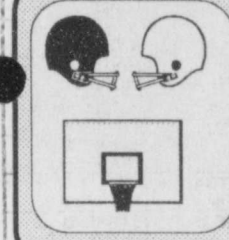

### Rebels Win Three Against Chisum

The Rivercrest teams took the court Friday night, January 25, against the Chisum Mustangs at Rivercrest, with three victories.

The Rebel JV started out the trio of wins. The first quarter of play was not what they expected, as at the end, the JV was tied with Chisum 12-12. The second quarter was improving but Rivercrest became overly anxious and received a technical foul for too many men on the court. Ending half-time score was Rebels in the lead 31-27.

Team members at halftime finally got things going their way. Brandon Williams had several good plays and assists. The third quarter found the Rebels leading the Mustangs 50-40.

The last quarter put the finishing touches on the Mustangs, as the Rebel defense defeated them 76-54.

The Lady Rebels emerged victorious over the Lady Mustangs 66-37. Coach Velinda Arbuckle's ladies went into the game with a district record of 3-2.

In the first quarter, the charge was led by Krista Weatherall who scored 13 points, consisting of two treys.

Kristie Eudy had eight from the wing position. The Lady Rebels ended the first quarter ahead 26-7. Second quarter was much the same, as the Lady Rebels kept control of the ball and outscored the Lady Mustangs by four. At halftime, Rivercrest led Chisum 37-14.

Coming back from halftime, the pace was much slower as each team had only 10 points.

Going into the final quarter, Weatherall hit a three pointer and had several steals as the momentum picked up. Stealing the ball by Jerilyn Russell, Lana Pirtle and other team members seemed easy as they threw baseball passes to Krista, who was somehow underneath the Lady Mustang goal for either a lay up or a jump shot.

High scorer for the Lady Rebels was Krista Weatherall with 23, Kristie Eudy 12 and Katy Ross 10. The Lady Mustangs were led by Lalonna Howard 12, Julie Barnett 10 and Misti Shugart 9.

Coach Wake Wood's Rebels district record going into the Chisum

game was 3-2. The first period of play kept everyone on the edge of their seats with a score here and one there. With :02 left, senior Galen Logan popped the net to give the Rebels the lead by two points at the end of the first quarter.

The second quarter was more exciting as Dean Tiffie hit a couple of treys for the Rebels. The defense was just outstanding as they played with great assists to the open man. The Rebels had only two fouls in the first half of play, and repeatedly scored. With the halftime score, the Rebels led 32-19.

Third quarter the Rebels could do nothing wrong, as they found teammates under the goal with great passing accuracy to outscore the Mustangs by 9 points in the quarter, leading the Mustangs 56-32.

Rivercrest closed the game against Chisum 77-52.

### Immunization Clinic Scheduled

The Texas Department of Health, Public Health Region 7 office announced plans for the continuation of a series of monthly immunization clinics for all children needing immunizations, who meet the required family income determination guidelines.

The clinic will be conducted at 1014 N. Jefferson in Mt. Pleasant on February 6 from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. and from 1 to 3 p.m. Future clinics will be held on the first and third Wednesday of each month.

The Health Department emphasizes that this clinic is available to all preschool and school age children who meet the family income guidelines, beginning at two months of age. Immunizations to be offered include Measles/Mumps/Rubella, Oral Polio, Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis and Tetanus/diphtheria. The Haemophilus Influenzae type b vaccine is also available to medically eligible children between the ages of 18 months and 60 months. All children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Parents are reminded to bring the child's immunization record and Social Security number if available. The Tetanus/diphtheria vaccine is available to medically eligible adults. Should the parent or legal guardian have questions, please contact the above listed field office.

