This feat speaks for itself, as these and other top quality animals will be performing each night, trying their best to unseat top

riders from the two sanctioning associations.

Performing this year, other than the many cowboys and cowgirls, are bullfighter Rodney Hayes of Linden, TX and Brother and Vicki Taylor of Wimberly. Vicki is a trick rider and Brother has dog acts and horse and mule tricks. This duo has been performing together for 12 years.

To kick off the festivities, there will be a parade at 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, featuring Kennedy's Sausage Hitch and the local faces of the people we all know. Another parade will be Saturday at 5:00 p.m.

Each night the rodeo begins at 8:30 with a "Grand Entry" of cowboys, cowgirls, friends and family. Later in the program each night there will be a calf scramble for the youngsters with a prize of \$10 nightly.

## Health Department Offers Free Mammograms

Public Health Region 7 has recently received money to provide free mammograms to eligible women. Also, a complete physical, including a pap smear will be done for women who have not had this done in the past 12 months. The American Cancer Society recommends that women 40 years and over receive a screening mammogram. Breast cancer is the leading cause of death for all women aged 40-44. Approximately one in every 11 women will develop breast

cancer, but the earlier diagnosis, the better the cure rate. A mammogram can identify abnormal masses in the breast which cannot be felt by the woman when doing breast self-examination.

If you are interested in being screened to determine if you are eligible for the program, contact your local clinic nurse, Pamela Schuler at 427-2851 Monday through Friday, 8 to noon and 1 to 5 p.m. to schedule a screening appointment.

**Ice Cream Salad**

1 9 oz. can crushed pineapple  
1 package lime gelatin  
1 pint vanilla ice cream  
1 cup cheddar cheese, grated  
1/2 cup pecans

Drain pineapple, add enough water to pineapple juice to make 1 cup. Heat to boiling and add gelatin stirring until dissolved. Blend in ice cream and chill until partially congealed. Fold in cheese and drained pineapple, then pecans. Pour into mold and chill.

**Blonde Brownies**

Melt:  
2/3 butter  
1 box brown sugar in skillet

Add:  
2 cups flour  
1/2 tsp. soda  
Pinch of salt  
2 eggs

Mix together and pour into greased pan. Sprinkle 1-6 oz. pkg. chocolate chips on top. Bake at 300 until done as you like.

**Beans & Sausage Mexican Style**

1 1/2 qts dry red beans  
1 large chopped onion  
1 large green pepper  
garlic  
4 lbs. sausage (2 lbs. hot)  
salt  
chili powder

4 cans tomatoes (save juice)  
1/2 cup sifted flour

Cook beans for 1 1/2 hours. Fry together; sausage, onion and pepper. Put flour in when onions are done. Mix with beans. Mix all other ingredients and cook for 1 1/2 hours or until beans are done.

**Neiman-Marcus Cake**

1st layer:  
1 box yellow cake mix  
1 stick butter, melted  
2 eggs

2nd layer:  
1-8 oz. package cream cheese  
2 eggs  
1-1 lb. box powdered sugar  
2 cups chopped pecans

Mix ingredients for first layer together and press into bottom of 9x13 inch pan. Cream the cream cheese. Add rest of ingredients for second layer and pour over top of first layer. Bake at 350 for 45 minutes or until done.

**Bacon Dip**

1 cup cottage cheese  
2 T. milk  
2 to 3 T. horseradish  
1 tsp. minced onion  
6 to 8 slices of bacon, fried and crumbled

Place cottage cheese and milk in blender. Blend until creamy. Add remaining ingredients, blend on low speed until bacon is evenly distributed, cover, refrigerate for 1 hour.

## June Sales Tax Rebates Increase Locally

"The Texas economy is no longer stalled, but has shifted into drive," Comptroller Jim Sharp said today as he sent city and county governments more than \$240.8 million in local sales tax rebates--or almost 13% more than last June. In the first six months of 1991, the state has rebated a total of \$981.7 million to city and county governments, an 11% increase over the first half of last year.

"Not only are local sales taxes up--but there's a sizable increase in the number of Texas business locations collecting the tax," Sharp said.

ity of the sales tax applications filed during the first months of 1991. These figures are derived by comparing applications for sales tax permits with out of business notices sent to the Comptroller.

By comparison, during those same months in 1989-90, the net rise in businesses collecting the sales tax was 13,213 and in 1988-89 the net gain was 4,014.

