As I grew older I began to help decorate these special eggs for my nieces. Then, even later, we bought brown eggs and painted bunny faces on them, and used white cardboard to make a "necktie" stand for them.

We sent them to cousins, nieces and nephews, decorated the house with them and generally enjoyed the whole process.

Now, it's been years since I even had time to do an Easter Egg.

A friend says that they used to fill the inside of an empty egg with chocolate, so that their son would peel Easter eggs and find the perfect chocolate egg under the shell!

Egg hunts seem to be some of the fondest memories most of us possess, an exciting, special time of searching for that hidden prize.

Think back to your own Easter eggs, uncover those memories...or watch your children, grandchildren or even great-grandchildren as their own memories are formed this Easter! And, while new memories are being created or old memories recalled...have a joyful Easter.

Hot Mexican Dish by Vivian Fail

1 lb. Hamburger meat
1 tsp salt
1 tsp black pepper
1 medium onion chopped
1 cup milk
1 can cream of Chicken soup
1 can Ro-Tel
1 pkg Doritos
1/2 lb Longhorn cheese

Mix onion, salt pepper, with hamburger. Cook in skillet until done. Mix milk, cream of chicken and rotel then heat. Pour 1/2 of mixture into casserole dish. Sprinkle half of crushed Doritos and 1/2 of grated cheese. Pour the other half of mixture over top. Then sprinkle rest of Doritos and cheese on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until bubbly.

Home Made Chocolate Pie

2 cups sugar
1/2 cup cocoa
2/3 cups flour
1 large can pet milk
5 egg yolks (Save whites for meringue)
2 tsp vanilla
pinch salt
1 3/4 cups hot water
1 stick oleo
2 baked pie shells

Mix dry ingredients and set aside. In sauce pan, combine milk, egg yolks, vanilla and salt. Pour hot water into dry

ingredients. Mix well and pour into sauce pan with milk and egg yolk mixture. Cook until the sauce thickens. Add oleo. Pour into baked pie shells. Make the meringue from egg whites (beaten stiff and 1/4 cup sugar and 1 tsp vanilla added) and spread over tops of pies. Bake for 15 minutes at 325 degrees.

Crisp Cookies

1/2 cup shortening
1 cup sugar
1 egg
1 3/4 cup flour
1/2 tsp salt
1 1/2 tsp vanilla
1 tsp baking powder
3/4 cup pecans

Cream shortening. Add sugar and beat well. Add whole egg, vanilla and dry ingredients. Mix well. Pinch off small pieces. Lay on greased cookie sheet and mash with fork. Bake at 350 degrees until light brown. Makes 2 dozen.

Cucumber Salad

7 cups sliced cucumbers
3 medium onions sliced (red and purple ones are pretty)
Mix 2 cups sugar
1 cup vinegar
1 tablespoon salt
1/2 tsp celery seed

Heat until sugar dissolves. Pour over cucumber mixture. Keeps a long time in refrigerator

Call Of The Wildflowers Goes Out Again

Now that spring is here, thousands of Texas travelers want to know one thing -- where are the best wildflower patches? The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) has the answer.

Every spring, TxDOT provides a wildflower reporting service that points travelers in the direction of the state's most gorgeous fields of bluebonnets, Indian paintbrush, and other native flora. Throughout April and early May, callers may dial the department's travel information line at 1-800-452-9292 for the scoop on the most colorful wildflower sightings across the state. This information, which is updated weekly by TxDOT employees across the state, is also available at any of the department's 25 district offices or 12 Travel Information Centers.

Travelers can also find out about bluebonnet driving trails, wildflower festivals, and other springtime events held across the state.

This reporting service gives the department a chance to show off the

year-round work of TxDOT's maintenance crews, who plant thousands of pounds of wildflower seed annually and coordinate mowing schedules that allow the native plants to mature. Not only do these vegetation management techniques produce some of the most beautiful rights-of-way in the United States, they also prevent erosion and save water and money.
