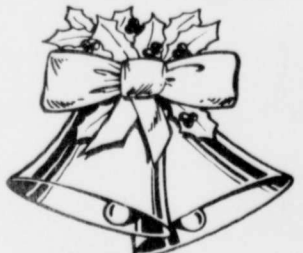

Christmas comes alive with nativity scenes

As you step into the home of Robbie Boren on Highway 1502 in the Red Oak community, you are quickly drawn to the many figurines that are placed throughout each room. But around Christmas time, her home is filled with clusters of nativity scenes in various shapes and sizes. The figurines line the shelves, under and around the Christmas trees and other nooks and crannies.

It is a chore to unpack them each year but she gets enjoyment from seeing them anew. With a total of around 63 or 64 nativity scenes to unwrap and unpack each Christmas season, it is like meeting an old friend again.

She started in 1981 collecting with her first one coming from her oldest daughter Leslie Martin. Leslie painted the ceramic set in her teen years and Robbie gives it a special place on the mantle each year. They mushroom from there and her collection has grown from year to year. Her children and grandchildren have helped her with her collection over the years. They will see one that they think she will enjoy and pick it up for her. Robbie says that price does not have a lot to do with her collection. She has some that are quite expensive and others that have come from flea markets or other inexpensive places. Her latest scene came from her 6 year old grandson Chase Hunold. The school held a Christmas bazaar for the children to do their shopping last Friday and Chase found a small, inexpensive, miniature nativity scene for his grandmother and just knew she had to have it. She placed it on her window over the kitchen sink with several other miniatures.

Her most unusual one has two baby Jesus', but no Mary. She ordered it through the mail and when it came in, it had two babies but no mother. Robbie decided to keep it and not send it back and she enjoys the looks from folks when she asks them what they see different about this one.

Robbie also has two animated scenes. One is noise activated with a waterfall. When the dog barks or someone talks near it, it comes on, complete with light and carols. The other is a larger scene which winds up and music plays and the characters move around the area.

She has a smaller wooden set with the figures 8-10 inches tall carved. She purchased these from Tinsel and Tidings last year and went back this year and purchased a larger set that stand around 2-3 feet. She placed it on the front porch and it is a most unusual grouping.

A small Christmas tree in one of the spare bedrooms is totally Hallmark ornaments and nativity scenes. She began collecting them and they offer different pieces each year and she hopes to collect all of the pieces.

On the piano is several different types from various cultures. There is an Eskimo scene complete with polar bears and fur coats and hoods. The African scene denotes the colorful costumes of the area and dry, barren land. The American Indian nativity scene is most unusual with the character dressed in leathers and beads and baby Jesus as a papoose.

Robbie also collects the Dreamsicles and Precious Moments pieces. Quite a collection resides in a glass curio cabinet. Most of these are numbered pieces she has ordered. She also has a lighted Precious Moments set that is around 12 inches high and was given to her by her grandchildren Chase and Jordan Hunold last year.

She purchased the grandchildren stocking mantle hangers from the dollar store. Each one depicts Mary and Joseph and holds the children's stockings. She even has a nativity throw that resides on the couch. Small miniatures are placed throughout the house on window ledges, small tables and any space that is available.

Robbie not only collects nativity scenes, but is also an avid collector of the "Denim Days" that is put out by Home Interior. She has one curio

cabinet that is nothing but these. They depict the different seasons of the year and the various holidays.

She also collects Barbie dolls and has quite an extensive collection. It began with her youngest daughter Carla. When she was younger, she enjoyed the dolls and began her collection. Now each year they purchase the newest Barbie's that come out for the granddaughters as well. This year is the last of a series of eleven.

Robbie is also a very "crafty" person. She participates in the Prairiland summer programs each year and also has served as a judge for the Christmas Bazaar that Prairiland holds each year in the Home Economics Department. She is currently in the process of doing embroidery work on bedspreads for the grandchildren in the form of a quilt. Each grandchild enjoys a favorite activity and this is what they are centered on.

Robbie and her husband Carl have lived in their home in Red Oak for the past 15 years, moving there from Blossom. They have three daughters. Leslie, the oldest lives "across the pasture", after having built a new home in the area. She is married to Bruce Martin and they have two children. Jonathan is a sophomore at Prairiland and Jennifer is a seventh grader at Blossom.

Middle daughter Leasa and her husband Dale Hunold live down the road and they have two children. Jordan is a freshman at Prairiland and Chase is in Kindergarten at Blossom. Jam Cake

2 cups sugar
1/2 stick butter
1 cup sweet milk
1 teaspoon baking powder
3 cups self-rising flour
1 cup buttermilk
1 teaspoon soda
1 cup chopped nuts
1 cup floured raisins
1 cup blackberry jam
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon cloves
1 teaspoon allspice
1 cup cherries

Bake in 5 layers. Cream eggs and butter well. Add sugar and mix baking powder in sweet milk. Sift flour using large cup. Mix buttermilk and soda and then all other ingredients.

Icing for Jam Cake

3 cups sugar
1-1/2 cup milk

Boil until forms a ball when dropped into cold water.