Talco received \$1,984.29 for a 7.74% increase while Mt. Pleasant received \$90,865.93 for a 17.19% increase.



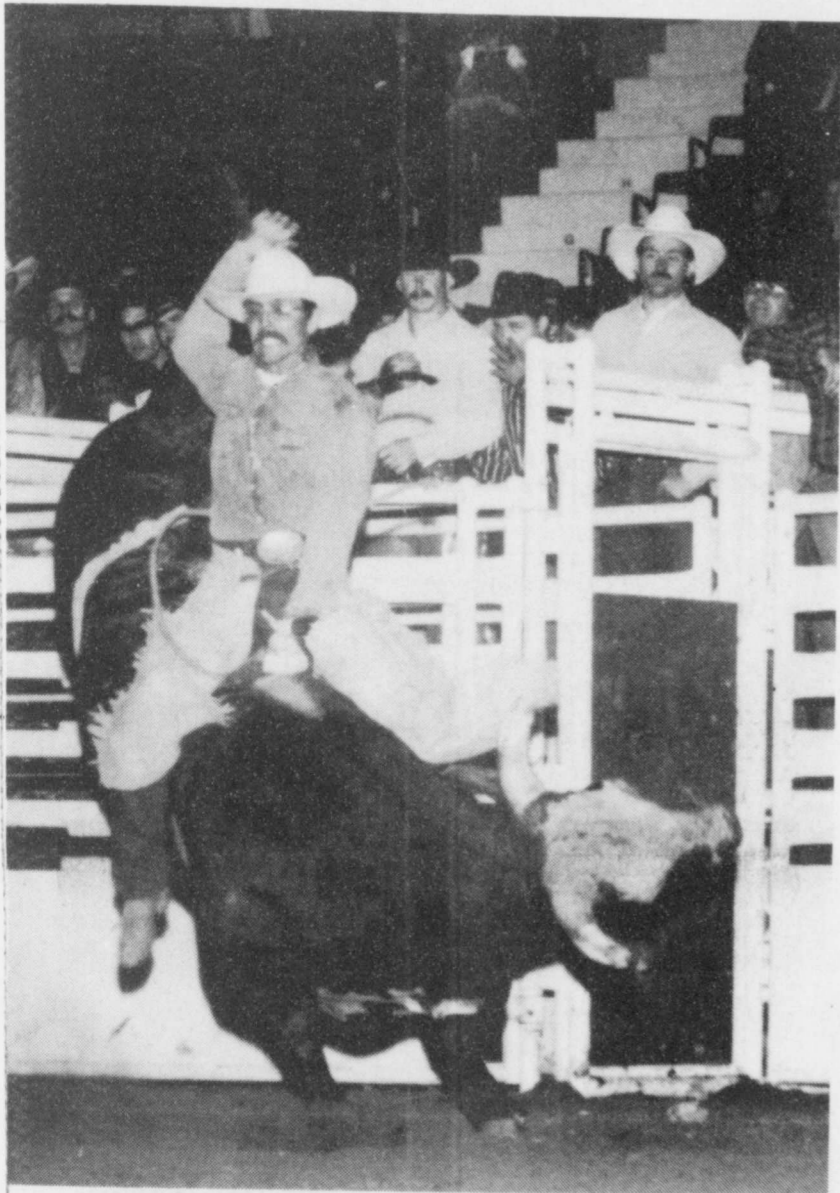

The Texas Department of Health, Public Health Region 7 office announced plans for the continuation of a series of monthly immunization clinics for all children needing immunizations, who meet the required family income determination guidelines.

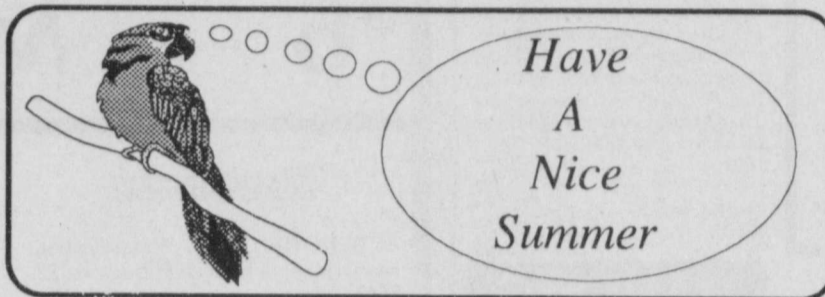
