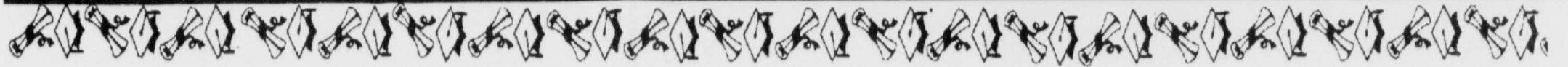

## Talco Cub Scouts Hold Pinewood Derby Races

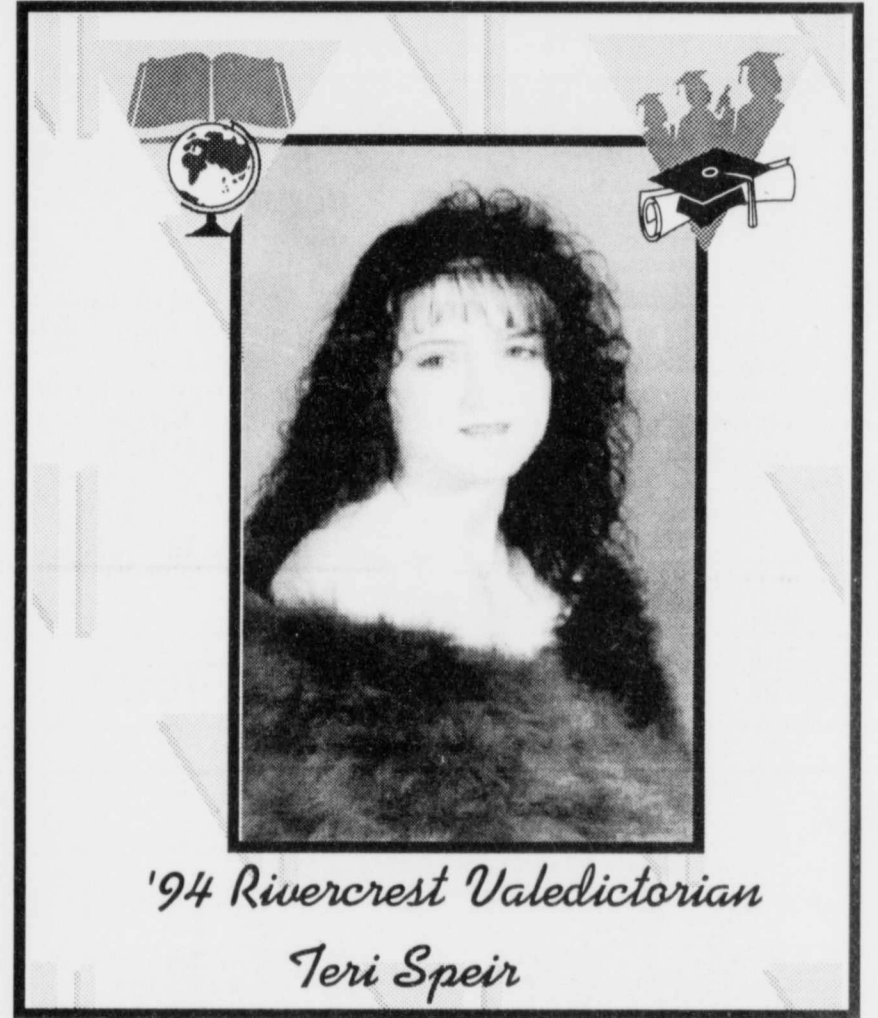
Talco Cub Scouts held their Pinewood Derby Races on Saturday, May 21st, in the park.

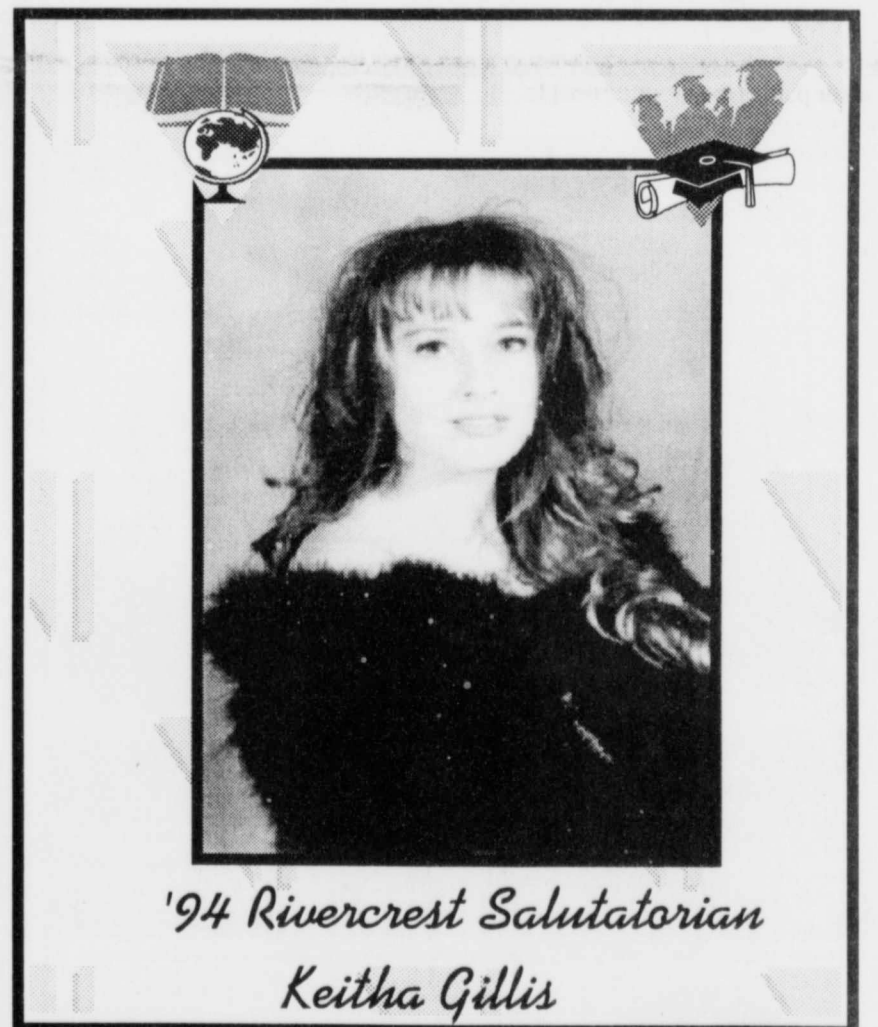
to Clay Craig.

