For the last couple of weeks, I've noticed that Donna Anne is taking some daring liberties with some of our traditional Yuletide poetry and songs. I'm just tickled to death, because I've had this little ditty for so many years and haven't had an occasion to share it. It's about that kid who sat in the corner eating plum pie with his thumb. Mr. Rodkey, our band director, taught this to the band many years ago. I have always thought it sounded better when read with a voice resembling that of Aunt Bea on the Andy Griffith Show.

Crouched in his mural intersection,
Masticating his Yuletide pastry.
He inserted his pre-actual digit,
Extracted a Purinus Americanus,
And exclaimed, "I am almost extra-ordinarily precocious!"*

Please take into consideration that it has been at least ten or twelve years since I went to school, and I could possibly be mistaken about a word or two.

Now that I've gotten that big of silliness out of my system, I'll get back to the column I was planning to submit last week when the nice folks at the News office so graciously took over for me.

I was just about to throw in the towel. I was feeling "so sorry" for myself, piled up here in this hospital bed with "complications" as the result of some tests. I was embarrassed because I seem to do so badly on people's photographs. I'd like to blame the camera, but I can't be sure! Then just before I gave it all up, Donald walked in with the mail. This letter just made my day. Hope you all enjoy it as much as I did:

Dear Judy,

I read every word of your column and I enjoy it very much. I knew you and Donald before you were married. I am Donna and every other Rozell's cousin, and I used to spend the summer in Fulbright and Bogata. Miss Selma Baker was my aunt. I married an Air Force pilot and lived in many countries and states, presently I am a hotel executive in Ft. Worth with a stressful job. Fridays are nice when I arrive home to relax and read the Bogata News.

Mrs. Luther Rozell, my Nana, taught me to cook many things before we knew about fat grams and cholesterol. I know she would be amused at the dignitaries who have eaten her recipes all over the world. She would also laugh at the fact that no matter how fancy or gourmet I prepared a meal, her country cooking recipes were the ones that received the most acclaim.

One thing she impressed on me was, "if it is tuna salad or pound cake, make it the best you know how with the best ingredients you can find." That served me well.

In Brazil, I had tried many fancy things, but once I just cooked her Chicken Texanna and her Banana Pudding. They loved that best and I spent hours trying to translate those recipes into Portuguese. Her Baked Beans were also a hit over there.

Henry Kissinger, Ollie North, Senator Howard Baker, the Secretary of the Air Force and all the Joint Chiefs between 1980-1984 ate her biscuits, fudge, cornbread dressing or chocolate pie, as well as deviled eggs. She would just love that. There were many others, both people and recipes, I just don't remember who all we met or fed.

The chef at the Mansion on Turtle Creek, a five star hotel and one of the Top Ten in the U.S., published some of grandmother's recipes and serves them sometimes at the Mansion. I laugh to myself, now the beautiful an cultural elite know what folks in Red River County have known for many years.

Nana, Georgia Rozell was one of a kind. She fed you, if you stopped by her house, whether you were hungry or not. I would like to share some of her recipes, if you ever need a column. They will arrive under separate cover.

While my present job does not include the food end of the hotel business, I have two teenagers so I keep my skills sharp. Nana never got to know my children but she held each one and declared each one the prettiest baby she had ever seen, and I believed every word.

Nana's Chocolate Pie
by Anne Morehead Stetson

- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 2 cups milk (1 should be evaporated)
- 1/2 stick butter
- 4 T cocoa
- 3/4 t. salt
- 3 egg yolks
- 2 t. vanilla
- 1 9" baked pie shell

Reserve egg whites for meringue. Combine all ingredients. Cook over medium heat until thick as custard. Mix ingredients in th beginning with mixer. Make meringue with stiffly beaten egg whites, 1/3 cup sugar and 1/2 tsp. vanilla. Bake in 325 oven for 20 minutes. Refrigerate until serving time.

