The Great Plains Conservation Program now has more funds a vailable to cost share on conservation practices in Briscoe County. Conservation practices can be

cost shared on cropland, rangeland or pastureland. The cost share rate ranges from 50% to 80% depending upon the conservation practice. Eligible conservation practices that are cost shared are as follow: brush control, diversions, livestock fences, irrigation pipeline, land leveling, livestock wells and pipelines, pasture planting, ponds, range seeding, tailwater pits, terraces, water storage facilities, waterways and windbreaks or shelterbelts.

Interested landowners or operators should contact the Soil Conservation Service at Silverton to apply for the program.


