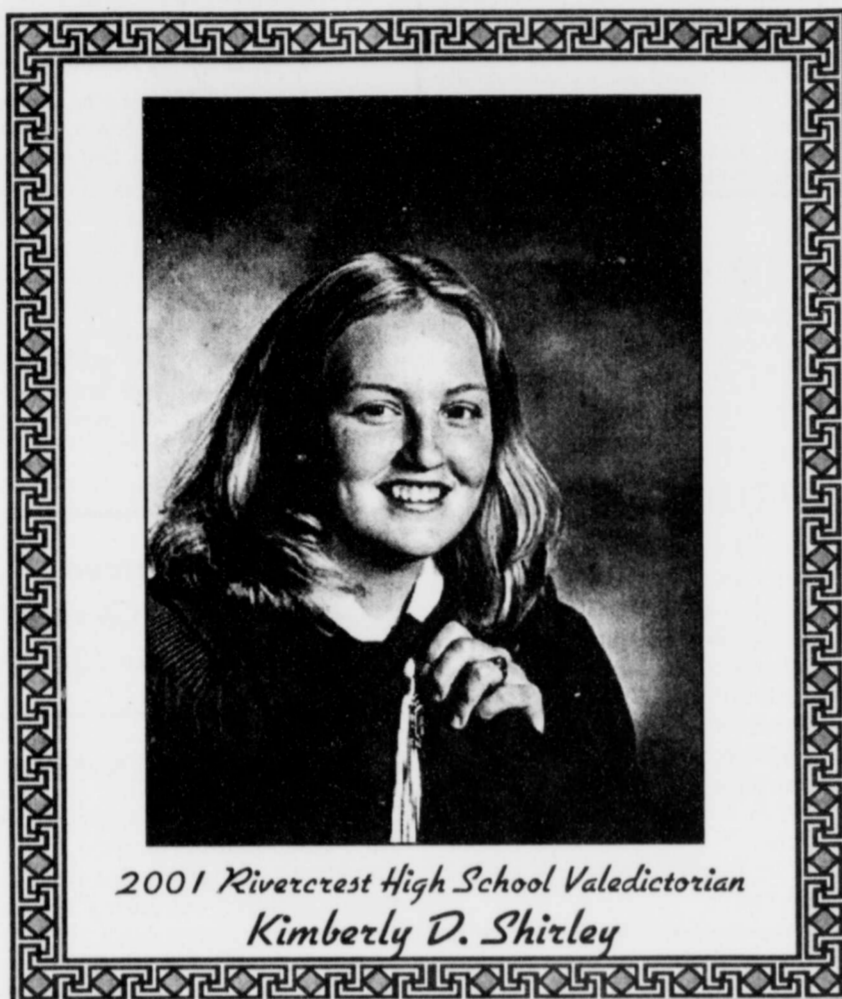

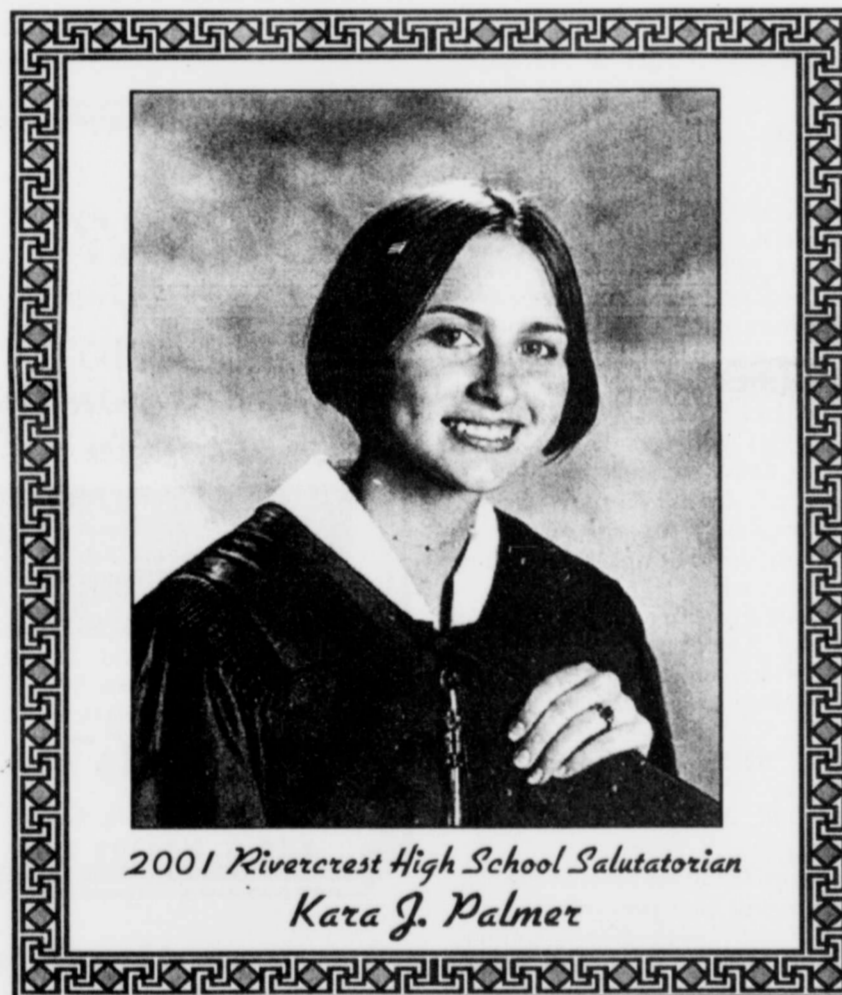

With the Memorial Holiday coming up and graduation and cookouts planned for various occasions, several have contacted me for some recipes for these events.

