What expressions?...the common, every-day ones that most folks use that have a Bibical ori-

Give some thought to this...there are numerous expressions whose roots are in the Bible.

"As Old as Methusala" is one of the most common. In the Bible, the gentlemen reached an advanced age of several hundred years, and is usually applied now to someone or something that has "always" been around.

Anotherone is "Who's going to cast the first stone" It's a pretty effective way of asking who has he right to judge.

Need more? Perhaps one of the most familiar of all is the term "Prodigal Son". "He's something of a prodigal son, or you'd have thought he was the prodigal son" being two of the ways it's used.

"It's paradise" or "It's truly the land of milk and honey" comes from the Bible, as does "Lilies of the field" . Remember "Consider the lilies of the field, they toil not, neither do they spin". The expression usually is applied to someone who is lazy or has an unenergetic attitude.

Being a Good Samaritan takes it's origin from one of the parables of Jesus, and is applied, naturally, to someone who is willing to help others. The story of the Bibical good Samaritan is probably one of the best loved and best known parables of all.

Faith is described by the "grain of mustard seed" and "salt has lost it's flavor" comes directly from the Bible.

So does "hiding your light under a bushel" used to admonish people for being overly modest or shy.

Someone who is patient and willing to wait is described as "Having the patience of Job" and people who spend to much of their time looking into the past are accused of being "Like Lot's wife" or "If you look back one more time you're going to turn into a pillar of salt".

And what is the most-used? What do most of us say when we hear some with which we heartily

Why "Amen to that" of course! There are many more of these expressions, and just as an exercise, why not try to think of a few of them. Their abundance may surprise you!

## Yields Affected By Ice

Wheat has received another winter setback with the last round of sleet and freezing rain. It is a safe assumption that wheat yields have been affected downward by the severe cold weather three weeks ago and perhaps by the more recent spell. The extent of the damage will not be fully known until harvest time in many instances. It has ben noticed that the cold weather killed some of the young tillers in some fields. This, of course, means that there are fewer stalks to produce grain heads. Also, it is quite possible that some heads were damaged n the more advanced wheat.

Freeze damage in what is directly dependent on the planting date, fertilization and amount of lush growth at the time of the freeze. Fields that have shown the most freeze damage are those fields that were planted early, fertilized heavy and had lots of top growth.

Dr. Travis Miller, Agronomist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, reports that half of the yield comes from the main tiller. Another "thumb rule" is that one needs from 40 to 45 heads per square foot to

produce acceptable yields. There is a good chance that disease problems will surface when weather conditions become favorable for diseases to develop. In order for a disease to develop there are three things that must occur. If anyone of the three are not present, then a disease will not occur. These three are host, pathogen and environment. We have the host in wheat plant. We have had leaf rust scattered in wheat throughout the fall and winter, so we won't have to depend upon the wind currents to bring the fungi into our area from wheat producing areas to the south.

What are the environmental conditions favorable for leaf rust development? The critical minimum temperature for development of the leaf

rust fungi is 50 degrees fahrenheit. Infection will occur in six hours if there is free moisture present and the temperature is 50 degrees or higher. Free moisture could be dew, shower

The conditions necessary for stripe rust are quite similar to that of leaf rust except that stripe rust prefers cooler weather than does leaf rust. The spring of 1988 was a much cooler spring than normal and the stripe rust epidemic lasted much longer than expected because of that situation.

Septoria leaf blotch is another serious leaf disease problem in our area of the state that other areas does not have to deal with. Seldom do we just have a septoria problem without either leaf or stripe rust. It does reduce yields and in 1988 demonstration work conducted in Lamar County we obtained a five bushel increase where fungicides were applied to control septoria.

The decision to use or not to use a fungicide is one that each producer must make. Producers should take into account the yield potential of their wheat, the wheat price situation and the disease pressure. We have generally thought that one should have a yield potential of 40 bushels er acre before the application of a fungicide would pay. However, that scenario may not necessarily be accurate with the market price prospects higher than in previous years.

# Chad Dodd Receives Award USDA Campaign Alerts Farmers To Compliance Needs

Farmers and ranchers who do not yet have the conservation plans they need under the 1985 Farm Bill can expect a letter from the USDA's Soil Conservation Service reminding them of the December 31, 1989 deadline. The letter will come with a new brochure, "Make Your Move Now", which is the centerpiece of a nationwide information campaign. As of the end of October, 1988, 53% of the required conservation plans had been developed nationwide.

Under the law's conservation compliance provisions, producers and landowners with highly erodible land who want to stay eligible for certain USDA program benefits must develop a conservation plan and have it approved by the local conservation district. USDA benefits affected include prce and income support payments, Farmers Home Administration loans, crop insurance and disaster payments. Loss of benefits applies to all land a person farms, including that under partnership, not just the highly erodible fieldds.

The letters are the leading element of a campaign that also includes posters, brochures, public service announcements and media stories. All the campaign pieces incorporate the theme "Make Your Move Now: Stay Eligible for USDA Programs."