Red Velvet Cake

1 cup buttermilk
1-1/2 cup sugar
2 eggs
1 tablespoon cocoa
1 tablespoon vinegar
1 teaspoon vanilla
2 cups flour
1 cup shortening
1 teaspoon soda
1 teaspoon salt
2 ounce red food coloring

Combine ingredients and bake in 350 degree oven.

Icing for Red Velvet Cake

8 ounce cream cheese
1 box powdered sugar
1 stick of margarine
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup pecans-chopped
coconut-optional

Giblet Gravy

1/2 cup flour
1 stick butter
giblets
salt
pepper
broth from turkey

Pour flour into skillet of butter. Add salt and pepper to taste. Stir in your sliced giblets and add broth. If gravy is to thick add more broth.

Buttermilk Pie

1 cup buttermilk
3 cups sugar
3 tablespoons flour
6 whole eggs
2 sticks butter
vanilla flavoring

Mix dry ingredients, then milk, butter, eggs and vanilla. Bake at 350 degrees for 40-45 minutes.

Turkey

Cook turkey and giblets in a large pot until tender. Take from water and butter turkey and bake on low 300 degrees until done. Chop giblets for gravy and set aside.

Dressing

1 stalk celery
6 onions
1 delicious apple
salt

Combine ingredients and cook on top of stove until tender and set aside. Cook cornbread. Crumble bread in large pan and add black pepper, sage and salt to your taste. Pour in cooked vegetables and broth until very moist. Add chopped eggs and mix well and brown in oven.

Christmas gifts needed at Terrell State Hospital

The Volunteer Services Council for Terrell State Hospital is seeking interested individuals and organizations to provide Christmas gifts for approximately 600 patients at the hospital and in personal care homes.

Bob Watson, Chairman of the Council, announced the need for help in providing new gifts or money to purchase gifts. The hospital serves 22 Northeast Texas counties and many of the patients have no one to remember them at Christmas but volunteers.

In the past, the Council has provided wanted and needed articles for hundreds of patients with assistance of friends, church, Sunday school groups, social clubs, merchants, civic clubs and many other organizations.

When a mentally ill person is hospitalized, they are often without anyone to provide personal care items. It is sometimes surprising to people that the "wishes" on these lists are often for simple things most of us take for granted.

Volunteers welcome help with the smallest quantities of non-aerosol deodorant, black hair care products, nail polish remover, cologne, after shave, denture adhesive and hair spray. Soft candies, stationary, checkers and board games are always at the top of the patients wish lists. Needed wearing apparel such as house shoes, warm-up suits, gloves, sweaters and underwear are always appreciated. Male patients enjoy receiving handkerchiefs and belts.

Although good used clothing and shoes are welcome at the Community Relations Department year-round, the hospital only use new items for Christmas packages.

Gift boxes are packed individually to meet each patient's wants and needs. Volunteers ask that gift items be unwrapped so gifts can be assembled in packages so the age and wishes of each patient can be taken into consideration.

All toiletry items should be in plastic containers if possible. Money is sometime the best help of all in the work at Christmas because items can be purchased at great savings when buying in quantity. Please make checks payable to "Volunteer Services for Terrell State Hospital and mark them "Christmas for Patients".

Donations are accepted at the hospital's Community Relations Department or at the Dallas American Red Cross, 2300 McKinney. Please mark donations "For Terrell State Hospital". Checks may be mailed to: Community Relations Department, Terrell, State Hospital, Box 70, Terrell, Texas 75160.

All donations to the Volunteer Services Council are tax deductible and will be acknowledged; however, you will need to make an itemized list of your donation of gift items or clothing. All help is greatly appreciated.