Memorial Day is in observance of our Veteran soldiers who died in battle for our country. Three years after the Civil War ended on May 5, 1868, the head of an organization of former Union soldiers and sailors, The Grand Army of the Republic (GAR), established Decoration Day. This is a day for the nation to decorate graves of the war dead with flowers. Major General John A. Logan declared it should be May 30. The first observance was held that year at Arlington National Cemetery, across from the Potomac from Washington, D.C. The cemetery already held the remains of 20,000 Union dead and several hundred Confederate dead.

By the end of the 19th century, Memorial Day ceremonies were being held on May 30, throughout the nation. State legislatures passes proclamations designating the day. The Army and Navy adopted regulations

for proper observance of their facilities. It was not until after World War I, however, that the day was expanded to honor those who have died in all

American wars. In 1971, Memorial Day was declared a national holiday by an act of Congress. It is still often referred to as Decoration Day and was placed on the last Monday in May, as were other federal holidays.

Punch and Dip Recipes

Broccoli Dip
1 package cooked broccoli-save liquid
1 stick butter
2 tablespoons chopped onion
2 tablespoons flour
1/2 cup evaporated milk
1 teaspoon celery salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
6 ounces jalapeno cheese
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
Cook broccoli according to package directions; drain liquid and add flour, onion and remaining ingredients. Use dip with favorite chips.

Spinach Dip
1 package frozen chopped spinach-thaw
1 cup mayonnaise
1 cup sour cream
1 small can water chestnuts-chopped
1 tablespoon grated onion
1 package Knorr vegetable soup mix
Blend all ingredients together. Serve with wheat crackers or with your favorite veggies.

Tamale Dip
1 large can tamales-chopped
1 medium can chili
2 green onions-sauteed in butter
1 can Ro-Tel tomatoes
1 pound sharp cheddar cheese
garlic to taste
Worcestershire sauce to taste
Tabasco to taste
Combine all ingredients in the top of double boiler. Cook and stir often until cheese melts and the mixture is thoroughly heated. Serve in chafing dish.

Kool-Aid Punch
1 small package strawberry Kool-Aid
1 small package cherry Kool-Aid
2 cups sugar
1-46 ounce can pineapple juice
Place in 1 gallon container and add 1/2 gallon of water to Kool-Aid and sugar. Dissolve well. Add pineapple juice and finish filling with water.

Lucious Frozen Banana Punch
4 cups sugar
6 cups water
5 mashed bananas
2 baskets fresh strawberries sliced or 2 packages of frozen
1-6 ounce frozen lemonade
1-6 ounce frozen orange juice
1-46 ounce can pineapple juice
4-2 liter bottles ginger ale
Boil sugar and water together for three minutes; let cool. Add mashed bananas and mix juices with amount of water on can. Combine all ingredients except ginger ale. Color if desired and freeze. Remove from freezer 2-3 hours before serving. Add ginger ale right before serving.

PET TALK

If Spot never seems to come when you call, obedience class may not be the answer.

The dog may be suffering from a hearing problem and could be deaf in one or both ears, and certain breeds of dog are more prone to acquire a hearing problem.

Researchers at the College of Veterinary Medicine at Texas A&M University are currently investigating a common problem of deafness in popular breeds such as

Dalmatians and English Setters. Dr. Keith Murphy, a geneticist in veterinary pathobiology, began the study on genetic canine deafness in 1999. "Our major goal is to understand the basis for hereditary deafness in certain breeds, and use that information to reduce the prevalence or even prevent future deaf offspring," Murphy said.

Murphy and his team of researchers have discovered that deafness in Dalmatians and English Setters does not follow a simple pattern of inheritance.

To solve the mystery of why approximately 30 percent of Dalmatians and 14 percent of English Setters are born deaf in one ear or both ears, the researchers must first identify the genes responsible for the problem.

"We don't know what exactly we are going to find, so we are studying the entire canine genome," Murphy said.

To complete the project, researchers have collected information on 75 Dalmatians and 30 English Setters from across the United States. Murphy hopes to identify the inherited deafness genes by using a painless hearing test and collecting pedigree information on each dog.

The Texas A&M researchers are especially interested in collecting more data on English Setters with bilateral or unilateral deafness.

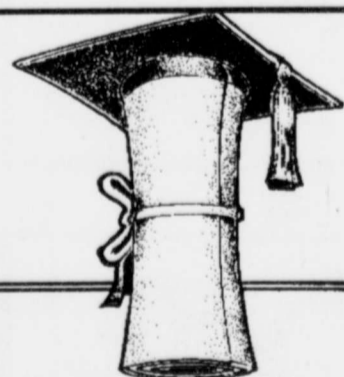


on the value of Family Council and provide each person with a copy of their rights.
