Students will receive three gate passes, a cold drink, ice cream cone, two carnival rides and two wrist band discounts for participating in this program.

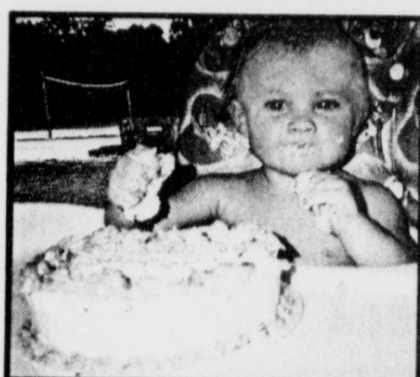

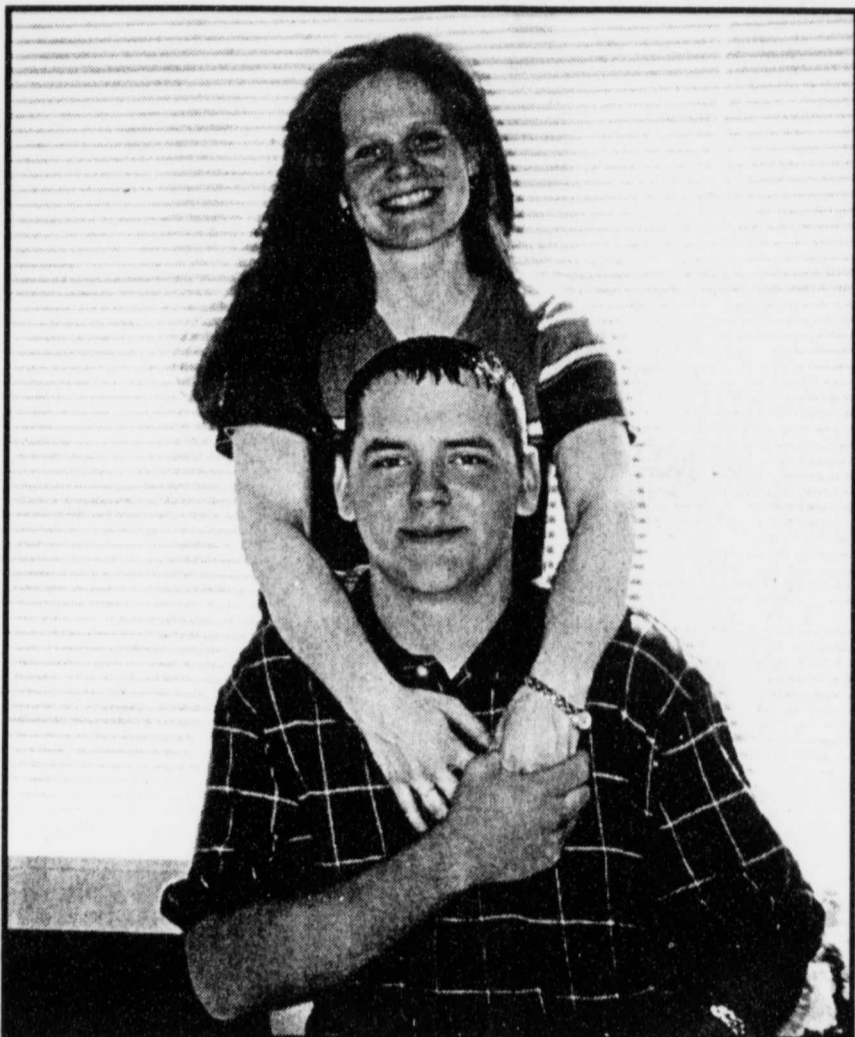

Howell Cobb, U.S. District Judge for the Eastern District of Texas, entered an order on July 12, 1999.

The Court granted a motion that a stay of execution be granted in order to properly review the record of prior proceedings.

Herrington stated that he expects a delay of anywhere from 6 months to a year.

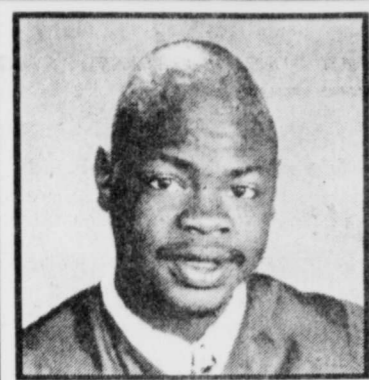

Each person received a T-shirt for attending Bible School. The T-shirt design was created by Brenton Norwood.

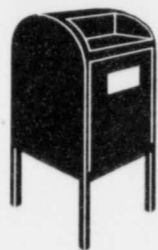
