rather rather than on market value. This "productivity appraisal"
means qualified land is taxed based on its ability to produce means qualified land is taxed based on its sabiity to produce
crops, livestock or timber-not on its value on the real estate market. And it can mean substantial property tax savings.

When is the application deadline? If your land has never had a productivity appraisal or you are a new owner, you must apply to your local appraisal district by April 30 to take advantage of this benefit on your 2002 property
taxes. You may get up to 60 extra days if you have a good reason taxes. Sou may get up to 60 extra days if you have a good reason