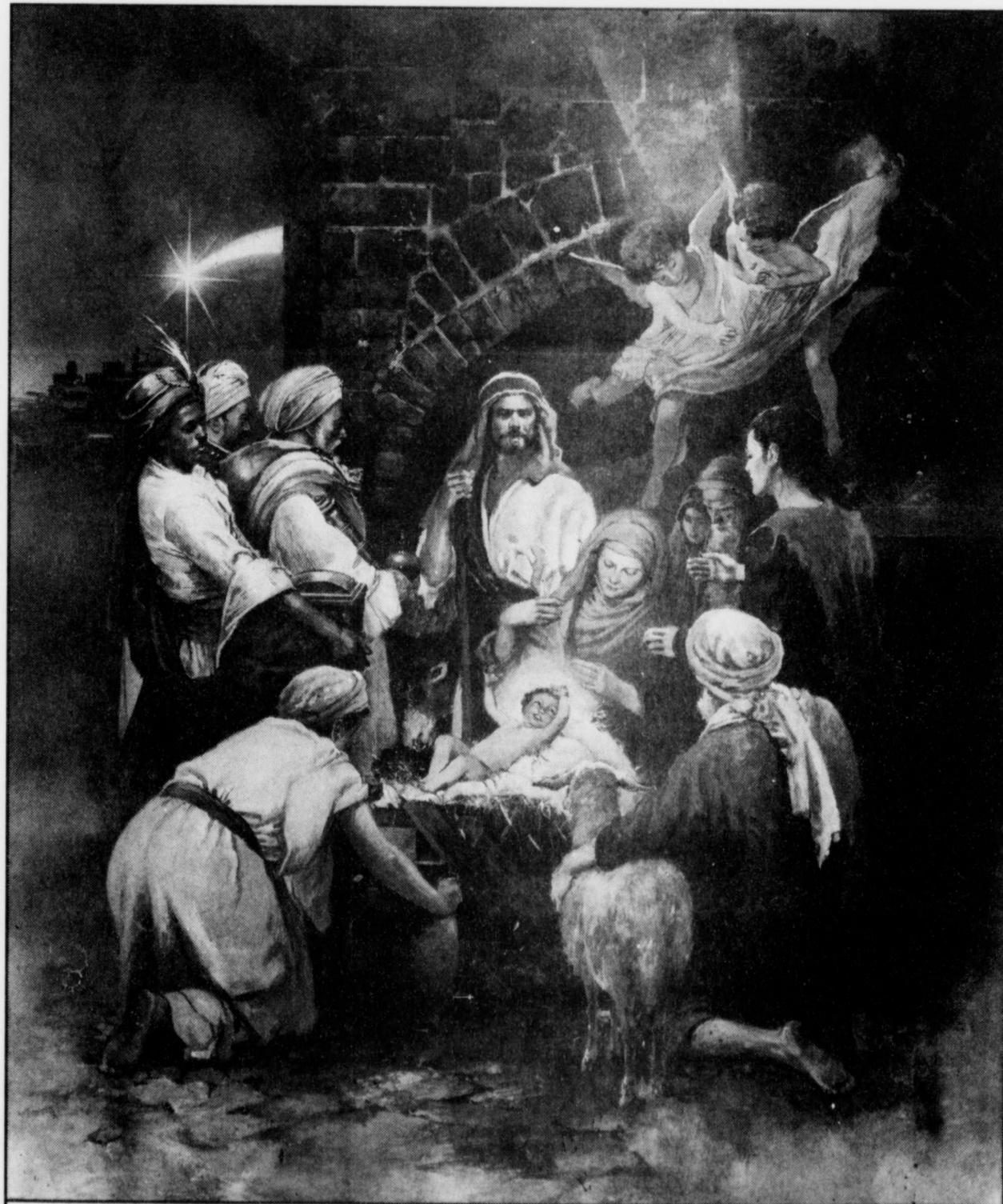

City Council hears report on water line repair

The Bogata City Council met in regular session on Monday, December 14 with Mayor and four councilmembers present, as well as four employees and five visitors. Mayor Garretson called the meeting to order and gave the invocation. Minutes of previous two meetings were approved. Bills and final water bill accounts were also approved.

Council heard a report from Wendell Davis, Water Superintendent, which included repairing five water leaks, replacing 70 feet of sewer line, and two hundred sixty feet of sewer line at another location, several water/sewer taps on putting up the Christmas decoration in the City. He also reported Hale Electric will be starting the repair of the wiring at the tank lot soon. The #6 waterwell pump has not been repaired yet due to the wet weather. He reported five dogs have been picked up in the past month.

Council heard the report of the Police Chief which included 40 traffic stops, 24 were written warnings; three harassment calls; 2 disorderly conduct calls; 2 welfare concerns; 6 arrests; 2 burglary calls; 1 DWI misdemeanor arrest. He reported some positive wording on the police grant.

Two requests for street lights were tabled until they can be checked out. Council voted to keep City Hall open during the noon hour beginning Tuesday, December 15. They also

tentatively voted to have a Christmas party for the employees and their spouses and the councilmembers on Tuesday, December 22 at 6 p.m. at the community center.

Council voted to have a meeting on January 14 at 7 p.m. at City Hall to discuss the possibility of forming a County Chamber of Commerce.

Plans were made to have a Christmas Open House at City Hall from 3-5 p.m. on Tuesday, December 22. Council voted to have Cecil Doyle build a council table at an approximate cost of \$178.00.

Council voted to haul some brick donated by C.L. Miller. They voted to give the employees a bonus for Christmas.

Mayor Garretson made several announcements, including a call meeting for Monday, December 21 at 7 p.m. He also told the Council that the Employees Handbook will be revised after the first of the year. He told the council that some citizens have been getting calls from someone posing to be from the Department of Transportation, and they have been asking a lot of personal questions. HE wants the citizens to know about this and be wary of answering any personal questions.

The City has been reimbursed by Ark-Tex Council of Governments for three pagers. Meeting adjourned at 8:15 p.m.

This task presented a surprise one year when several rolls of "caps" passed through the security check and was set off by the roaring fire. The after meal kitchen chores, which were thought to be woman's work, were performed by an uncle.

These treks on the 24th of December of each year continued after having a family of my own. No matter where we lived at the time, we would return because I wanted my children to be able to experience this bond with family and form memories of their own. In September, 1987, Memmie expired after battling cancer. Amazing how one person so small in stature can be the catalyst of a large family. After her demise, everyone went their separate ways and in some instances, parted ways.

