

That there be and is hereby levied a poll tax of one dollar as provided in Article 489. Revised Statutes, 1895, upon all persons therein named, and when collected, shall be placed to the credit of the New General fund.

That there be and is hereby levied an occupation tax of one-half of that levied by the State, upon all persons, firms and corporations following taxable occupations in the City of Haskell, Texas.

The taxes herein levied shall be assessed by the assessor, and the Collector shall collect the same, and pay same over to the Treasurer as required by law, and the Treasurer shall place same to the credit of the respective funds and purposes herein mentioned.

The rule calling for a second and third reading of an ordinance is hereby suspended and waived, and this ordinance shall be of force and effect from and after its passage.

Passed by the following vote: Yeas: K. D. Simmons, J. J. Guest, N. McNeill, J. L. Robertson, and H. M. Rike. Nays: None.

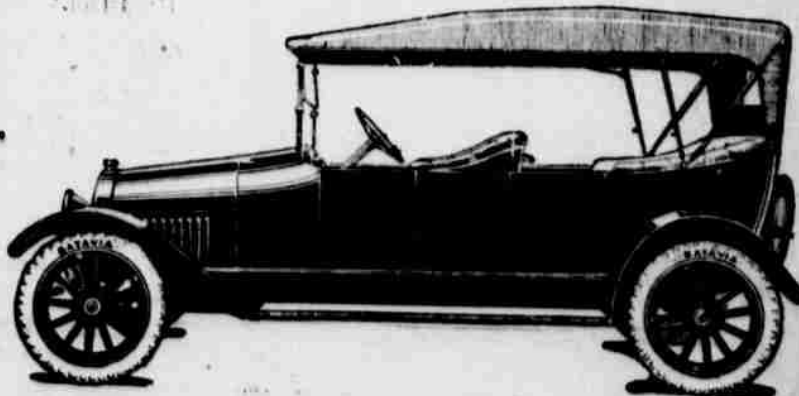

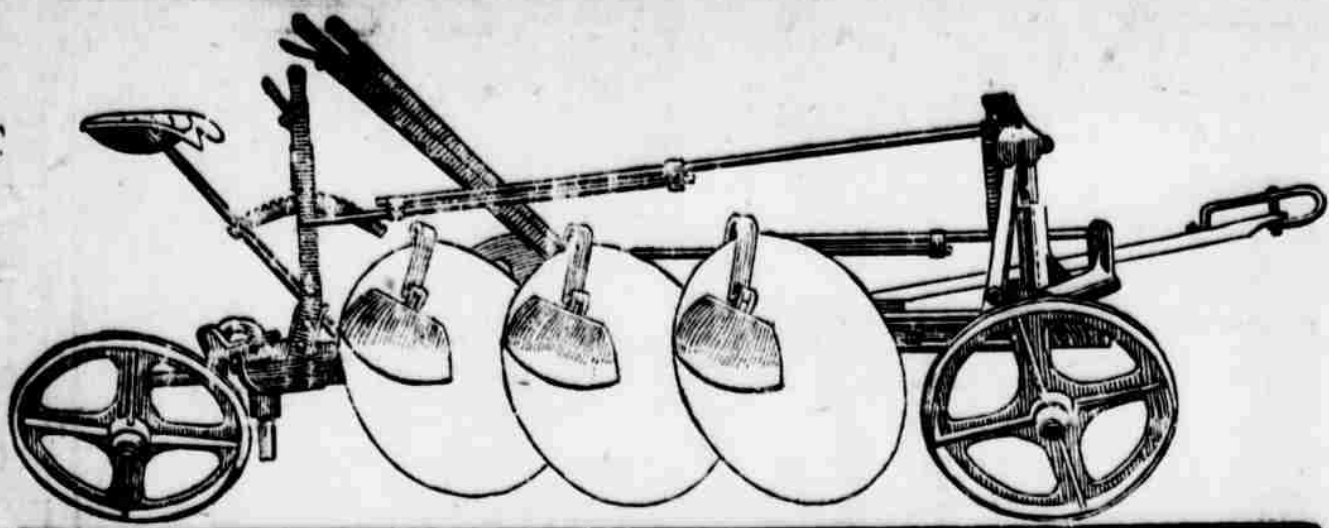

Mrs. J. U. Fields Address at Federated Club Meeting

The following address was given by Mrs. J. U. Fields of this city, at the meeting of the Federated Clubs at Seymour last week.

"Our meeting here together in this good fellowship of friends and co-workers is one of the very delightful results of Club Federation. Had we each been content to live our own little life, in our own little town, we should miss this great wave of thrilling joy that fills and overflows our heart tonight, as we greet each other as sister club women of this great First District. It is something of that feeling which makes the world akin. We are glad to see so many new faces, and most heartily we bid you welcome. And it warm our hearts with untold pleasure to see again these dear familiar ones. It is especially gratifying to us all, I am sure, to see so many men—handsome men. We are glad to have you here, glad that you want

to know what we are doing and glad to be able to tell you all about it. We are not like you Lodge men who hold your meeting behind closed doors, the pass word with us is only a smile and a "how do you do." When you did us the honor, you gentlemen, to invite us here, we were quick to accept the invitation. We had heard of the courtesy and chivalry of the Seymour men, of your interest, helpful interest in women's clubs. We believed all we had heard. We had the perfect faith of the old preacher.

There was an old preacher once who told some boys about the Bible lesson he was going to read in the morning. The boys finding the place, glued together the connecting pages. The next morning he read on the bottom of one page: "When Noah was one hundred and twenty years old, he took unto himself a wife who was"—then

turning the page, "one hundred and forty cubits long, forty cubits wide, built of gopher wood, and covered with pitch inside and out. He was naturally puzzled at this. He read it again, verified it, and then said: "My friends this is the first time I ever met this in the Bible, but I accept it as an evidence to the assertion that we are fearfully and wonderfully made." Now we know our faith was not misplaced and that our lives have fallen in a goodly place.

And this brings me to the subject much on my heart, our neglect of man. Has it ever occurred to you, fellow club women, that we have discussed, argued and relegated each to its proper place, household economies, social service better babies, child labor, civic beauty, juvenile courts, rural club, social centers, dress reform, child welfare, compulsory education, prevention of crime, traveling libraries, rest rooms, the peace movement, conservation, and the woman question. We've studied Ibsen, Suderman, Masterlinch, Dante and Goethe. Shakespeare we've worn to a thread, all the issues and cults have been handled with care, but—Man, his rights and his place in the universe, we have overlooked. And yet, what an interesting study it would make—"The psychology of the club husband." The subject begins to loom larger in my mind. Is it not he who makes these gatherings possible? Does he not send us away in best gown and furbelow, proud and happy that he can? Does he not await our homecoming, feasting his soul on each little incident that delighted us? Oh, the beautiful unselfishness of the Club Husband. How willingly he stays at home, puts the little ones to bed and walks the floors an hour or two with the fretful baby, and wife is down at the club room giving a talk on "The pursuit of happiness." And Oh, his infinite patience. Does he not go without dinner and supperless to bed while wife writes a paper on "The Value of Food to Nourish the Body," and how uncomplainingly he uses safety pins on buttonless trousers, and frantically searches for a clean collar while wife is lecturing on "The Beautiful Service of Home Making." In the last analysis it is man who keeps women's clubs going. For one time he is the power behind the throne. Some day I know a poet shall rise to sing the praises of the Club Husband, his many virtues, his untiring patience, his supreme unselfishness