The race was followed by awards and dinner.

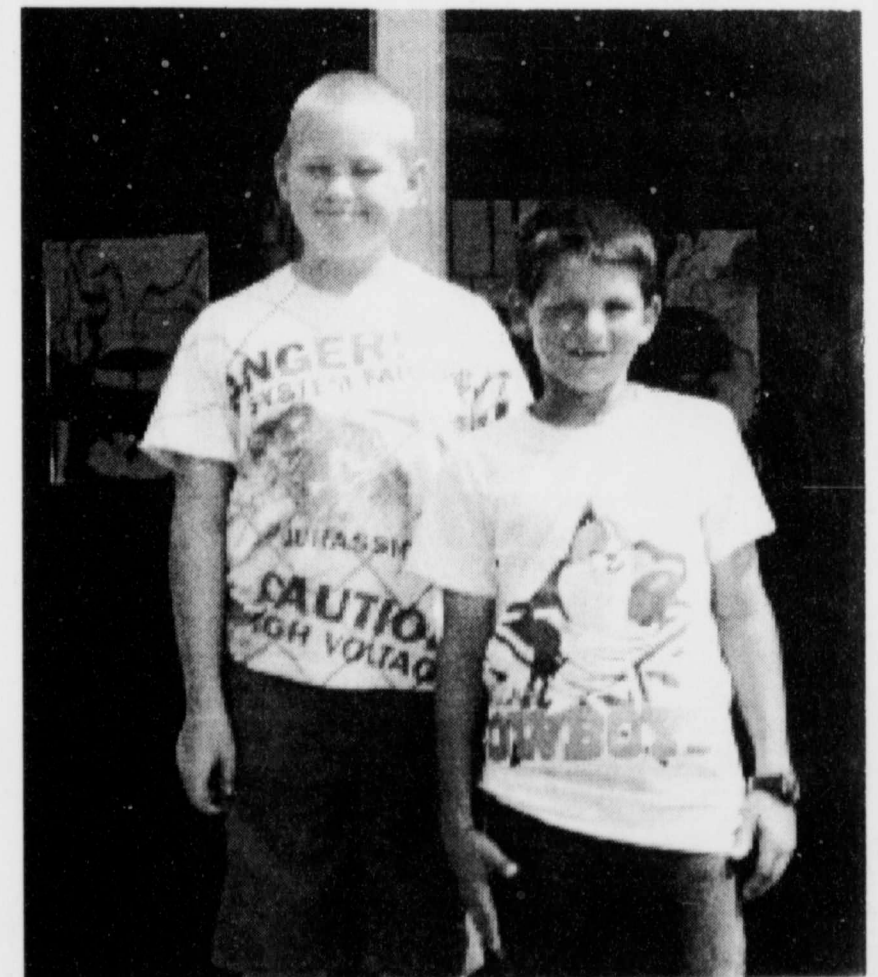

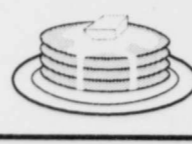

#### Toad In The Hole

6 sausages  
Yorkshire pudding batter  
To make Yorkshire Pudding batter, use 1 cup flour, 1 egg, a pinch of salt, and enough milk to make a smooth batter. Beat all together to make a batter which will just cling to spoon.  
Brown Sausages in skillet, and transfer to oven proof dish. Pour batter over and bake in hot 450 degree oven until batter has risen and edges are crisp and brown.  
Serve with brown gravy and lightly boiled white cabbage.

#### Apple and Blackberry Crumble

1- 16 oz. apples  
Blackberries to taste  
1 cup flour  
1 oz. butter  
1 oz sugar

Simmer apples until tender. Combine with uncooked blackberries and sugar (as required to your taste). Place in oven proof dish.

Combine flour, butter and sugar and mix with hands until a crumble consistency is achieved. Sprinkle over fruit and bake in oven 400 degrees until top is crisp and golden. Serve with hot custard or vanilla ice cream.

Influenzae type b vaccine is also available to medically eligible children between the ages of 2 months and 60 months. The pneumonia vaccine is available to all high risk patients meeting income guidelines. All children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Parents are reminded to bring the child's immunization record and Social Security number if available. The Tetanus/diphtheria vaccine is available to medically eligible adults.
