## Application Being Accepted By PO For Automotive Mech.

The Dallas Postal Service is now accepting applications for the position of Automotive Mechanic in the Dallas, Texas Post Office.

All applicants will be required to take a written examination designed to test aptitude for learning and performing duties of the position. This examination is being given to establish a register of eligibles from which future automotive mechanic vacancies in the Dallas Post Office will be filled.

The automotive mechanic diagnosis mechanical and operating difficulties of vehicles, repairs defects, replaces worn or broken parts. He adjusts and tunes-up engines, cleans fuel pumps, carburetors, and radiators; regulates timing, and makes other necessary adjustments to maintain in proper operating condition trucks that are in service. In addition he may perform other mechanical and automotive electrical repairs as required.

The automotive mechanic position requires driving and road testing of vehicles before and after repairs. Applicants must have a safe driving record. A valid drivers license from the state in which the post office is located must be presented at the time of appointment.

Applicants must have reached their eighteenth birthday on the date of filing application. This age limit does not apply to persons entitled to veteran preference. There is no maximum age limit.

All applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, color, national origin, sex, political affiliation or other non-merit factors.

The Postal Service offers a starting salary of \$9,059.00 per year for the automotive mechanic position, along with retirement, sick leave with pay, low cost health and life insurance and promotional opportunities.

Applications must be made in person at Window No. 30 located on the first floor of the Main Post Office, Bryan & Ervay Sts., Dallas, Tx., Monday through Friday, 8 a. m. to 3 p. m. (only).
