Ever thought about roads. How did they come to be...who decided that a road would run here and not there? Obviously, roads, like rivers, tend to take the path of least resistance.

Back in the long-ago days, if there was a large rock in the middle of a path, people went around it.

If a place was low and stayed muddy and wet, people chose higher ground.

And, if a stream or river was fordable, the road went to that spot.

In Europe roads date back to the time of the Romans. Great road builders, the Romans. They didn't worry about things like rocks or cliffs or rivers...instead, with careful precision they charted the course they wished a road to take and that's where it went, straight and true.

They dug out obstacles, they put a deep crushed rock bed down, and tamped it, then they paved their roads with stone. It was quite an undertaking.

Of course, when the Romans moved into an area they took anyone they wanted as slaves. This made working on roads much easier...they had an unlimited work force!

Anyhow, vestiges of the Roman roads are still visible throughout Europe. Much isn't, though. That's because the original road has been covered time after time with new surfaces...and the original road is still being used today.

In America it is much the same. The original paths through the wilderness are frequently the same as major highways today.

Of course, not all have that unlimited slave labor, the early Colonists went around major obstacles, instead of rolling over them. That means our roads are often winding.

Roads are often sunk deep into the soil, with high walls of earth on each side. That's simply because of all the generations of wheels that have worn away the earth.

Property lines have had their natural effect on things too, of course.

A cantankerous property holder might not allow people to pass over his land in the old days. That meant a road might take a job or jig that today doesn't seem to have any reason at all.

Roads and rivers are paths to somewhere...anywhere...everywhere.

Next time you are driving on one as you wind along think about what caused it to take its path.

Is this curve to avoid a property owner...or a hard hill, or a chasm, or just to take advantage of a view? It's a fascinating thing to speculate on.

Country Cooking is being shared this week from the kitchen of Clyde and Thelma Bankhead of Cunningham.

Clyde and Thelma have been married for almost 63 years and have lived in the Cunningham area for the last 20 years of their marriage. Throughout their lives, they have lived in Mt. Vernon and Lubbock, but have chosen to retire and make Cunningham their home.

They have four children; a son, Lloyd and wife Irma of Ft. Worth, their four children and six grandchildren; a daughter, Melba and her husband Buddie of Lubbock and their four children, seven grandchildren and one late grandchild, Jimmy and a daughter Elaine and her husband, Roy of New Mexico and their four children and one grandchild; and a son, Clyde and wife Gerrie, and their three children.

Both are active members of the Abundant Life Church in Pattonville.

Many years ago, Thelma's career consisted of being a cook in a couple of restaurants, sewing for her family and the public, and pastoring a church. Since the years called "age" has crept in, she has slowed down on some activities. However, they still raise a huge garden and she cans many jars and bags of food every year. Her favorite food is pickles to can. She loves to share these with her neighbors and friends. Every year the children beg them to forget about a garden, but when the weather gets warm they are always out chopping and planting. Her eyes have slowed down her sewing, but she enjoys jumping, or should I say "easing" into the car and roaming around from town to town looking for bargains. They have traveled much of the United States and Canada and still enjoy it very much. Clyde is not too crazy about

When family members come for a visit, you can plan on having fresh garden peas and cornbread and turnip greens. Also, the chocolate pie and coconut pie recipes being shared this week will always be cooked because they are favorites of the family. I asked Thelma to share these two recipes with us because I am asked frequently for these recipes when she takes them to church dinners or family dinners. She found the coconut recipe from a Southern Living magazine many years ago. She uses the same basics for the chocolate recipe only changes a couple of items. The "Idalou Brownies" recipe is a favorite of her daughter, Melba. The Pecan Pie recipe is a favorite of her pastor and thought they might like the recipe.