My mind racing with events of years gone by and trying to single out just one special year, I keep returning to an event in the not so distant

past. I was off for the holidays, but Jim had to work. Our three children, grown and with families of their own, were not due for arrival under Saturday after Christmas. Upon leaving, I turned my signal to the left, but turned right. Like a magnet, I was being drawn to the homeplace, like so many eves before. Leaving the main road and driving up the long drive, I would almost picture cars parked, kids running and playing, and smoke curling from the chimney. Once parked I saw for a few minutes, but knew I could not leave without going into the house. As I eased the door open and peered in, I was met with a chill much as the same temperature outside and musty smells of a building having been closed for a period of time. Gone were the warmth from the hearth and the scrumptious smells of ham and other festive fare being baked. Walking from room to room, I reminisced of times spent in this home during my life. Pausing a little longer in the doorway of Memmie's room, I recalled being at her side the day her last breath of life was taken there. Leaving, I closed the door in the same manner as I had entered only minutes earlier. Cranking my automobile, being thankful for the warmth, I realize my spirits felt lighter now than prior to my arrival. Shifting into gear and heading back to town, I whispered, half out loud, to continue to make Papa and Nana's home a place for our grandchildren to build happy memories.

In the fifty years of my life, it would be near impossible to recall any one Christmas as most memorable. I can write that December 24, 1997 was my Christmas for remembering and to realize that no matter how things change, you will always have your memories, because that is something that can never be taken away.

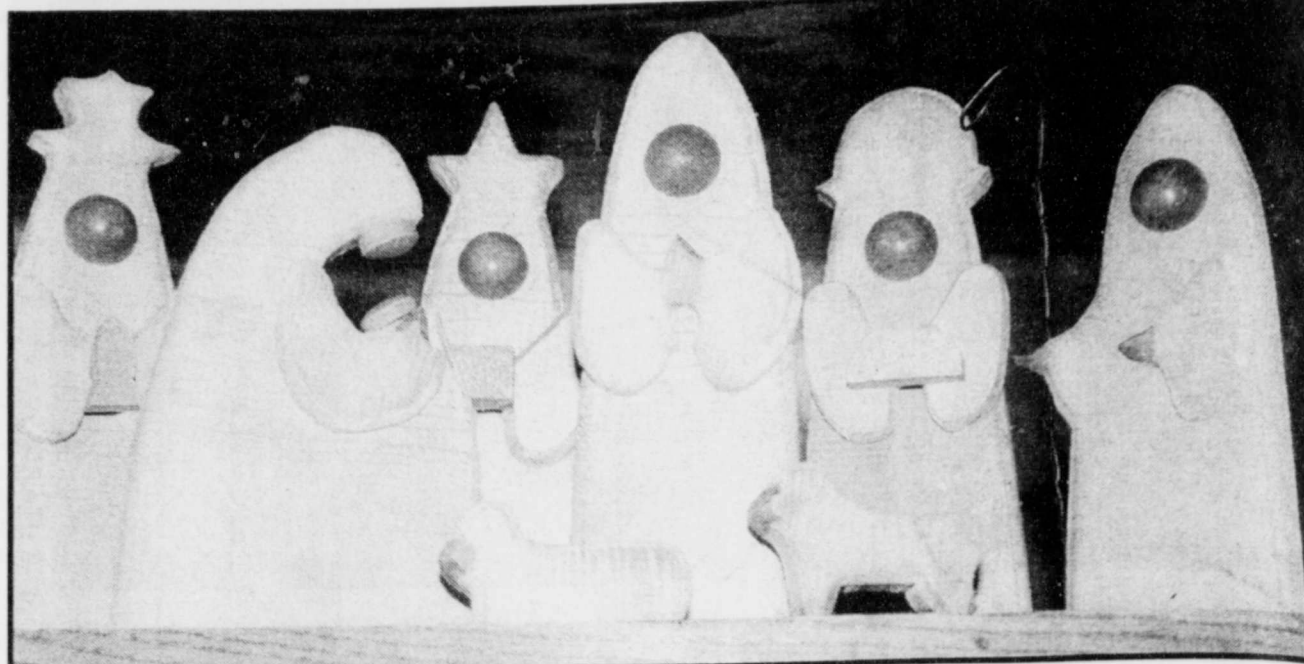

I wrapped the blanket around me and tip toed to the front door, full of fear, but not wanting to leave that door wide open...it was already getting chilly in the room.