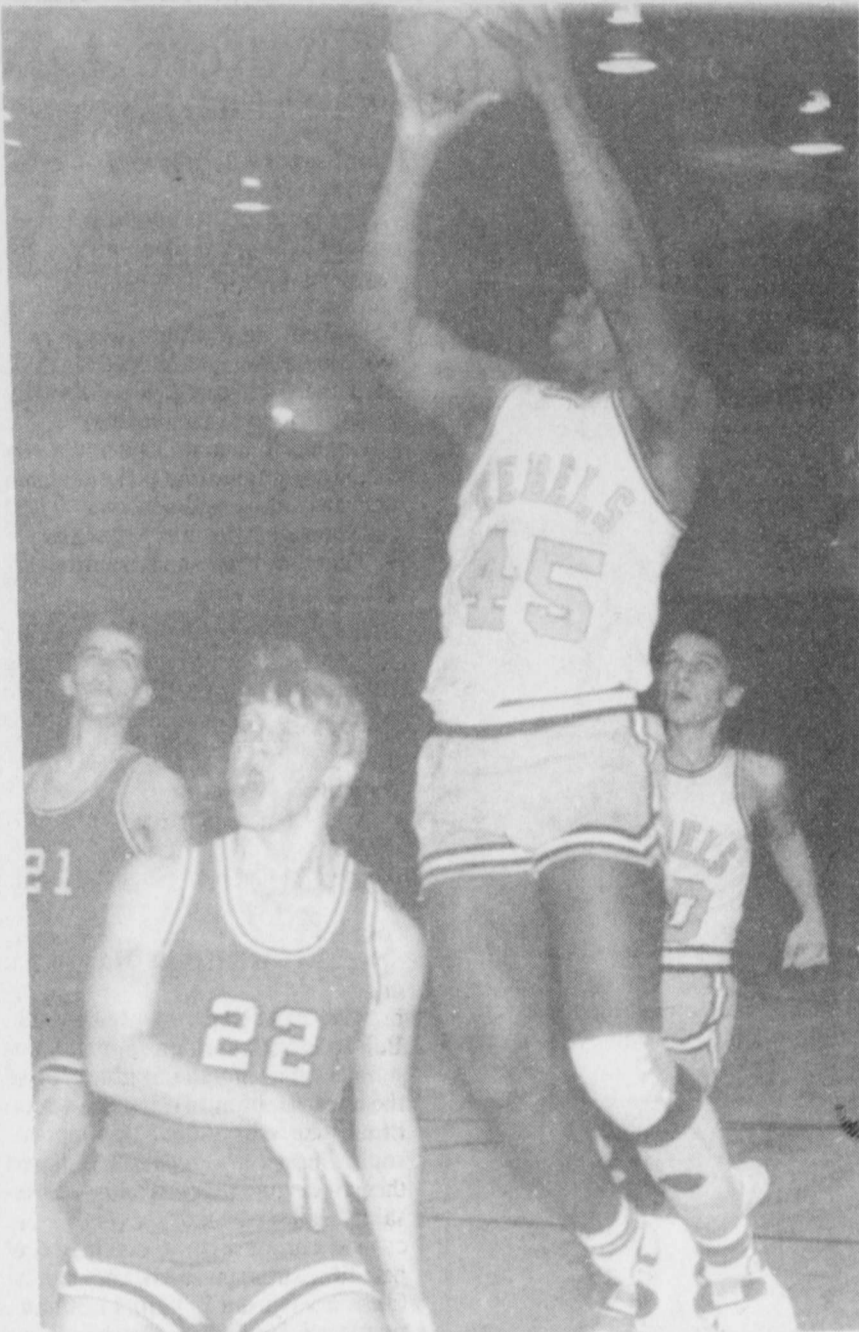

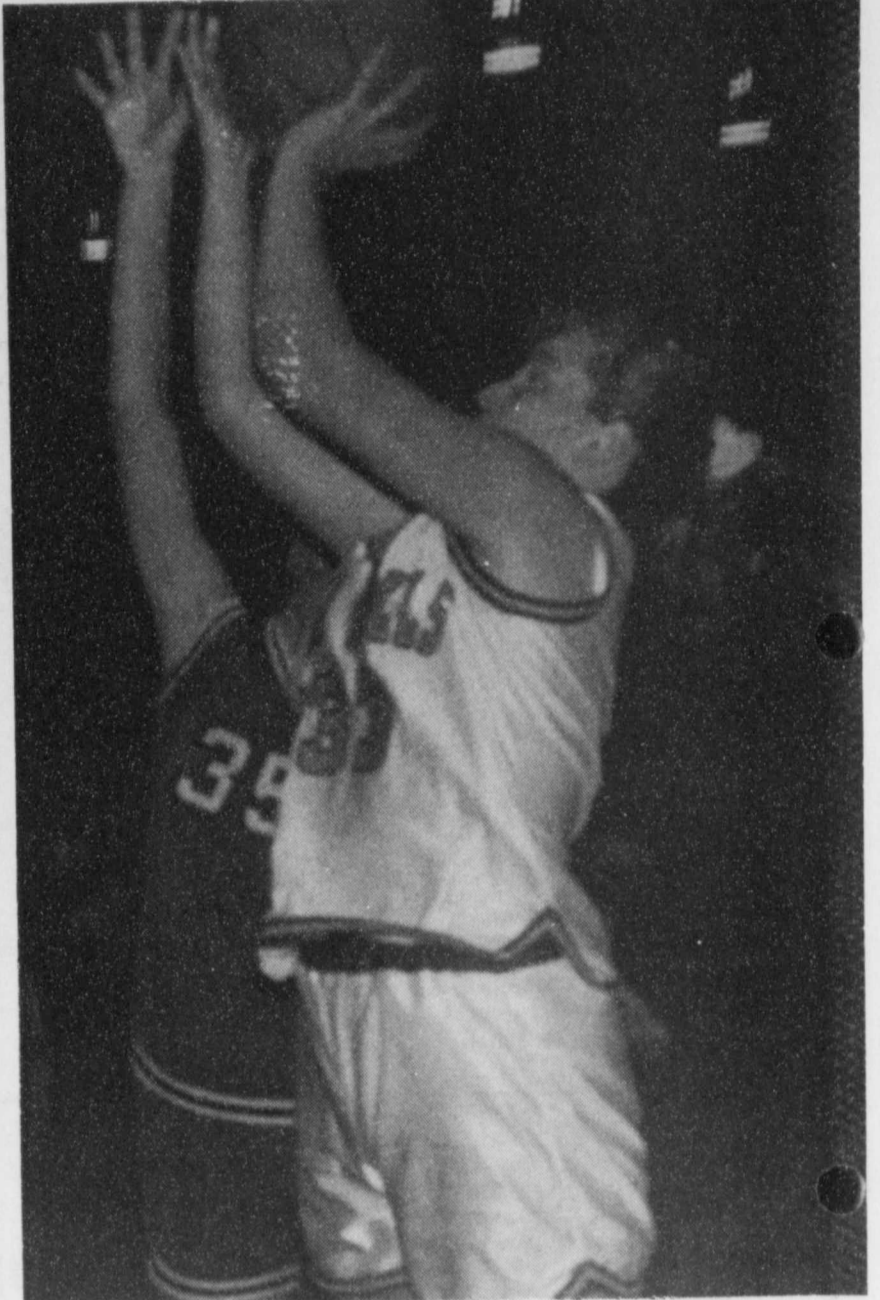

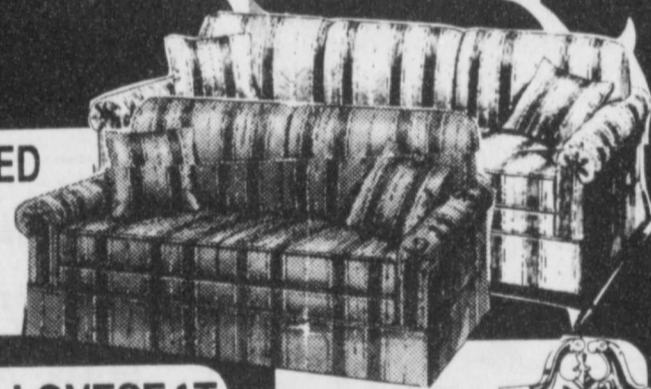

# Couple Braves Cold Weather, To Ride Trails

Five years ago, before Murl and Johnny Hawks took up trail riding, about the only thing they had in common was that she was a good cook and he liked to eat.

