
Talco UIL students attend IMAX

In his sophomore year Michael was named Honorable Mention defensive back in football and Academic All District. He won the Biology award and participated in track.


As a freshman he served on the Student Council, participated in football, basketball and track. He also won the Geometry award.

Who can vote in upcoming Talco-Bogata Bond Election?

cannot vote in the upcoming Talco-Bogata CISD Bond Election set for June 7 the rules for voting are hereby printed.

To vote a person must be a qualified voter, be a resident of the territory covered by the election for the office or measure on which the person desires to vote and satisfy all other requirements for voting prescribed by law for the particular elec-

A qualified voter is one which is

eighteen years of age or older; Is a United States citizen; has not been determined mentally incompetent by a final judgment of a court: has not been finally convicted of a felony, or, if so convicted has; (A) been issued discharge papers by the pardons and paroles division or institutional division of the Texas Depart-

In an effort to clarify who can and ment of Criminal Justice, or by a federal or other state correctional institution or parole board, or completed a period of probation ordered by any court and at least two years have elapsed from the date of the issuace or completion; or (B) been pardoned or otherwise released from

the resulting disability to vote; Is a resident of this state; and

Is a registered voter. (It is now to late to register to vote in the June 6 election)


If one is a qualified and registered voter, that means that they may vote, no matter which county they reside in as long as it is within the Talco-Bogata CISD school district. If one owns property within the district, yet does not reside in the district they can not vote. It does not matter whether a registered and qualified voter owns property or not, if they live within the district they can vote.

To the Editor:

We live in two worlds. A world of dreams and the world of reality. In the world of dreams, we can remember the good times and fantasize about tomorrow. But when we open our eyes to the real world, we have a totally different view. Let me explain my realistic view of our school situation.

I entered Talco school in 1941 and graduated in 1954, and this is my 24th year to teach in the Bogata school. My sons attended Talco school and my grandchildren have attended both schools. So I have many fond memories of both schools.

Over the years I have seen the deterioration of both facilities. Large mounts of money have been spent just to meet the minimum requirements. In the years to come we are facing larger expenditures to maintain the minimum needs. With all the money spent on these facilities we still have and would continue to have old deteriorating buildings.

Being a split campus it is natural that when one campus gets something new the others want one also. Thus, a duplication of expenses occur. Also to meet the state requirements of teacher/pupil ratio, we have to overstaff the elementary and junior high.

Less repair and maintenance, less staff, and less duplication of equipment would generate considerable savings. On one campus we could achieve these savings without reducing our ability to meet the student's needs.

Over the years our tax base has dropped drastically. We are no longer a rich school district, but a poor one. We have to watch carefully how every penny is spent. For the last few years we have been told to "make do" with what we have. Only the very basic needed material would be considered for pur-

chases. This "make do" environment makes it harder to meet the needs of today's students.

With low interest rates, a great need, and availability of Tier II fund money from the state that would pay for 70+ percent of the cost, a yes vote on June 6 would complete the consolidation and make it truly Talco-Bogata CISD. Lets show the students that their future is as important as our memorics.

With eyes closed I can dream the fond memories of days gone by, But when I open my eyes and see these old facilities I am reminded of my old worn out dog. With teeth falling out and tail dragging, he can no longer hunt as he use to. It is time to take these old facilities off "life support" and provide out students with a "new puppy" in which to build their dreams. So to meet the needs of our students today and tomorrow in the most logical, economical and efficient way, vote 'yes" for the passage of the bond election on June 6. **Don Easterling**

If people thought the area could not start a museum or other worth while project she would say "why not? Nothing will hold us back if we work toward that goal".


Other members have stepped forward to accept the offices that Mary held.