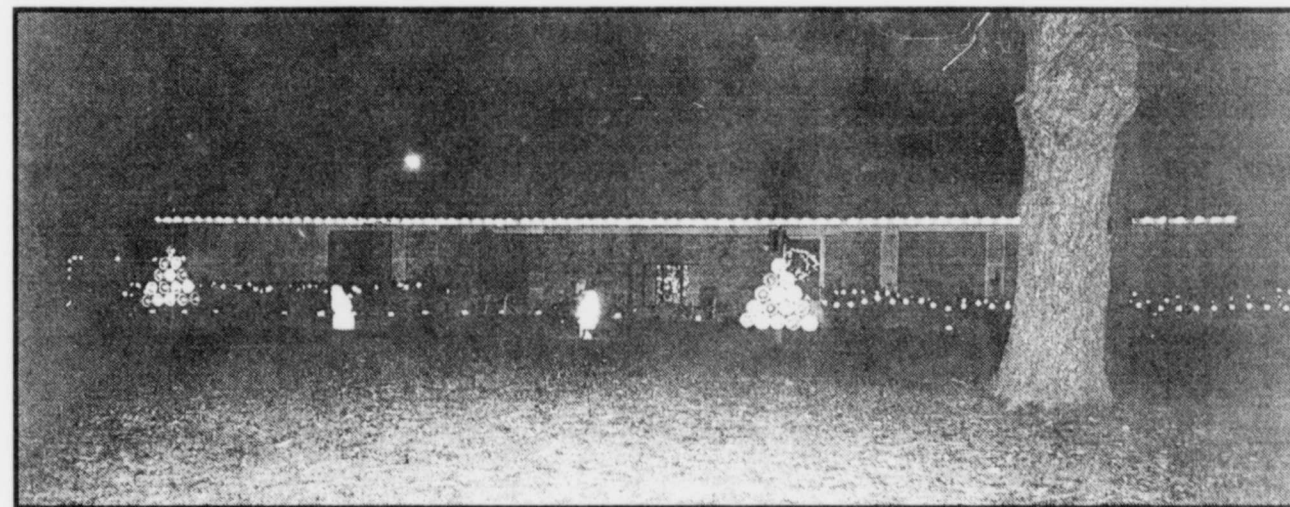

Laser utilized in hair removal

Improvements in laser technology are making hair removal more effective and less painful.

"New technology allows the laser to pulse for a longer time and provides enough energy to destroy the hair bulb," said Dr. Martin Moskowitz, a plastic surgeon at Baylor College of Medicine and The Methodist Hospital in Houston.

Use of lasers for hair removal was approved by the Food and Drug Administration earlier this year. For the procedures, Moskowitz uses a long-pulse Alexandrite laser.

"The laser has a cooling device which sprays coolant on the skin a

microsecond before it flashes," Moskowitz said. "This cools the skin, making the process less painful and less likely to cause blisters."

The laser emits a single wavelength of light that is absorbed by the brown color found in melanin, the dark pigment causing brown hair and tanned skin. Before laser treatment begins, all hair is shaved from the area being treated.

Since the skin does not have as much melanin, the laser beam passes through the skin and targets the brown-colored hair bulbs. The laser's

reaction with the melanin damages the hair bulb, causing it to atrophy and later fall out.

Treatments take about one minute for a moustache and an hour or more for a back. Prices vary according to area treated, ranging from \$200 to \$1,400 per procedure.

Moskowitz cautions that laser procedures should be performed by a plastic surgeon or dermatologist.

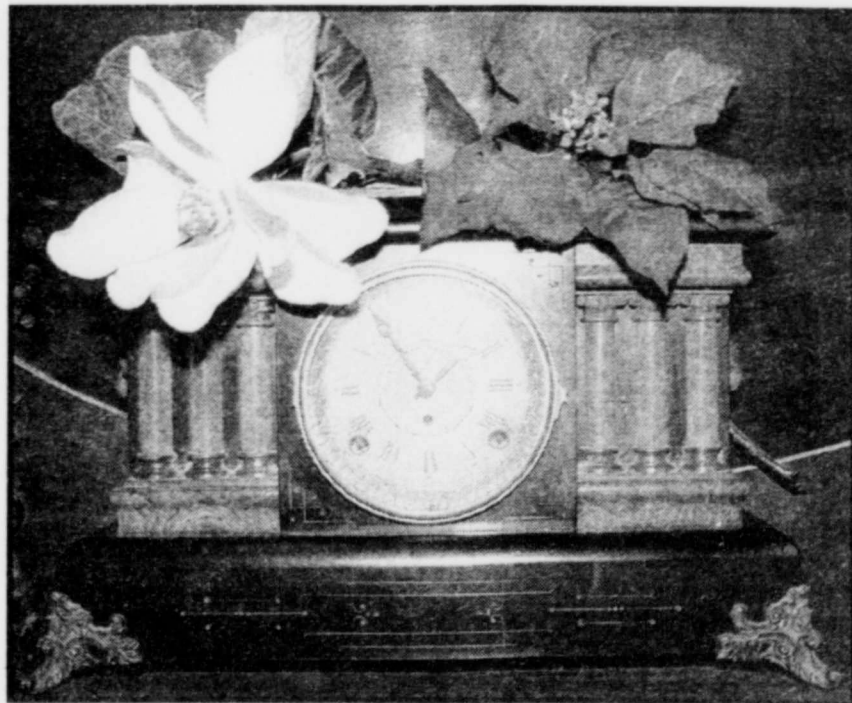

My most special Christmas memory happened when I was 11 years old, December 1964. My mother had polio and part of his treatment was to go to Scottish Rite Hospital regularly for check-ups. On the way home, as they were going through Sulphur Springs, a car accident happened. My Mom and her friend were critically injured. My Mom was in ICU at Baylor Hospital for several days and wasn't released for almost two weeks due to the severity of her injuries.

