Dave Roeber Crusade Comes To Rivercrest Nov. 23

The Dave Roeber Crusade, Tragedy To Triumph, will be presented at Rivercrest High School on Wednesday, November 23 in the auditorium at 10 a.m. The crusade will be presented at the Titus County Civic Center at 7 p.m. on November 23.

Dave Roeber was wounded on July 26, 1969 in Viet Nam, suffering third degree burns over 40 percent of his body. He was holding a phosphorous grenade when a sniper's bullet caused it to explode, the grenade was six inches from his face. By the time he reached Saigon, he had lost fingers, his nose, his right ear and he was blind in his right eye.

When Dave was still in the hospital, the doctors thought that his vocal cords had been burned and that he'd never speak, but they were wrong.

They thought he'd be blind in his right eye because his cornea was badly scarred, but today he has 20-20 vision. He has suffered through 13 major surgeries during which a team of doctors worked to put him back together.

Today, as an ordained minister, Dave speaks to teenagers around the country, telling them that faith can pull you through anything. He always says the real miracle is his wife's love for him.

So far in the 1987-88 school year, Dave has spoken to 179,275 students in 124 high schools in 16 states.

He has spoken to 2,470,275 students since 1976 in 50 states.

Admission to the crusade is free and everyone is invited.

Ample Supply Of Yule Trees Seen

Consumers should find an ample supply of Texas-grown Christmas trees at local markets this season.

Dr. Michael Walterscheidt, forestry specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service said that last year's number of 650,000 will compare with 565,000 trees that were produced in the Lone Star State and marketed last season.

The estimated value of the crop to Texas producers is around \$8 million, and the economic impact on the state is more than \$25 million, he said.

The crop of Texas-grown Yule trees is "coming into its own" some 20 years after extension service specialists conducted many demonstrations in East Texas to select best adapted trees and study and recommend cultural practices, said Jim Chandler of Overton. The demonstration work began in the early 1970's, he said.

This season some 193 tree farms in 73 Texas counties will have Christmas trees for sale.

Both Virginia and Afghan pine trees are grown for the Christmas market in Texas, the foresters said.

They said Virginia pine trees are grown primarily in the eastern half of Texas, and the Afghan pine in the more alkalien soils of Western Texas, with interstate Highway 35 serving as the basic boundary line.

The majority of Texas Christmas tree growers have choose-and-cut operations, where families can inspect, select and cut their own trees to assure freshness and the exact size and shape desired, the foresters said.

The Extension foresters said about 50 percent of the Texas-grown Yule trees will be offered wholesale, about 44 percent will be choose-and-cut and the remaining six percent will be offered in retail lots operated by the tree farmers.