### Coconut Pie

3 egg yolks (whites for top)  
1 1/2 cup sugar  
2 cups sweet milk  
1/2 cup flour (scant)  
1/2 cup coconut (heaped)  
Plenty of butter  
Vanilla

### Chocolate Pie

3 egg yolks, save whites for top  
1 1/2 cup sugar  
2 cups sweet milk  
1/2 cup flour, scant  
1/2 cup cocoa, Hershey's  
Plenty butter  
Vanilla

### Idalou Brownies

2 sticks Oleo, melted  
5 T. cocoa  
Melt together  
Sift 2 cups flour  
2 cups sugar  
Mix together  
Add 4 eggs beaten well  
2 t. vanilla  
salt  
1 cup nuts

### Icing

2 cups powdered sugar  
2 T. cocoa  
3 T. oleo  
1/4 cup milk  
1 t. vanilla

### Southern Pecan Pie

1 cup white corn syrup  
1 cup dark brown sugar  
1/3 cup melted butter  
1 heaping cup shelled pecans  
3 whole eggs beaten  
dash vanilla  
Pinch salt  
Pour in 9" pie shell, bake at 350 for 45-50 minutes. Serve with Cool Whip or ice cream.

### Caramel Corn Balls

From Jyll Bullard  
One stick margarine  
One box brown sugar  
One cup light corn syrup  
One can sweetened condensed milk  
Cook to soft ball stage. Stir constantly. Pour over 1 1/2 cups popped corn, cool, butter hands and form balls.

## Social Security Notes

By Ray Hudson, District Manager

REPRESENTATIVE PAYEES HELP BENEFICIARIES..... One of my friends the other day asked me to him what he would have to do if he became a social security representative payee fir his mother's monthly benefit payments. He said that he had been taking care of his mother's bills for some time, but he was getting concerned about continuing to have important mail going directly to her since she has Alzheimer's disease.

As I explained to my friend the duties of a representative payee, it occurred to me that many of you may face a similar situation involving an older relative. While most older people can manage their money very well, some can't act in their own best interest and require a relative or friend to act as a representative payee. A representative payee will nly be appointed if it is determined that the beneficiary is unable to manage his or her own funds.

When a person agrees to become a representative payee, he or she becomes responsible for someone's Social Security and/or Supplementary Security Income (SSI) benefits. The payee recieves Social Security

mail and checks on behalf of the beneficiary and uses the money to meet the living expenses of the beneficiary.

The most important duty of a representative payee is to make sure that the beneficiary's current needs are being expressed. These needs include food, shelter, cloting and medical attention.

Money that remains after current needs are met must be saved for the beneficiary. Once a year, the payee files a report for Social Security showing how funds were used.

If any changes occur that would change the persons Social Security or SSI eligibility, the representative payee must report them to the Socila Security. There is a list of changes which have to be reported and additional information about being a representative payee in the leaflet, Your Duties As A Representative Payee, available from Social Security.

IRAs-Your Investment In  
The Future

Are you looking for ways to reduce your income tax liability? Don't rule out a contribution to an individual retirement account (IRA). Even if your contribution is not deductible, earnings on your investment will be tax-deferred until the year they are withdrawn.

Subject to a maximum age requirement, anyone with net compensation may contribute to an IRA. Compensation includes wages, salaries, tips, bonuses, commissions and self-employment income, including partnership earnings of any active partner.

If neither you nor your spouse is covered by any part of the year by an employer retirement plan, you can take a full IRA deduction for contributions of up to \$2,000 or 100% of compensation, whichever is less. You can also make a spousal contribution of up to \$250 for a nonworking spouse, if you are covered by a pension plan at work, you can still make a fully deductible IRA contribution if your income doesn't exceed \$25,000 (single individuals) or \$40,000 (married). Singles earning between \$25,000 and \$35,000 qualify for partial deductibility of an IRA, as do marrieds with income between \$40,000 and \$50,000.

The IRS Code places few restrictions on the nature of acceptable investments. Self-directed IRAs let owners call their own shots. Unlike other tax-deferred investments, switching investments within an IRA does not trigger a current tax. For example, when IRA money is invested in a brokerage account, the owner may make purchases and sales in much the same manner as through a regular brokerage account.

A final tip: Fund your IRA early in the year instead of on April 15th of the following year. You will get an additional fifteen months of tax-deferred earnings.