My Mom was a stay-at-home mother to five children and my Dad worked road construction which is very seasonal. They had only done the barest of Christmas shopping and didn't appear that there would be any opportunity or money to do any more Christmas time. The rest of us were staying with a family friend and were very sad that no preparations had been made toward Christmas at all. She took us down

in the woods and helped us to cut a tree and bring it back to our house and we decorated it as only children can.

My Mom's sister and her family bought each of us a gift so there would be something from Santa under our tree on Christmas morning. We were all worried that Santa wouldn't know where to find us as we were not where we were supposed to be. But most of all, we were worried that Mama wouldn't be home for Christmas.

That year I remember two things. I got two Barbie dolls for Christmas, the only thing I can remember asking for, one from my aunt and one from Santa. The other thing I remember is my Mom came home a couple of days before Christmas. Rather worse for the wear, but beautiful to us! It was the most wonderful Christmas in my childhood.

I still have the Barbie that Santa gave me and I wouldn't trade her for anything. I still have my Mom and she's even more special. I'm very thankful that Mom was home with us that day, it wouldn't have been Christmas without her.

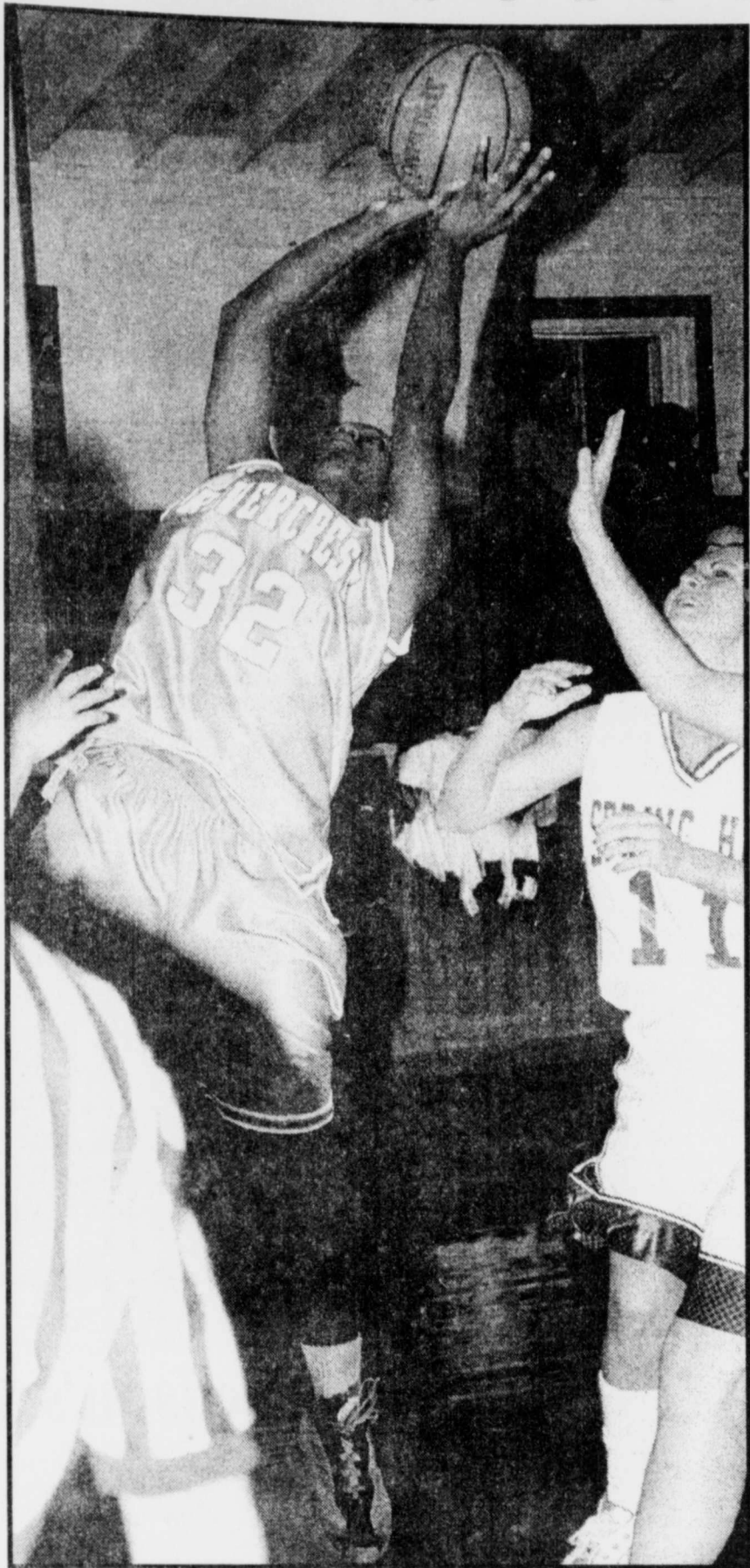

since the Mustangs beat the Rebels by over 20 points in their last meetings and this time the Rebels only lost by 5-10 points.