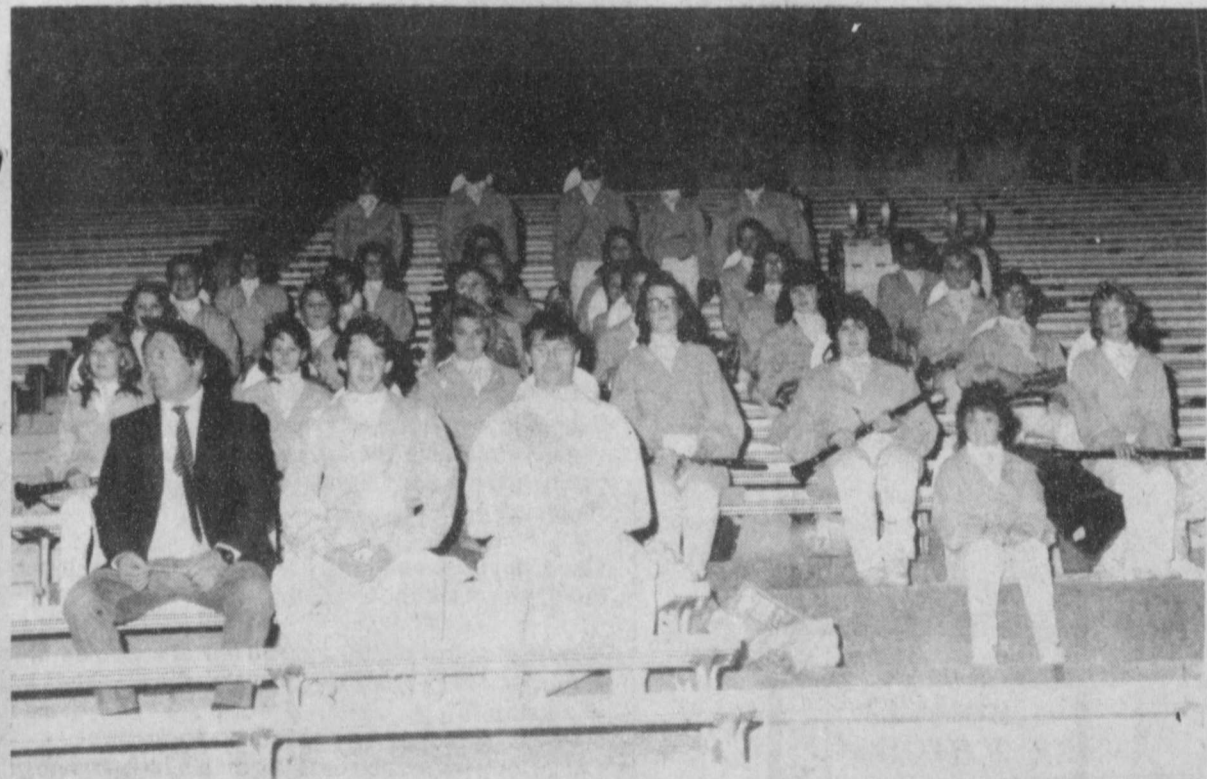
First Turkey Shoot Is Huge Success

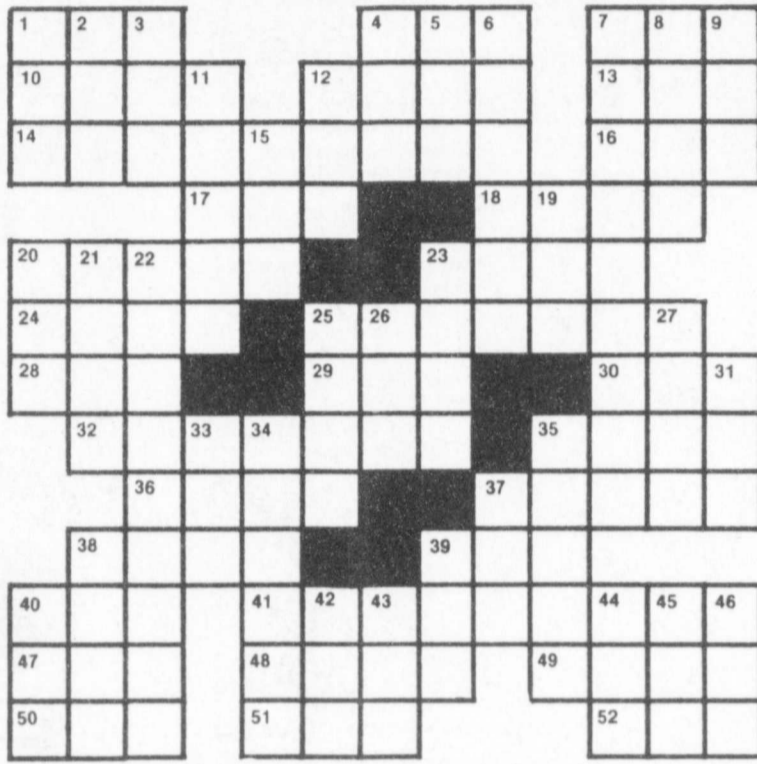

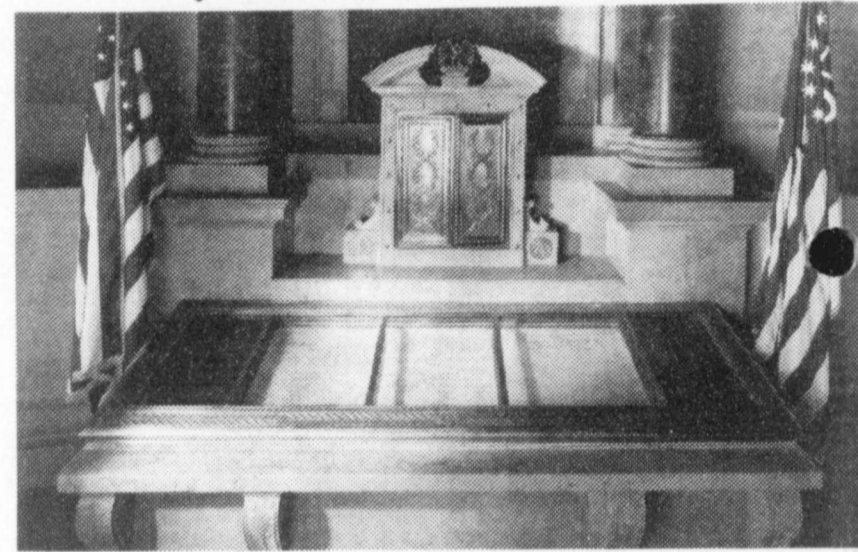

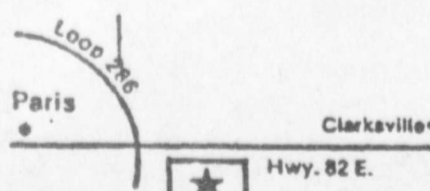

Contel Turns On Lights For Safety

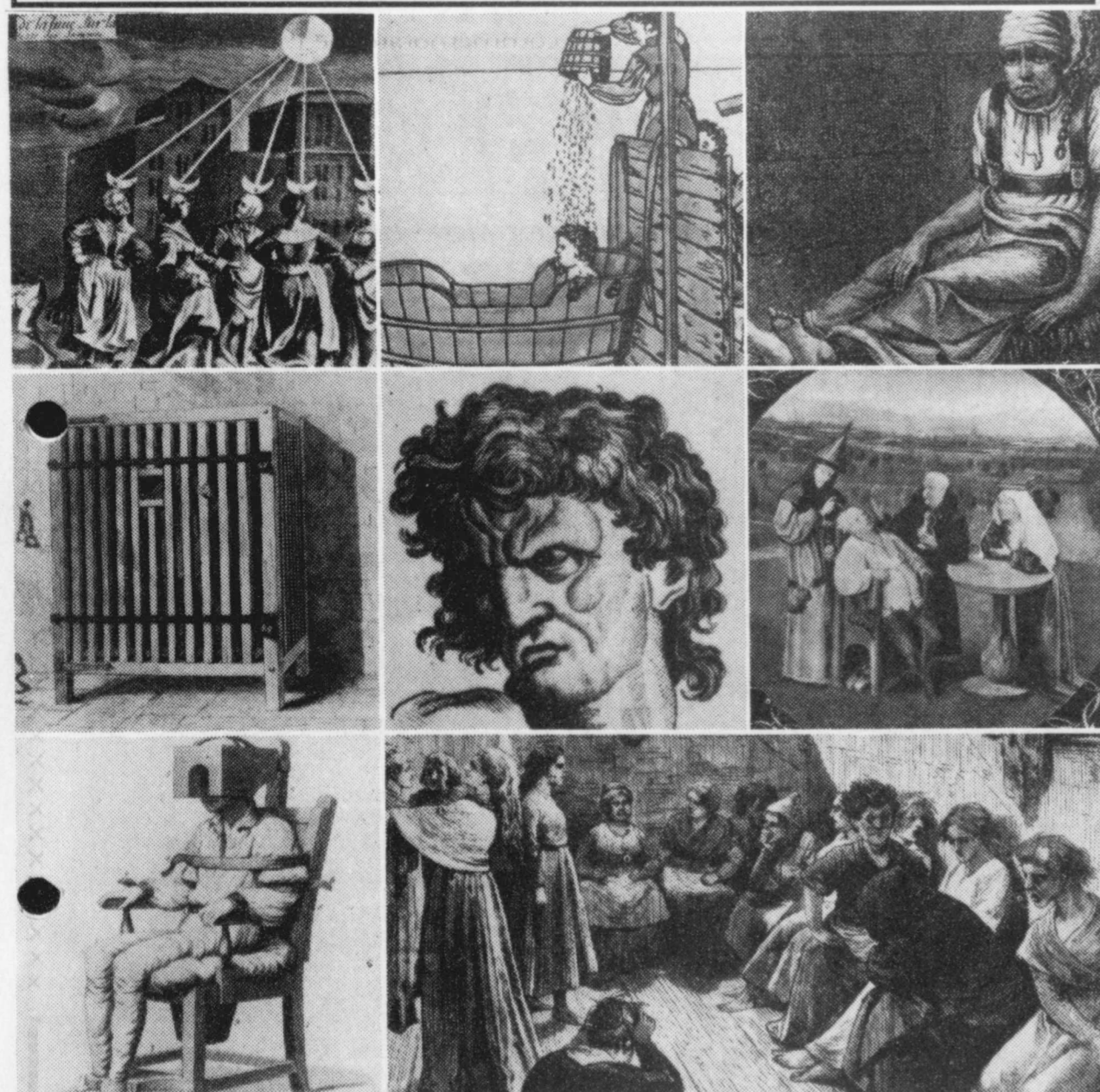

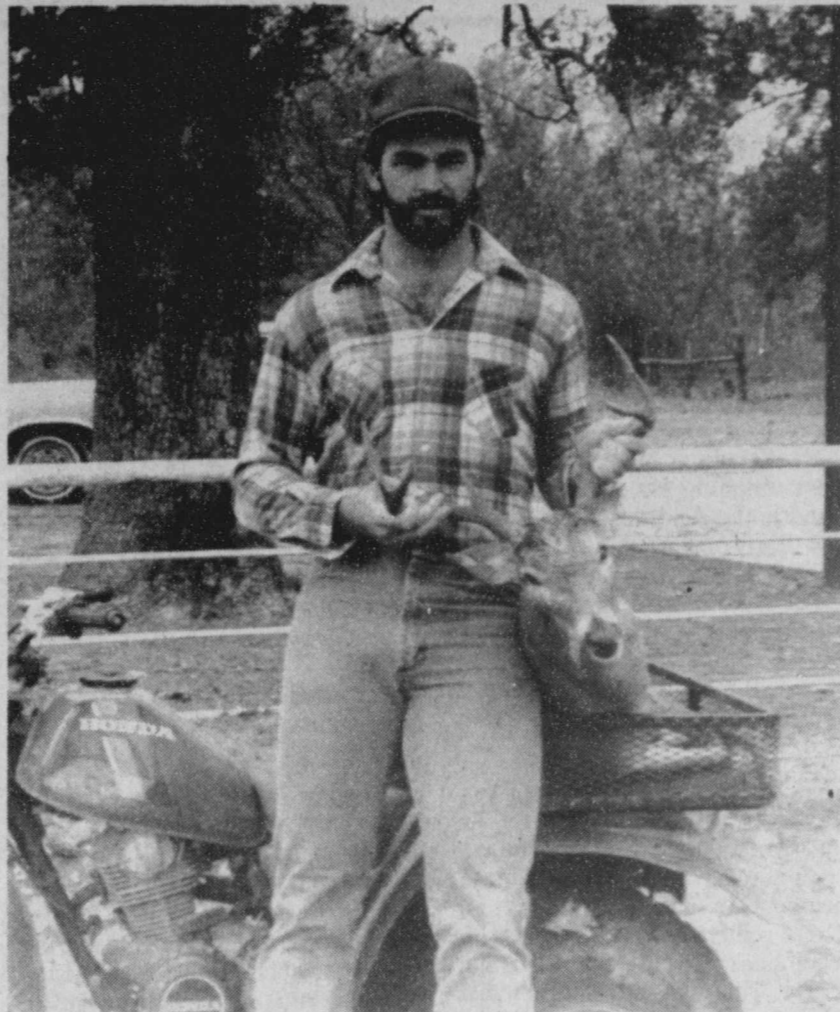

Proposals Could Provide Incentive For Oil & Gas Industry

State Comptroller Bob Bullock said Monday that a new proposal by Railroad Commissioner John Sharp to provide tax credits for enhanced oil recovery projects could provide important incentives for the state's oil and gas industry.

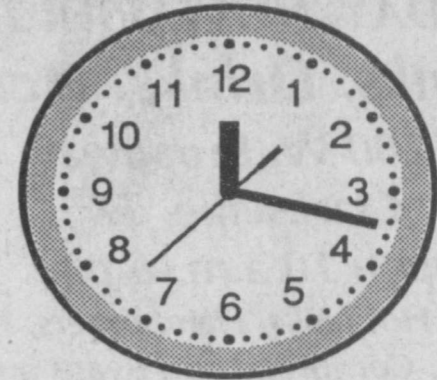
"I feel this proposal is the best we've seen, or are likely to see," Bullock said.

Commissioner Sharp's proposal would provide a credit against the state's oil severance tax for producers undertaking EOR projects, projects designed to produce more oil from wells and reservoirs that are near the end of their production under conventional methods.

