Student Council, serving as president during his senior year. National Honor Society, Future Farmers of

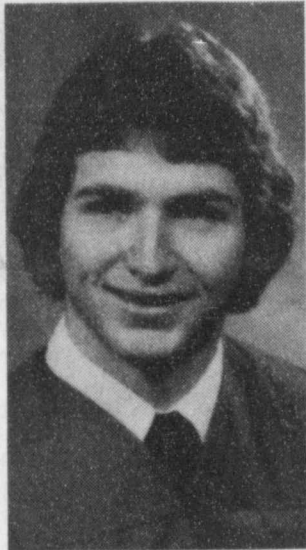
America, Future Teachers, Allied Youth, and other extra curricular events. In Sports, he has participated in

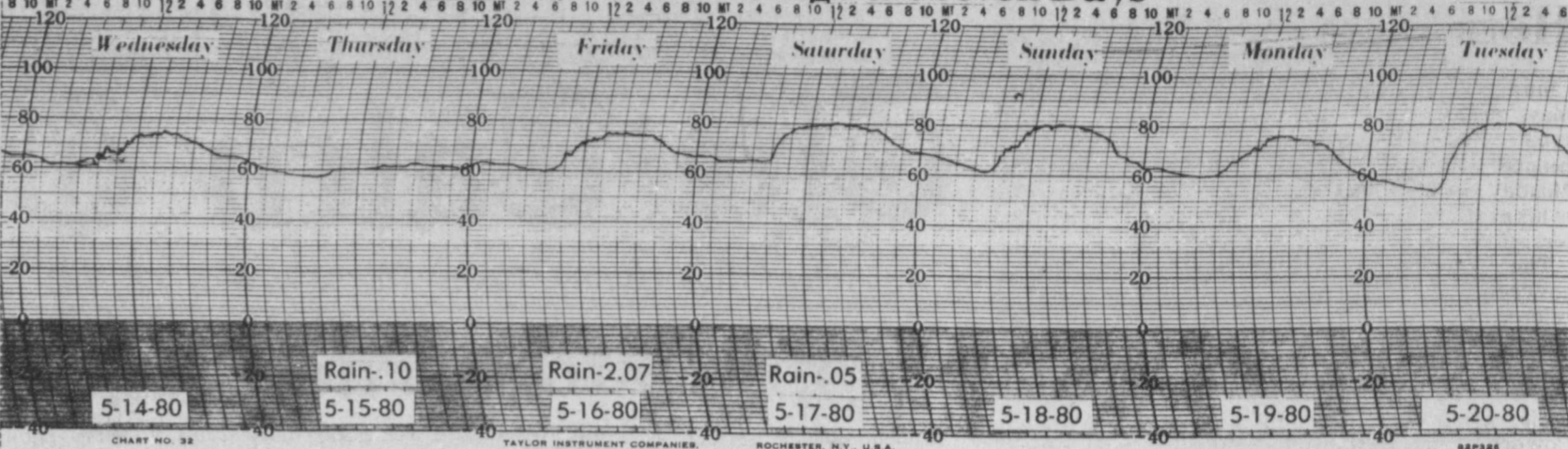
