your doctor about it and he's taken care of it". Again, she was right. But I don't know
who she was, I just know she "changed my bandages". One day things were grim here at the office, and it seemed that there was no ray
of light. My family had probof light. My family had prob-
lems, the paper had problems and things were just awful. And, a young woman came in, put her arms around me and
asked why I was so stressed asked why I was so stressed.
After listening for a moment she calmly said "You'll be on my prayer list tonight, your family too." Without further ado, she dropped a kiss on my
head and unselfconsciously left. She "changed my bandages" in a way she will never fully appreciate.
