HEAT or ICE?

How To Treat Those Aches & Pains (First In A Series)

A question I encounter often as a physical therapist is whether it is more effective to use ice or heat in the home treatment of everyday aches and pains. The answer is that both are effective if used at the proper time. Since most injuries such as sprains, bruises and pulled muscles cause localized bleeding, ice is the treatment of choice immediately following the injury. Application of ice to an area effectively slows blood flow, resulting in less bleeding and swelling of the area. By controlling bleeding and swelling, an individual's recovery time is decreased significantly. In addition, ice is an effective way of decreasing pain, without the use of medication. If symptoms of pain, swelling or loss of function persist, you should contact your physician promptly.

A scrapbook has been started and anyone who wishes to donate pictures or any other memorabilia for this project are asked to please bring them to the reunion.

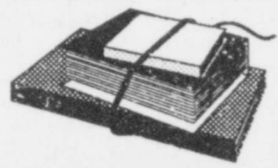
