1 large can Pet Milk

2 cups sugar 1 tablespoon vanilla

1 cup crunchy peanut butter Beat eggs until blended, but not foamy. Add sugar, Eagle Brand and peanut butter

until blended. On low speed, blend in Pet milk adn vanilla. Pour into freezer and fill to line with whole milk. Freedze. Use mixer instead of blender as blender will chip up peanuts.

Microwave Peanut Patties

Befgore starting, roast peanuts for 3 minutes in microwave on high. Mix sugar, water and syrup and cook on high for 4 1/2 minutes. Add peanuts, stir and cook for 7 minutes on high. Remove from heat, add butter, vanilla and coloring. Stir until mixture is dull. Spoon into muffin tins coated with Pam or butter.

1/2 cup white corn syrup Mix in 1 1/2 qt. casserole and cook in microwave on high for 4 minutes.


Although Cooper had the points, and possessed the ball for 25 minutes of the game, the Rebels had possession for twenty-three minutes!
