A course in backpacking will begin September 14 and be taught for three

consecutive Mondays from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. Participants will learn

A course in pottery making will begin September 15 and will meet from 6-9 each Tuesday and Thursday for six weeks. Students will become acquainted with clay by hand building bowls and other forms. They will also receive instruction on the potter's wheel, glazing and use of the kiln. Fee for the course is \$70 and a \$15 fee for supplies.

Harvard Graphics 2.3 is the title of the course that will begin September 15. The two week course will include preparation for detailed graphics, legends and titles, scaling, editing, printing, plotting, bar graphs, word graphs, printer-platter set-up, and alternate output devices. The class will meet from 6-9 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays and the fee is \$60.

Raspberry Lemon Pie

- 1 graham cracker ready-crust pie crust
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 tbsp. cornstarch
- Dash salt
- 2 tbsp. flour
- 1 1/4 cups water
- 3 egg yolks, slightly beaten
- 1 1/2 tbsp. butter
- 1/4 cup lemon juice and rind from a whole lemon
- 1/2 pint red raspberries

Brush crust with one egg yolk and place crust on a cookie sheet. Bake for 5 minutes at 400°F. Remove from oven and allow to cool.

Mix sugar, cornstarch, salt and flour and slowly add the water, stirring constantly. Cook until boiling, then reduce heat and cook for 2 more minutes. Remove from heat and stir a small amount of the custard into the remaining egg yolks. Blend the egg yolk mixture with custard and return to low heat for about a minute. Remove from heat and stir in butter, lemon juice and rind. Pour into shell and cool.

Top pie with raspberries immediately before serving. Use mint leaves for additional color.
