THE CAUSE AND PREVEN.
TION OF BLACK LEG
Mr. W. H. Parks, a close ob erver and practical cattle raiser of Plemons, Texas, has written an alticle to a leading farm paopinion and gives some practical experiments to show that the heel tly causes the black leg. Having studied this trouble some tly for thirty years from nature, more than from books, I am prepared to endorse his opin ion, which 1 wish to emphasiz in this article and g.
sons for so believing.
In the first place we must be convinced of such a tly and know its true history before we can take intelligent steps to combat its ravages. Much to do is being made about the tick and its erad ication, which is all well enough but the heel-tly is by far the mos destructive pest. A tick remains on a cow a rew days only whil the larvae of the heel-fly remain under the hide of a cow for ten twelve months. The tick is comparatively local, the heel-fly is