Special Potatoes

To your own mashed potatoes*, add 1 small pkg. of cream cheese and 1/4 cup Ranch Dressing. This is very good, and there will not be any leftovers. However, if there are, add an egg and 1 T. baking powder and some chopped onions. Form into patties and fry in a bit of oil.

Nana's Butter Pecan Pie

- 1 stick real butter
- 1 cup light Karo
- 1 cup sugar
- 3 large eggs, beaten
- 1/2 tsp. lemon juice
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- dash of salt
- 1 T. flour
- 1 cup pecan halves
- 9" unbaked pie shell

Brown butter in saucepan, don't burn. Let cool. Add ingredients in order listed. Then blend in butter well. Pour in pie shell and bake at 425 for 10 minutes. Turn down to 325 and bake for 40 minutes. Recipe doubles nicely. In summer, Nana thought this pie to be too heavy with the pecans and added instead 1 can of very well drained crushed pineapple. This pie is absolutely my all time favorite.

Christmas Sugar Cookies

- 1 cup oil
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. soda
- 1 cup butter
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1 tsp. cream of tartar
- 4 cups flour

Cream together oil, butter, and both sugars. Add eggs and remaining ingredients. Mix well by adding a little flour at a time. Drop by teaspoonfuls onto ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 for 8-10 minutes. Do not brown!

A cocktail reception was held later at the couple's residence.


The couple will make a short wedding trip with a delayed longer trip in the summer. They will make their home at the Harts Bluff Ranch outside of Talco.

MEDICARE BENEFICIARIES: YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT COORDINATED CARE HEALTH PLANS.....Most Medicare benefi-

ciaries have freedom of choice in deciding how they will receive hospital and medical services covered by Medicare.

They can receive Medicare-covered services either through the traditional "fee-for-service" system or through coordinated care plans such

as Health Maintenance Organizations (HMOs) and competitive medical plans (CMPs). Whether they choose fee-for-service or coordinated care, beneficiaries receive all of Medicare's hospital and medical benefits. The differences in the two systems include how benefits are delivered, how and when payment is made, and how much beneficiaries must pay out of their own pockets.

Under the "fee for service" payment system, beneficiaries may select any licensed physician and use the services of any hospital, health care provider or facility certified by Medicare. Generally, a fee is paid each time a service is used. While Medicare pays a large portion of the charges for covered services, the beneficiary is responsible for Medicare's deductibles, coinsurance, limited charges in excess of the charge Medicare approves for a service, and all charges for services not covered by Medicare.

In a coordinated care plan, a network of health care providers--doctors, hospitals, skilled nursing facili-

ties, etc.--generally offer comprehensive, coordinated medical services to plan members on a prepaid basis. Medicare makes a monthly payment to the plan to cover Medicare's share of the cost of services provided to the beneficiary. Most plans charge a nominal copayment each time a serv-

ice is used as well as a monthly premium that is in addition to the monthly Medicare Part B premium of \$31.80 (\$36.60 in 1993).

Usually, services must be obtained from the professionals and facilities that are a part of your specific plan, except in emergencies, or neither the plan nor Medicare will pay. In addition to the hospital and medical services covered by Medicare, some plans provide preventive care, prescription medicines, dental care, hearing aids, and eyeglasses.

Medicare beneficiaries are eligible to join a Medicare-contracting coordinated health care plan if they live in the plan's service area, are enrolled in Medicare Part B, do not have permanent kidney failure, and have not elected the Medicare hospice benefit.

People join HMOs for several reasons. Among them are:

- * It's generally easier to get care through one source;
- * Quality of care may be enhanced because of the coordination of services;
- * Health care services are more easily budgeted because the amount of premiums is known in advance, and the total 'out-of-pocket' expense likely to be less than under the 'pay-as-you-go' system; and
- * You will not need Medigap insurance to supplement your Medicare coverage because the plan provides you with all or most of the same benefits at no additional cost.

One of the main factors that you should consider when deciding whether to enroll in a coordinated care plan is, 'Are the plan's providers convenient to you and is there adequate transportation to get you to them? What's the value of having a plan that you can't get to when you need it?'