Now, with their equestrian avocation, they spend quality time together every weekend or on week-long excursions. They also make friends with other trail riders.

The Hawks ride Missouri Foxtrot-

ters, horses that are known for their smooth gate and fox-like walking pattern. Like the fox, the horses place their hind hooves into the same grooves that their front hooves make, leaving only two hoof prints.

"You can ride Foxotters for a long time. They don't wear out easily, and because of their smooth gait, you don't bounce around," Murl said.

Before taking up riding, Murl didn't

know much about horses. She began riding only five years ago, after she and Johnny married. "I was from Arlington and moving out here and learning to ride a horse was quite a change for me," she said. "My kids are still in awe that I actually ride a horse, regardless of the weather. It's like I'm always saying "chalk one up for old Grandma" to them.

Deciding to saddle up, it didn't take the couple long to acquire their string of horses.

"The first time we rode, I got a horse I kept for the grandkids and

borrowed one from my son to ride. We rode out around Plum Creek and after that," he said, "we went off to Missouri for some Foxotters, where I bought her a mare. After that we went to Big Bend and just graduated up," he said.

"We'd see a horse we liked and get it. Then we'd see another horse and get it. We rode out 14 horses. We've sold some but we still have 14."

From Big Bend to Taos, NM to Casper, Wyoming and Mountain View, AR, the two ride their fancy stepping Foxotters. Of all their rides, they said Big Bend was the most difficult.

"It was cold and rocky. It was also the first week-long ride I had been on, so I had a lot of butterflies. We went on top of a mountain where it was cold, cold. Then, Johnny's horse broke down and we had to go back to get another. After that, a norther blew in, brrrr! On top of that, everything at Big Bend has a thorn in it!" she said.

Regardless of the cold, rain or wind they say the riding is worth the wrath of Mother Nature.

"The best thing about trail riding is that you get off the highways," Johnny said. "You see beautiful country you can't see from highways. There are beautiful streams, rivers and waterfalls. You just can't imagine how pretty it is, unless you backpack or

ride a horse, you can't get back into these places," he said.

"It's good family entertainment, something a husband and wife can do together. So many people go on trail rides. We see them and it's like a reunion each time. We become close friends," she said.

The Hawks would like to see more Foxtrotter interest develop in the area.

"The horses are not real common in this area. Mostly quarter horses are around here. It's hard to trail ride with quarter horses because Foxotters have a faster gate," she said.

The average week-long ride costs around \$135 per person, which includes hook-ups, a barn for the horse, and meals. Equestrians ride during the day, then come back into a centrally located camp at night.

"We don't like to camp out. We bring our camper," he said.

The Hawks belong to several organizations that plan and give out trail ride information. They belong to the Southwest Chapter of the Missouri Foxtrotter Organization, the Oklahoma Equestrians, the Central Texas Riders, and Trail Riders as well as many local riding clubs.

Johnny is the son of the late Mrs. Hattie Hawks. His wife, Murl, is the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Jeff Hancock of Bogata. He is a nephew of Mrs. Vera Craddock of Bogata.





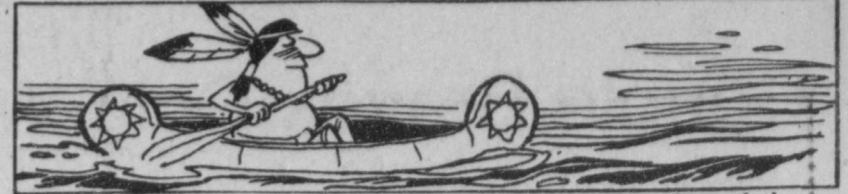