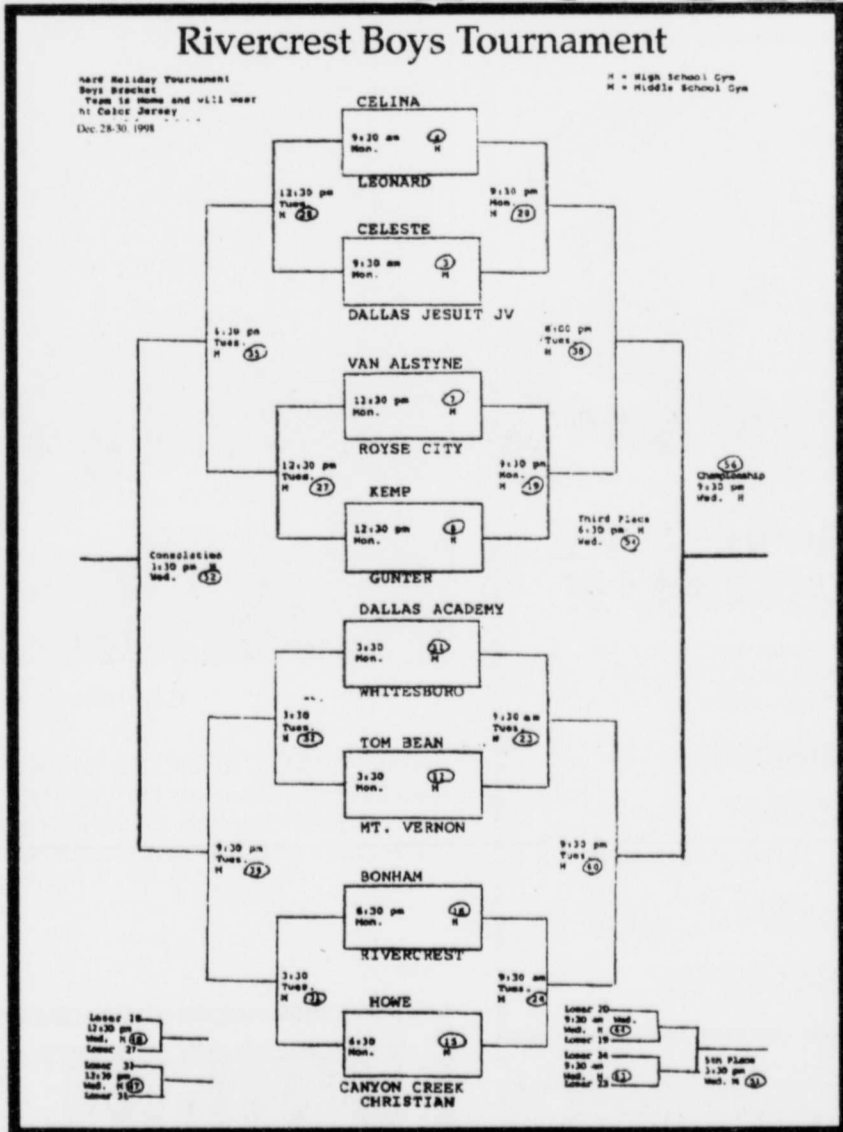

Accountability data released

The Texas Education Agency recently released the accountability data for all schools across the state. The accountability system was developed as a method of informing the local district and the public of the performance of their school. Schools are measured on TAAS scores, attendance rates, and other student performance indicators, as well as fiscal information on the school district. The Academic Excellence Indicator System is used to analyze the date and place the school in a rating system which consists of four levels of performance. Districts receive an ac-

creditation status of either Exemplary, Recognized, Academically acceptable or Academically Unacceptable. Campuses receive performance ratings of Exemplary, recognized, Acceptable or Low-performing.

The Talco-Bogata CISD received an accreditation of Recognized. Both the Rivercrest High School and Bogata Elementary/Junior High campuses received a performance rating of Exemplary, while the Talco Elementary/Junior High campus received a performance rating of Acceptable. 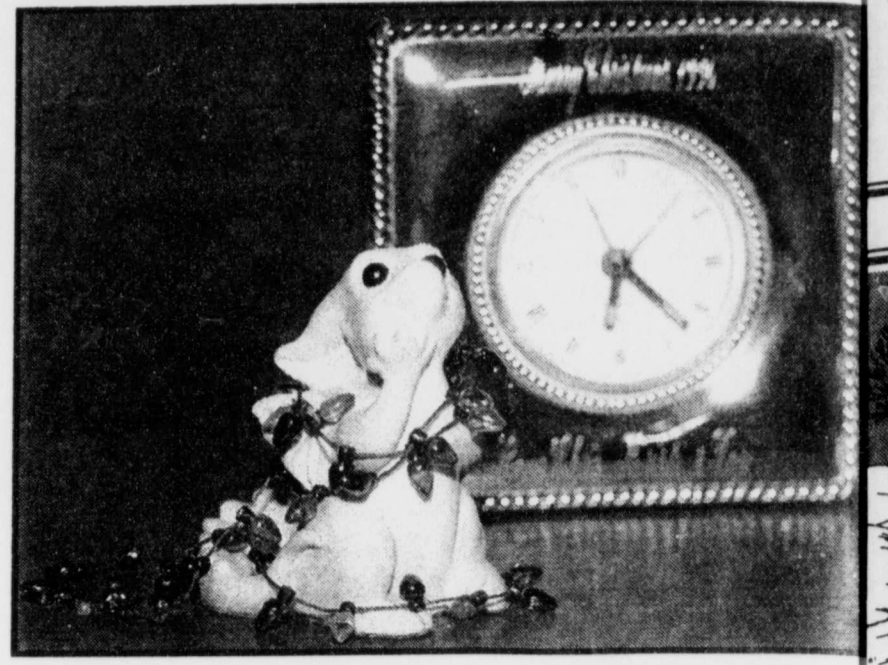
Mama and Uncle Dick fixed Christmas dinner, we said the blessing and