Bullock said that Sharp's proposal would definitely produce incentives for EOR projects. These incentives are particularly important in a mature oil-producing state like Texas, where much future production will come from expensive enhanced recovery methods, rather than cheaper primary production.

Bullock noted that Commissioner Sharp's proposal would cost the state less in tax revenue than any other proposed oil and gas incentive he's seen.

"And if new EOR projects begin because of this proposal, the tax loss could easily turn into tax gains for Texas," Bullock said.

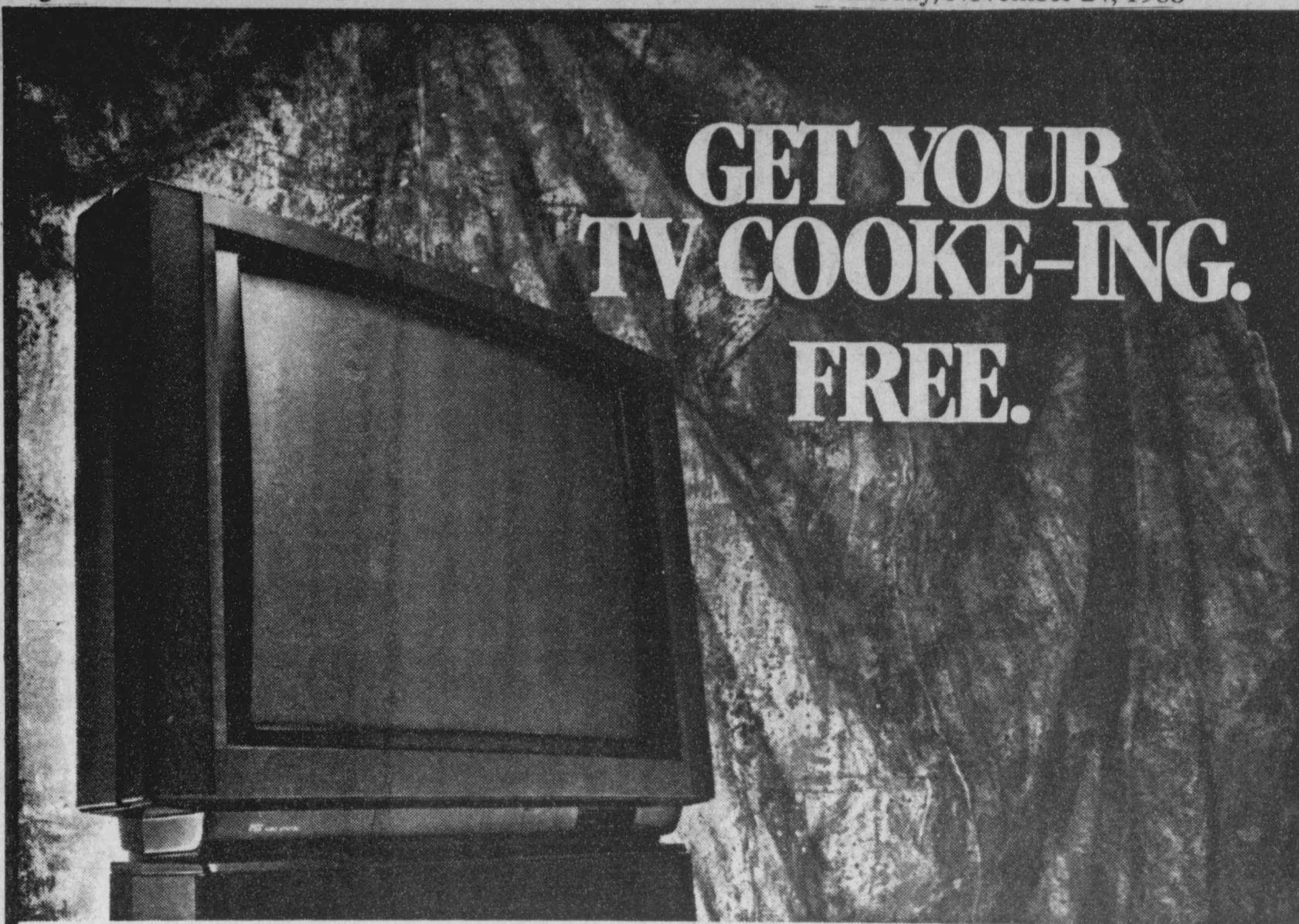
