## Tiny hummingbirds that weigh

 a few ounces can give tons of pleasure to bird enthusiasts. The minute creatures are amongthe most fascinating of all birds. the most fascinating of all birds,
both for their curious behavior and both for their curious behavior and
their somewhat mysterious mantheir somewhat mysterious man-

Dont think for a moment they wound make good pets: as with
many types of wild birds, it is against the law to keep hummingbirds as pets. But they can still be
admired and observed, and hummingbird feeders are a good way to do both, says Dr. Ian Tizard, a bird specialist at Texas A\&M
University's College of Veterinary Medicine. Tizard says the type of hummingbird you'll see in Texas depends on where you live. East of Interstate 35 , residents will most
likely see the Ruby-Throated likely see the Ruby-Throated hummingbird, whine hose westo
I-35 will probably see the Black
Chinned her Chinned hummer. "Austin-area
residents can see both," he says. residents can see both," he says.