Thanks for the memories, Mama.

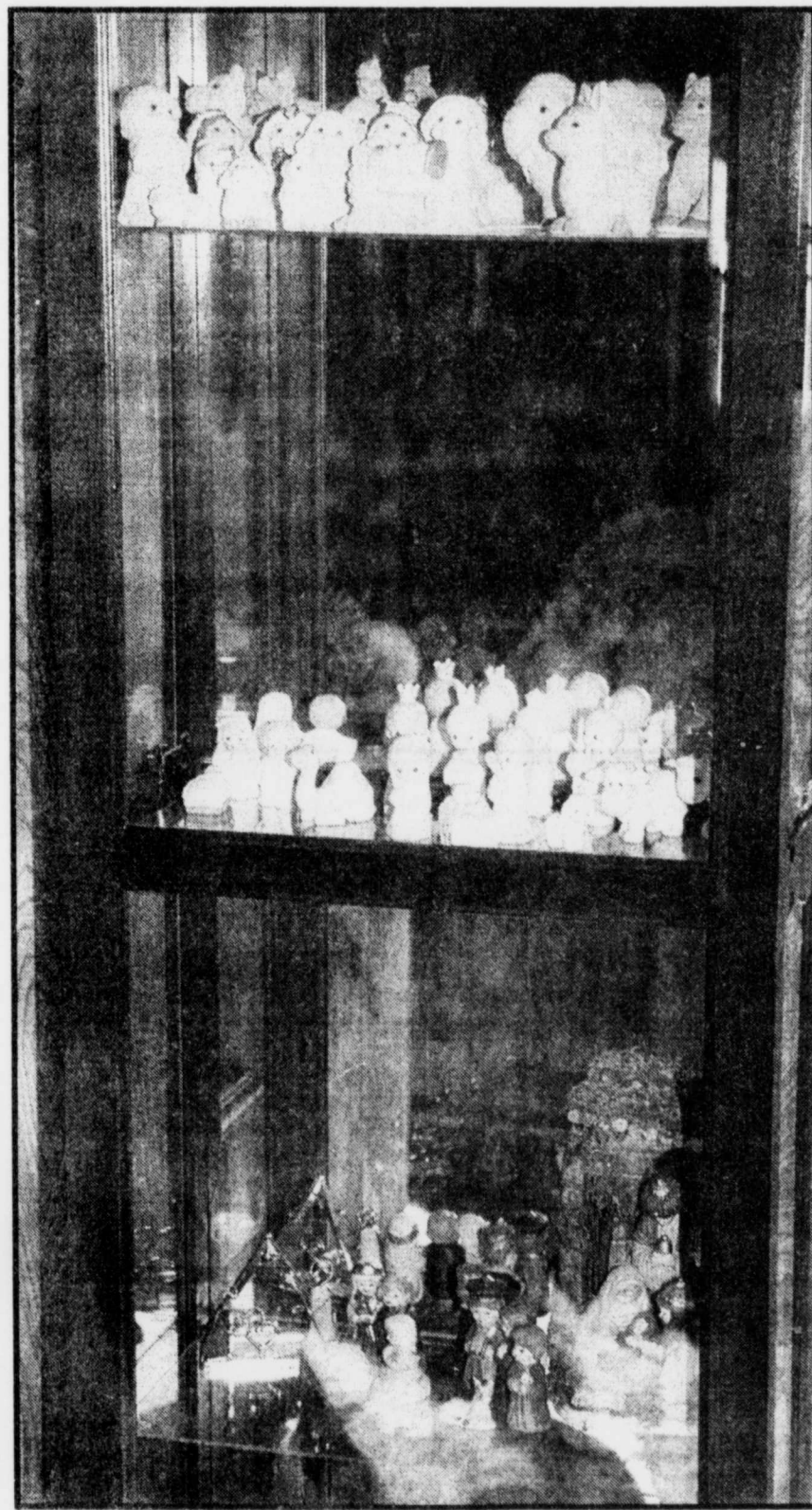
