If a place was low and stayed muddy and wet, people chose higher ground.

In Europe roads date back to the ime of the Romans. Great road ouilders, the Romans. They didn't worry about things like rocks or cliffs or rivers...instead, with careful precision they charted the course they wished a road to take and that's where it went, straight and true.

They dug out obstacles, they put a deep crushed rock bed down, and tamped it, then they paved their roads with stone. It was quite an undertaking.

Of course, when the Romans moved into an area they took anyone they wanted as slaves. This made working on roads much easier...they had an unlimited work force!

Anywhy, vestiges of the Roman roads are still visible throughout Europe. Much isn't, though. That's because the original road has been covered time after time with new surfaces...and the original road is still being used today.

In America it is much the same. The original paths through the wilderness are frequently the same as major highways today.

Of course, not all have that unlimted slave labor, the early Colonists went around major obstacles, instead of rolling over them. That means our oads are often winding.

Roads are often sunk deep into the soil, with high walls of earth on each ide. That's simply because of all the generations of wheels that have worn way the earth.

Property lines have had their natural effect on things too, of course.

A cantankerous property holder might not allow people to pass over his land in the old days. That meant a road might take a job or jig that today doesn't seem to have any reason at

Roads and rivers are paths to omewhere...aywhere...everywhere Next time you are driving on one is you wind along think about what aused it to take it's path.

Is this curve to avoid a property owner...or a hard hill, or a chasm, or ust to take advantage of a view? It's fascinating thing to speculate on.

He said that he had been taking care of his mother's bils for some time, but he was getting concerned about continuing to have important mail going directly ot hero since she has Alzheimer's disease.

As I explained to my friend the duties of a representative payee, it occured to me that many of you may face a similar sitution involving an older relative. While most older people can mnage their money very well, some can't act in their own best interest and require a relative or friend to act as a representative payee. A representative payee will nly be appointed if it is determined that the beneficiary is unable to manage his or her own

When a person agrees to become a representative payee, he or she become's responsible for someone's Social Security and/or Supplementary Security Income(SSI) benefits. The payee recieves Social Security

mail and checks on behalf of the beneficiary and uses the money to meet the living expenses of the beneficiary.

The most important duty of a representative payee is to make sure that the beneficiary's current needs are being expressed. These needs include food, shelter, cloting and medical attention.

re you looking for ways to reduce your income tax liability? Don't rule out a contribution to an account (IRA). Even if your contribution is not deductible, earnings on your investment will be tax-deferred until the year they are withdrawn.

tax-deferred until the year they are withdrawn.

Subject to a maximum age requirement, anyone with net compensation may contribute to an IRA. Compensation includes wages, salaries, tips, bonuses, commissions and self-employemnt income, including partnership earnings of any active partner.

If neither you nor your spouse is covered for any part of the year by an employer retirement plan, you can take a full IRA deduction for contributions of up to \$2,000 or 100% of compensation, whichever is less. You can also make a spousal contribution of up to \$250 for a nonworking spouse. If you are covered by a pension plan at work, you can still make a fully deductible IRA contribution if your income

you can still make a fully deductible IRA contribution if your income doesn't exceed \$25,000 (single individuals) or \$40,000 (married). Singles earning between \$25,000 and \$35,000 qualify for partial deductibility of an IRA, as do marrieds with income between \$40,000 and \$50,000. The IRS Code places few restrictions on the nature of acceptable investments. Self-directed IRAs let owners call their own, shots. Unlike

owners call their own, shots. Unlike other tax-deferred investments, switching investments within an IRA does not trigger a current tax. For example, when IRA money is invested in a brokerage account, the owner may make purchases and sales in much the same manner as through a regular brokerage account. regular brokerage account.
A final tip: Fund your IRA early in the year instead of on April 15th of the following year. You will get an additional fifteen months of tax-




